Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Bulletin Reflection: Jesus the Good Shepherd

Today is May 7, the Fourth Sunday in Easter and the Gospel today is the Good Shepherd. The earliest painted picture of Jesus can be found in the Roman catacombs and portrays Him as the Good Shepherd.

We have all heard this story many times but the reference of Jesus as the Good Shepherd goes back to the Book of Isaiah. In chapter 40 of Isaiah we have, "Like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, leading the ewes with care."

This Gospel starts with Jesus telling us that He is the Good Shepherd and He knows each of His sheep. "They know my voice and they follow me." The relationship between a shepherd and his flock is very personal. A shepherd can never leave his flock alone because sheep are timid and also easily wander off. The shepherd must never lose sight of any sheep in his care. The sheep can trust that shepherd will lead them on safe paths. Even in the darkest of valleys, the shepherd leads them without any fear.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that He gives them, the sheep, eternal life and they will never perish. Jesus cares for them always. If we think of Jesus as our Good shepherd, we are right now under His care. We already have eternal life. Jesus protects us now and always. There is nothing to fear.

It may seem as if Jesus is somewhat boasting; his sheep, his flock, his cares, but Jesus shifts his attention to talking about the Father. And when you think about this it is consistent with our understanding of the relationship between Jesus and His father. Everything that Jesus had was given to Him by the Father. The Father provides Jesus with everything He could ever want and Jesus glorifies the Father in everything He does. Therefore, one complements the other; the Father and the Son are one.

If Jesus is our model to follow in this life, we should try to imitate Him always. When I reflect on this Gospel I think of my family and even my friends. God the Father has given them to me. Therefore, like Jesus, I should watch over them the best I can to make sure they are safe. I do my best to lead them where I am going and I am hoping that is the path where Jesus leads me.

My care for them could be compared to a shepherd, but I just see it as loving my neighbor as myself. I treat them as I would want to be treated. It is always nice to know someone is there to help whenever it is needed. We watch over each other, always seeing their need as our own. We always glorify the Father in the same way Jesus glorifies the Father. In the end just, as Jesus is one with the Father, we also are one with each other, one with Jesus and one in the Father.

Never forget, Jesus watches over us always. With that being said, we already have eternal life because we follow the paths Jesus leads us on. The Holy Spirit, which we receive through prayer, helps us always to hear the shepherd's voice, Jesus' voice. Jesus has eternal life because of the Father, and we also share eternal life in just the same way. United through the Holy Spirit we are one with God.

"The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit." (ACTS 13:52)

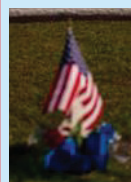

FIRST READING: Acts 13: 14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God.

On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, “It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, *I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth.*”

The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

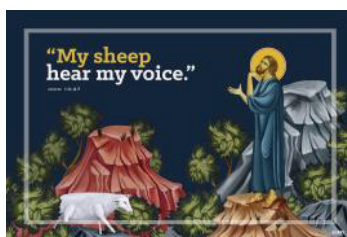
SECOND READING: Revelation 7: 9, 14b-17 I, John, had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands.

Then one of the elders said to me, “These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

“For this reason they stand before God’s throne and worship him day and night in his temple. The one who sits on the throne will shelter them. They will not hunger or thirst anymore, nor will the sun or any heat strike them. 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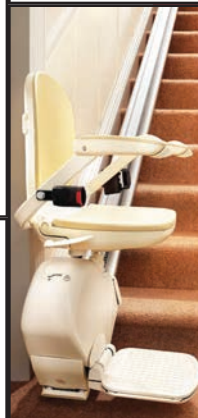
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
