Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Fifth Sunday of Easter: May 15, 2022

"I give you a new commandment: It is to love one another as I have loved you." Saint Augustine wrote in his commentary on the Gospel of John, "Did not this commandment already exist in the ancient law, since it is written there: You shall love your neighbor as yourself? Why, then, does the Lord call a commandment that is evidently old, new?" Like Saint Augustine, we immediately see what is added to the ancient law; namely, "How I have loved you." In the light of Easter, we are therefore, invited to love with the example of Christ and to become Christlike in the world. What does that mean to you and me?

The book of Acts and the reading of Revelation show us a new world, the new Jerusalem, which goes beyond the limits of a chosen people or a category of believers. God comes to make his home among us and all of us are called to be his people. This is the first lesson that the apostles will have to learn after the resurrection. The Gentiles share in the salvation just like the Jews and this act of love from God is a lesson that should be so obvious.

God loves everyone and therefore, we must, like Christ, love the whole world. It is far from being simple. It is not enough to sing or pray that God has come to call all languages, races, and nations. The gospel of this Sunday teaches us that we must live and experience the love for our brothers and sisters at another level, not only by words but by actions in our everyday life!

The teaching of God's love does not exclude anyone. It is not right or left; it is not a specific skin color; it is not a determined social category. To love like Christ is to follow the example of Christ which means accepting everyone with an eye of love. This is where we can experience a part of Jesus' teachings in the gospel of this Sunday and see that Jesus loves and meets Pharisees and tax collectors, prostitutes and pious women, children and adults, Samaritans and foreigners like Jews, Roman soldiers, and lepers. However, accepting the love of Christ for us is allowing ourselves to be changed and transformed by his love.

This is a love that does not judge. Loving everyone is not easy but the love of Christ goes even further: he does not judge. With the adulterous woman, with the Samaritan woman, with tax collectors and sinners, Jesus goes against the morals and social rules of his time. He does not judge and on the contrary welcomes and liberates everyone from their bondage. He saves, heals, and welcomes those who are condemned by the world: "Go, I don't condemn you;" "Go, your faith has saved you." These words of Jesus do not judge or condemn anyone; they never confine anyone to their situation. Following it, our love must never confine, condemn, or judge others.

The cross is the sign of the infinite love of Christ. It is the sign of a marvelous gift, eternal life given to the world. Our love must give life, joy, and hope to others. Can we love as Jesus asks us to? As Christians this is what we are called for, to love with the love of Christ. We know this is not easy but that is the sign that will indicate that we are Christians, and we are his disciples.

As Christians the only way to follow Christ is to love like Christ. Then we will discover that in loving others there is joy, life and hope for us and those around us.

As Saint Mother Teresa stated:

People are often unreasonable, illogical and self-centered;

Forgive them anyway.

If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives;

Be kind anyway.

If you are successful, you will win some false friends and some true enemies;

Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and frank, people may cheat you;

Be honest and frank anyway.

What you spend years building, someone could destroy overnight;

Build anyway.

If you find serenity and happiness, they may be jealous;

Be happy anyway.

The good you do today, people will often forget tomorrow;

Do good anyway.

Give the world the best you have, and it may never be enough;

Give the world the best you've got anyway.

You see, in the final analysis, it is between you and your God;

It was never between you and them anyway.

God bless you all!

God is good/All the time!

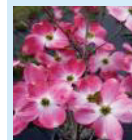

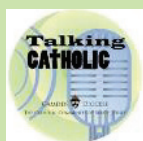

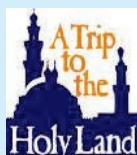

Thank you, Bina, for giving us this most important lesson about our faith! And check out the beautiful crown adorning Mary in the garden.

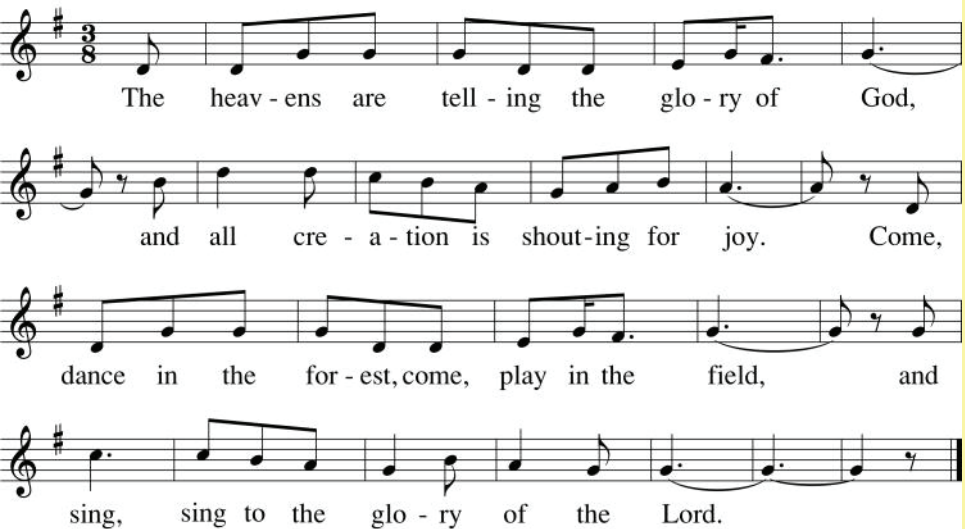

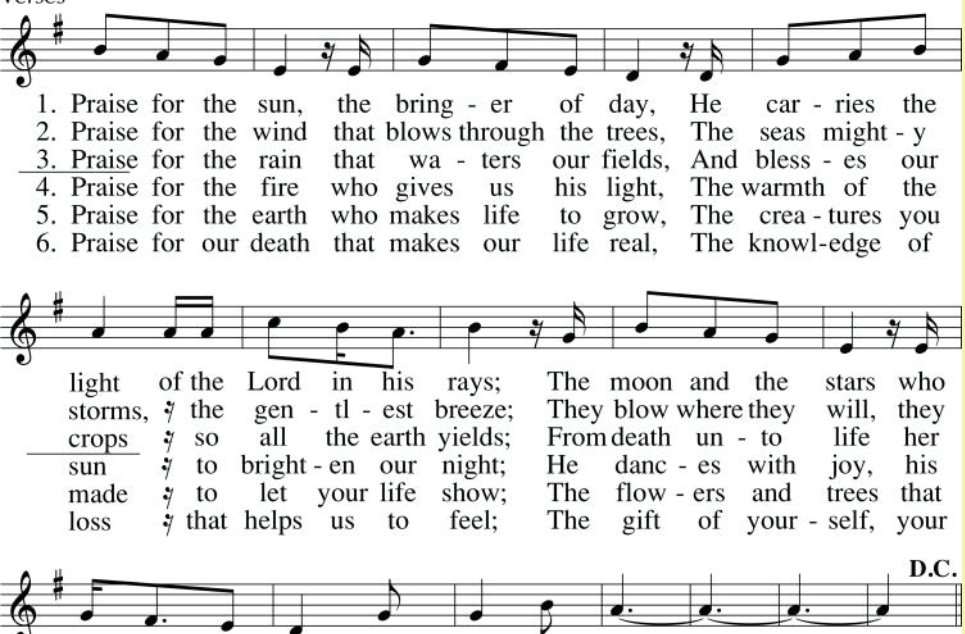

They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

Then I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth. The former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God. The One who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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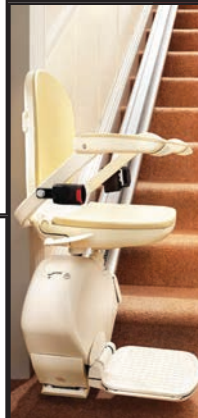
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
