Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Feast of the Most Holy Trinity: June 12, 2022



Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity is not something easy to grasp. We could think about the Trinity in simple terms. Like water, it is one substance but can exist in three states: liquid, solid and gas. We could think of what God actually is, and that is 'Love.' And love is best described in terms of three: the lover, the beloved and the relationship that exists between the two; three parts.

The Trinity is all around us. It is what we are baptized into; in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. One God, three persons, all equal. When we come into Church and we dip our hand into the holy water, we remember that we were baptized into this Church, most importantly, baptized into this Trinity. And what do we do? We make a sign of the cross. During the Creed we profess what we believe in: The Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, one God in three persons.

A lot of people get hung up trying to understand the Trinity because it is impossible for us to fully comprehend; God is infinite and all powerful. I believe God in His infinite wisdom choose to appear to us in the Blessed Trinity for good reason. In my own opinion, He did this to try to make it simple for us to understand.

We have God the Father present forever and God the Son who became human for us to show us how to live and to tell us the good news that our lives do not end when we die, that there is so much more to experience with Him for eternity, if we choose to be with Him. He died for us to show the great love He had for us and the Father. After His death Jesus assured us He would send us His Spirit to remain with us in all that we do, not just remind us of all that He taught us, but to enlighten us with His wisdom so we can always do the will of the Father.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus makes it very clear that He is one with the Trinity. Think of the baptism of Jesus where we see the image of the Holy Trinity. We have Jesus, of course, but also the Spirit descending like a dove and the voice of God the Father, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased".

Jesus exists to do the will of the Father and the Holy Spirit is present in everything, just like the relationship I told you about love. Also, in the Gospel of John we have something remarkable. If we do the Will of the Father we are one with Jesus. Jesus even called us brothers. If Jesus is our brother then His Father is our Father. And like Jesus we are also heirs. What Jesus invites us into is fellowship with the Holy Trinity.

The Trinity is something impossible to understand, but we are all one in it. Our job is to share everything we know about Jesus. We don't have to say anything. Just love one another. Help and encourage them every day. If we do this, we are one with the Trinity and they will be also. All anyone has to do is watch and listen, and the Spirit will bring them right in.

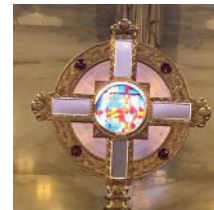

Diocesan Celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi: Saturday, June 18 on the Atlantic City Boardwalk

Parish Celebration: Sunday, June 19 outside St. John Church after the 10AM Mass

The United States Bishops have approved plans for a National Eucharistic Revival to "renew the Church by kindling a living relationship with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. The theme for the renewal is: "My flesh for the life of the world." It will have three phases: Diocesan, Parish, and National.

The Diocesan phase will open with a candlelight Corpus Christi procession on Atlantic City's boardwalk on the Vigil of Corpus Christi, June 18, at 8PM. Along the way, three stations will be established for short services that focus on the great mystery we celebrate in the Eucharist. The Asian Community will lead the first service focusing on the manna God gave the Israelites during their time in the desert. For the next service, the Latino Community will note the institution of the Eucharist as found in St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. For the conclusion, Bishop Sullivan will lead Benediction and speak on the words of Jesus in the Gospel of John—"My flesh for the life of the world". The service is expected to end at approximately at 9:15PM. In case of rain, we will gather at St. Nicholas of Tolentine Church on Pacific Ave. at Tennessee Ave.

We will celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi in our parish on the feast itself: Sunday, June 19 after the 10:00 Mass with a procession around the few blocks near St. John's Church. During the procession, we will alternate prayers with singing hymns. Along the way, the procession will stop by two parishioners' homes on Park Avenue for Benediction and then continue to St. John's Church for the closing. We are grateful to John Chomiczewski and Joe Juliani and their families for hosting our stations during the procession.



All are invited! We hope that many of you will join us for this special celebration!

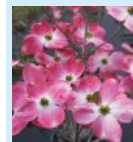

GOSPEL: John 16: 12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. 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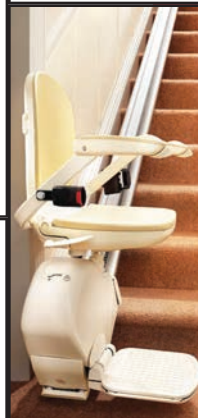
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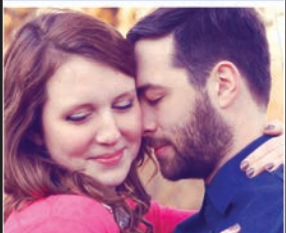
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
