### Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

**Registration:** We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

**Anointing of the Sick:** In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

**Pastoral Care:** Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

**Marriage:** Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

**Baptisms:** To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

## *Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: June 19, 2022*

The feast of Corpus Christi has been celebrated since the 13th century. In our Diocese and in several other dioceses it is celebrated on the Sunday following the Feast of the Holy Trinity. This feast was established so that all of us Christians can take time to appreciate the Body and Blood of Jesus, which is the sacrament that strengthens our relationship with the Lord Jesus. On this great day, we are introduced to Melchizedek, a High Priest who offered bread and wine in his service. Jesus, who is the Son of God offers us His Body and Blood through this sacrament. In today's Gospel we hear how Jesus multiplied bread and fish for the people who heard the word. After feeding on them, it helped to nourish their bodies.

One of the greatest and first Eucharistic Miracles of the Catholic Church that ever occurred took place in Lanciano, Italy in the 8<sup>th</sup> century AD. It happened as a divine response to a Basilian monk's doubt about Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. During Holy Mass, after saying the words of the Eucharistic prayer for the consecration, the host was changed into live Flesh and the wine was changed into live Blood, which coagulated into five globules, irregular and differing in shape and size.

The Host-Flesh, as can be very distinctly observed today, has the same dimensions as the large host used today in the Latin Church; it is light brown and appears rose-colored when lighted from the back. Various ecclesiastical investigations have been conducted since 1574. Different scientific investigations were done by the most illustrious scientist Odoardo Linoli, eminent Professor in Anatomy, Pathological Histology, Chemistry, and Clinical Microscopy. He was assisted by Prof. Ruggero Bertelli of the University of Siena .

The analyses were conducted with absolute and unquestionable scientific precision, and they were documented with a series of microscopic photographs. These analyses sustained the following conclusions: ***"The Flesh is real Flesh. The Blood is real Blood."*** What a great day as a priest to preach on the importance of the Eucharist and to help you deepen your faith! What a privilege for me to stand behind that Altar to use the same words that Jesus used during the first Eucharist. All our readings and the Gospel selection speak of three meals. In the first reading, Melchizedek spoke of a man of unknown origin. He was also seen to prefigure Jesus Christ. In early Christian tradition, the bread and wine were taken to prefigure the bread and wine of the Eucharist, which Paul in the second reading and the Gospel selection for today's Mass mention for the celebration of the first Eucharist, and which we the Church continue to use for daily Eucharistic sacrifice.

As we need food to fulfill our physical hunger, Jesus' Body and Blood is the greatest food for our spiritual life and our spiritual journey. The feeding of 5000 also anticipates the great banquet that will occur when Jesus returns at the end of time. Jesus' miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fish calls us to faith in Him as the Son of God. It is also an invitation and a challenge to place our trust in His deep love for us. Each Mass is an actual action of what Jesus taught His Apostles to do in His memory. The Eucharist is not only a memorial of His actions; the Eucharist makes Jesus and His sacrificial death present to us.

Through instituting the Eucharist, Jesus ensured that believers of all ages would be fed with food that is truly from Heaven: His Body and Blood. The gifts of bread and wine on the altar are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. While the bread and wine, on the surface, might not appear different, they have been truly and really changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. So, as we come forward for Holy Communion and receive the Bread of Life and drink from the Cup of Salvation, we are truly receiving Jesus.

We, too, as Jesus' followers are invited to share with others. Each day, many millions of people face hunger due to a lack of food. Jesus, with little, satisfied many; so can we. Our faith must call us to do all we can to reach out in compassion and love to assist those who are in need. We can do this by volunteering at a soup kitchen, donating food, or by giving money to the House of Charity that works to feed the hungry and care for the needs of the poor.

As we heard from the beginning, the Priest-Celebrant unfortunately did not believe in the transformation of the bread and the wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Still in this age, we also have Catholic Christians who do not believe in the Eucharist. We have people who behave almost in the way as the priest who disbelieved in the Eucharist. They are eating or chewing gum and approach God's Table to receive the Eucharist. We have people who get to Church late; they miss the beginning of the Mass, but approach God's Table. We have people who keep saying ***"Wine and Bread"*** instead of saying ***"the Body and Blood of Christ"***. We have to be conscious of what we are about to receive in the Eucharist. We have people who have mistreated the Host and drop it in their pew. May we continue to show our love, our faith and respect for Jesus' Body and Blood. May we recognize that in each Mass, all priests are another Alter Christus, who have the responsibility to bring Jesus Christ down to the Altar.

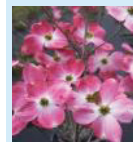

**GOSPEL: Luke 9: 11b—17** Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people." Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty." They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.
