Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: July 17, 2022

Seek first the Kingdom and the righteousness of God, and the rest will be added to you. The formula is from Matthew (Mt 6.33). It is perhaps the best commentary on the lesson of Jesus in the house of Martha and Mary.

Jesus is on the way with his disciples, and we know that this long journey is an opportunity for him to give them many instructions. Since the end of chapter 9 in the gospel of Luke, Jesus is beginning an incline to Jerusalem. He has only been concerned with giving the apostles points of reference to help them remain faithful to their marvelous and demanding vocation to follow Him. Among other things, he recommended that they accept hospitality (Lk 9.4; 10.5-9). This is exactly what he does himself. One can think that he gratefully accepts Martha's and Mary's hospitality.

This account, specific to Luke, immediately follows the parable of the Good Samaritan. There is certainly no contradiction between the two. We have to be careful not to criticize Martha, the active one, in comparison to Mary, the contemplative one. The center of interest of the evangelist is, rather, the relationship of the disciples to the Lord. This emerges from the context of the repetition of the word "Lord" which comes up three times: "Mary was seated at the feet of the Lord ..." Martha asked: "Lord, does that not matter to you...?" The Lord answered her. The use of this word suggests that the relationship described by Luke between Jesus and the two sisters, Martha and Mary, is not to be judged according to the usual criteria of good conduct. The Master wants to call for discernment of what is "the best part", that is to say the most essential attitude that he expects from his disciples.

The two women welcome the Lord by giving him all their attention: Martha, to receive him well, Mary, so as not to lose anything of His words. One cannot say that one is active, the other is passive. Both are occupied only with him. In the first part of the story, the Lord speaks. We are not told the content of his speech. We only know that Mary, in the attitude of a true disciple lets herself be instructed (cf Is.50) by the presence of the Lord. We see Martha "captured by the multiple occupations of the service" as a part of how to welcome a guest in your house. The dialogue itself only intervenes on Martha's complaint: "Lord, does it matter to you that my sister left me do all the work alone? So, tell her to help me."

The Lord then utters a sentence that has caused a lot of reflection, which is: "Martha, Martha, you worry about many things." Jesus certainly does not reproach Martha for her eagerness to receive him well. Therefore, he values her work and warmly accepts her hospitality.

And how many of us too often find ourselves in the role of Martha, wondering where the fault lies? It would certainly seem easier to adopt Mary's attitude and allow oneself to be served, while keeping company with the guest in the living room! But it is Martha's worried behavior that inspires Jesus to make a small point, beneficial for everyone. And through the character of the two sisters, he takes the opportunity to give a recommendation to each of his disciples and remind us of the essential: "Only one thing is necessary." Be at the Lord's mission! At the same time, we need to consider what is important to serve the Lord at the right moment. Each one of us is called to play Martha and Mary's role in our ministry and in our spiritual life. However, we should be careful not to mistake our priorities.

We know that prayer and action are opposed only if both are lived in mediocrity. They are to develop as an application to increase our apprenticeship in charity. Both prayer and action become a unique and unified way of being to God and of being in the world. All of our actions finds their deepest value and meaning when they find their source and fulfillment in Love. Jesus tells us: "I am the vine; you are the branches." "He who abides in me, and I in him bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15.5). True Christian action is an intimate union with Jesus that cannot be opposed to prayer. It is a new conformity to the face of Christ which takes shape in us, which takes shape in the Church of God. We are asked to radiate Christ Jesus throughout our lives.

May the Lord continue to inspire us so that we can discern how to serve him at the right time through our brothers and sisters. Blessed Sunday to you all!

Parish Celebration of Corpus Christi: Meditation Before the Blessed Sacrament, Part 2

Have you nothing to annoy you? My child, tell Me your annoyances, with every detail. Who has pained you? Who has wounded your self-love? Who has treated you contemptuously? Tell Me all, and then say that you forgive and forget; and I will give you My blessing.

Do you dread something painful? Is there in your soul a vague fear which seems unreasonable, and yet torments you? Trust fully in My providence. I am here, I see everything; I will not leave you. Are there about you friends who seem less kind than formerly, who neglect you through indifference or forgetfulness, without your having consciously done anything to wound them? Pray for them, and I will restore them to you, if their companionship is good for you.

Have you no joys to tell Me? Why not confide to Me your pleasures? Tell Me what has happened since yesterday to console you, to make you happy, to give you joy. An unexpected visit has done you good; a fear has suddenly dispelled; you have met with unlooked-for success; you have received some mark of affection - a letter, a present; some trial has left you stronger than you supposed. All these things, My child, I obtained for you. Why are you not grateful? Why do you not say, "I thank You"? Gratitude draws benefits, and the benefactor loves to be reminded of his bounty.

Have you no promises to make Me? You know I read the very bottom of your heart. Men are deceived, but not God; be frank. Are you resolved to avoid that occasion of sin, to give up the object which leads you astray - not to read that book which excites your imagination; to withdraw your friendship from that person who is irreligious, and whose presence disturbs the peace of your soul? Will you go at once and be kind to that companion who annoyed you? Well, My child, go now and resume your daily work. Be silent, be honest, be patient, be charitable, love very much the Blessed Mother of Jesus; and tomorrow bring Me a heart even more devoted and loving. Tomorrow I shall have new favors for you.
