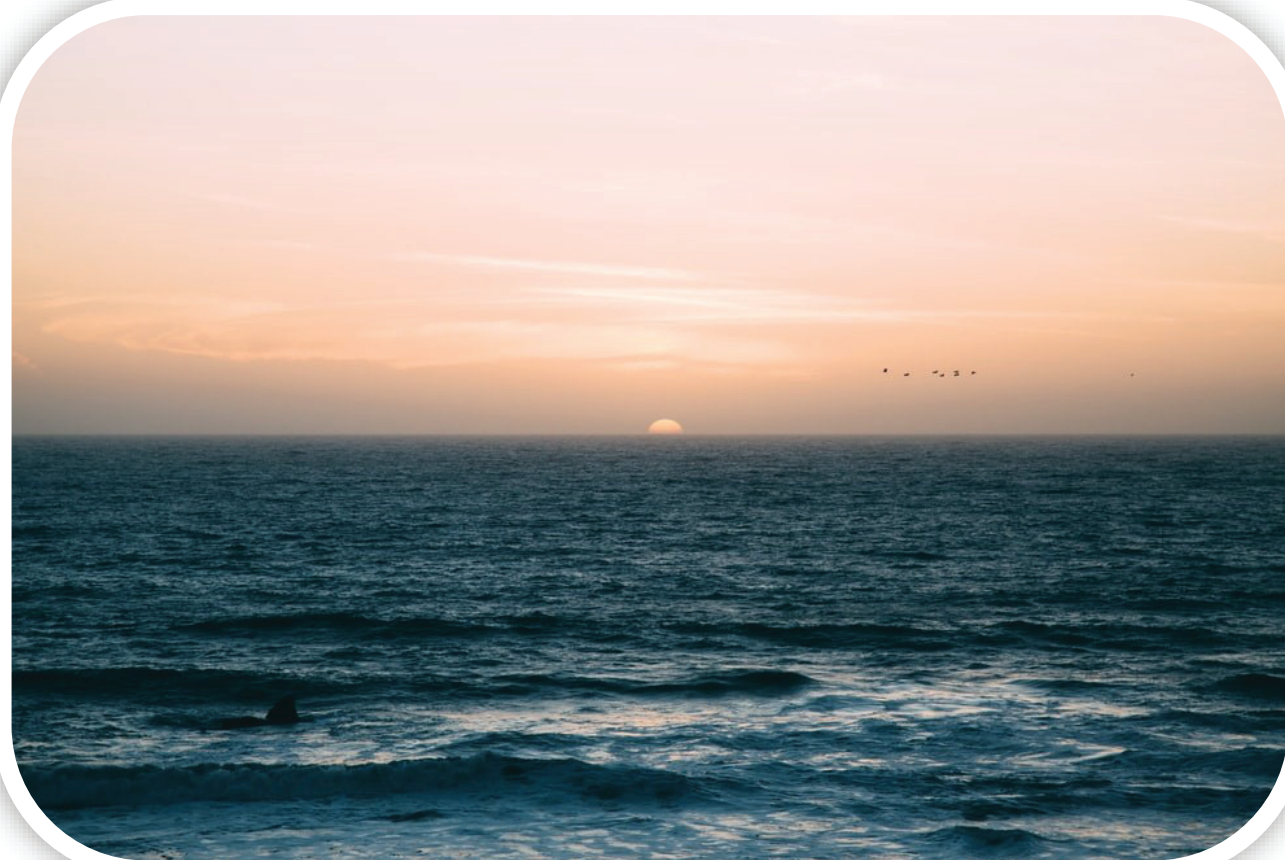

Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

St. John: In memory of Bill and Dan McCormick

Call this “The Biography of a Failure:” Once upon a time there was a man who had less than three years of formal education and failed in business in ’31; was defeated for the legislature in ’32; again failed in business in ’33; was elected to the legislature in ’34; defeated for speaker in ’38; defeated for elector in ’40; defeated for Congress in ’43; elected for Congress ’46; and defeated in ’48; defeated for Senate in ’55; defeated for the Vice Presidential nomination in ’56; defeated for the Senate in ’58. His name? Abraham Lincoln.

That story highlights a component of something far beyond American political history in importance. Call it “persistence.” I wish to promote that same quality has to be an important component of all our prayers. While it is essential, and stressed by Our Lord Jesus Himself, it remains most difficult to practice.

This is especially true for us as citizens of the so-called First World. Why? Because we are culturally surrounded by a veritable glut of “time saving” and mostly satisfying gadgets available even to toddlers. As a consequence, when we ask God for something in prayer, we want it delivered at least as fast as those gizmos deliver, or as speedily as companies deliver them to our doorstep.

The Bible teaches us the contrary about God’s schedule. He is never in a hurry. Consider just the time gap between the tragedy in Eden caused by Adam and Eve and the arrival of “the new Adam” in the womb of the Virgin Mary. Literally centuries long!

Today’s Liturgy brings us to the Book of Genesis’ presentation of an amazing dialogue between God and Abraham, “our father in faith” as the Roman Canon declares. With a boldness that even shocks us a bit, old Abe actually bargains with God for awhile! Persistence with more than a dash of “chutzpah.”

Then, in Luke’s gospel, just after Jesus gives the world the perfect prayer, He illustrates the importance of persistence in prayer with one of His inimitable stories.

So, on the one hand we have the example of entrepreneurs, whose persistence in building up a small company into a behemoth of business with amazing speed. And delivers products to us for near instant gratification. Contrast that with Jesus, the one person who is hopefully at the center of our lives, telling us to be patient, persevering and persistent in our prayer. Obviously, we recognize which one is the more important, both for our present and our future. We just need to be perceptive enough to know that we must keep practicing and never give up. After all, “By perseverance the snail reached the Ark.”

God love you and give you His peace.

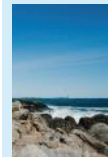

Caring for Our Common Home

It is important to learn lessons that first present themselves in family life: how to show love and respect for life; the proper use of things; order and cleanliness; respect for the local ecosystem and care for all creatures; how to learn and mature; how to ask without demanding; saying "thank you" in genuine gratitude; controlling aggressiveness and greed. Reducing Waste at Home

Everyone can make a difference and reduce plastic waste at home by properly planning meals, cooking with ingredients on hand ('shopping' in the fridge, freezer and pantry), and storing and freezing food to make it last longer. This not only saves money and ensures that the most is made of groceries purchased, but also means fewer trips to the store.

Consider making a smoothie or banana bread from over-ripe bananas, turning wilted vegetables to make a stock or soup to freeze, oven baking thinly sliced stale bread to make crackers or using leftover roast vegetables in a salad. A popular choice for leftovers is packing into a reusable container for lunch the next day, even if that office desk is in your home!

Other popular ideas for reducing plastic waste include switching from liquid soap to bar soap, choosing reusable cloth napkins, switching to paper-wrapped toilet paper and switching to products in cardboard packaging. Consider sprouting seeds from lentils and growing herbs from cuttings in the kitchen, on a balcony or a vegetable patch, if you have room.

At all times, maintaining good hygiene practices when handling food and beverages and using reusables is recommended.

FIRST READING: Genesis 18: 20-32

In those days, the LORD said: "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great, and their sin so grave, that I must go down and see whether or not their actions fully correspond to the cry against them that comes to me. I mean to find out."

While Abraham's visitors walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. Then Abraham drew nearer and said: "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people in the city; would you wipe out the place, rather than spare it for the sake of the fifty innocent people within it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" The LORD replied, "If I find fifty innocent people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake." Abraham spoke up again: "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes! What if there are five less than fifty innocent people? Will you destroy the whole city because of those five?" He answered, "I will not destroy it, if I find forty-five there." But Abraham persisted, saying "What if only forty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it for the sake of the forty." Then Abraham said, "Let not my Lord grow impatient if I go on. What if only thirty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it if I can find but thirty there." Still Abraham went on, "Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord, what if there are no more than twenty?" The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty." But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten there?" He replied, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me.

SECOND READING: Colossians 2: 12-14 Brothers and sisters: You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And even when you were dead in transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, he brought you to life along with him, having forgiven us all our transgressions; obliterating the bond against us, with its legal claims, which was opposed to us, he also removed it from our midst, nailing it to the cross.

GOSPEL: Luke 11: 1-13 Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

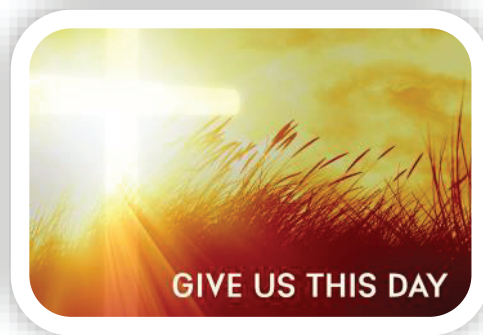

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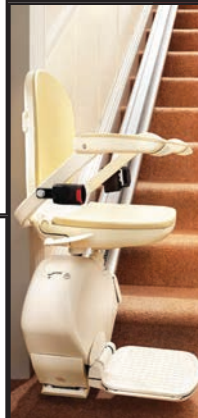
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
