Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Our Goal
Pat Lipperini

As junior high students gather for a class or meeting, I can almost always guarantee this scenario: most of them find a seat quickly and in one smooth motion, get their cell phones out of their pockets and close to their faces, intensely absorbed in the screen content. The room grows eerily quiet; they don't talk or look around too much. It seems no one wants to risk being ignored or dismissed so they settle on the device that never disappoints. The phone is their mooring, their safe place, providing comfort to their aching awkwardness.

We've all had moments of profound discomfort, so it is easy to sympathize with these teenagers. Most of our discomfort comes from a perception of alienation. We feel a lack of connection with the people and places we encounter. We feel estranged. We long for a sense of belonging, a feel of home, a place "where everyone knows your name." Indeed, a good part of our lives involves the search for home-like people and situations that bolster our self-confidence and enable us to live in love and freedom.

In today's second reading, we hear that our Judaic-Christian faith first depended upon an opposite movement. Abraham and his family left what was known and comfortable and headed towards a foreign country. "He went out, not knowing where he was to go." Along the way, his people "acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth." Abraham's deep trust in God gave him the courage to risk alienation for the sake of something greater than he already knew, "for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God." Abraham's goal extended beyond this life and because he accepted that reality, he could function and eventually flourish in his new environment.

What does that mean for us today? Could it be that discomfort is a natural part of our Christian life? After all, Jesus tells us that we "do not belong to the world" (Jn 15:19). God has given us the Kingdom. We are meant for eternity and nothing else will really suffice, even though we try our best to fill up when we feel the lack: of love, of hope, of meaning. St. Augustine said it best: "You have made us for yourself O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." If we are uneasy or anxious at times, it could well be our spirit's recognition that we, like Abraham, need deeper goals.

However, one great temptation for Christians throughout the years has been to fashion their faith into a "get there" mentality. The goal is heaven, surely, but Jesus speaks about the inbreaking Kingdom of God, about experiencing God's reign in one's life. He says the kingdom is "approaching," "at hand," "has come upon you," "in the midst of you." He asks us to "seek it," and tells us that it is "not far." The Kingdom of God is here and it is coming. We are within it and journeying towards it.

Perhaps, then, it would be more appropriate to say that our goal is life with God. Always and everywhere. Therefore, the quality of our journeying really matters. God asks us to live prayerful, moral, loving, joyful lives all along the way. When we do, God's kingdom extends through us and beyond us. It grows and becomes a natural part of our lives and weaves its way into the nooks and crannies of our existence. It becomes foundational, integral, essential, filling the spaces of our loneliness and alienation. Jesus assures us, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him." (Jn:14:23). When we make room for God in *this* world, when we align our lives around our ultimate, we will find where we truly belong. Life with God is our mooring and safe place even as we slog through the tough travels of our lives. And as God's kingdom becomes a stronger reality in our lives and in our world, it eases the discomfort of those we encounter, offering them a home of warmth and support. Even the teenagers with their cell phones.

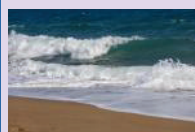

TOP TEN REASONS TO BE A CATECHIST

10. The best way to learn is to teach.

If your own faith education ended years ago, the resources and materials you are exposed to as a catechist will surely refresh and expand your own knowledge.

The world needs the message of the Gospel and the way to true happiness; as a catechist, you offer a hungry world that sustenance.

It's estimated that fewer than 1 percent of Catholics are catechists.

FIRST READING: Wisdom 18: 6-9 The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage. Your people awaited the salvation of the just and the destruction of their foes. For when you punished our adversaries, in this you glorified us whom you had summoned. For in secret the holy children of the good were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the divine institution.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

SECOND READING: 11:1-2, 8-12 Short Form

Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age—and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

GOSPEL: Luke 12:32-48 Jesus said to his disciples: “Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be. “Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.” Then Peter said, “Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?” And the Lord replied, “Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, ‘My master is delayed in coming,’ and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant’s master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master’s will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master’s will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.”

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

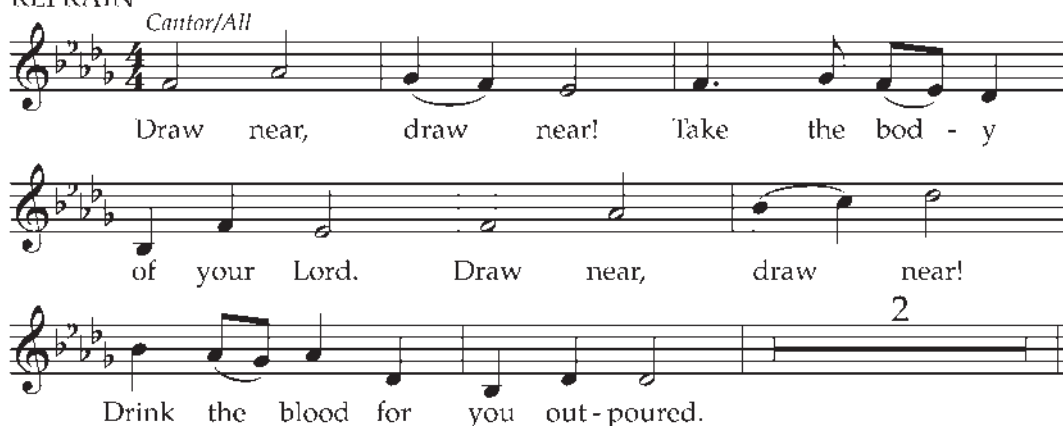

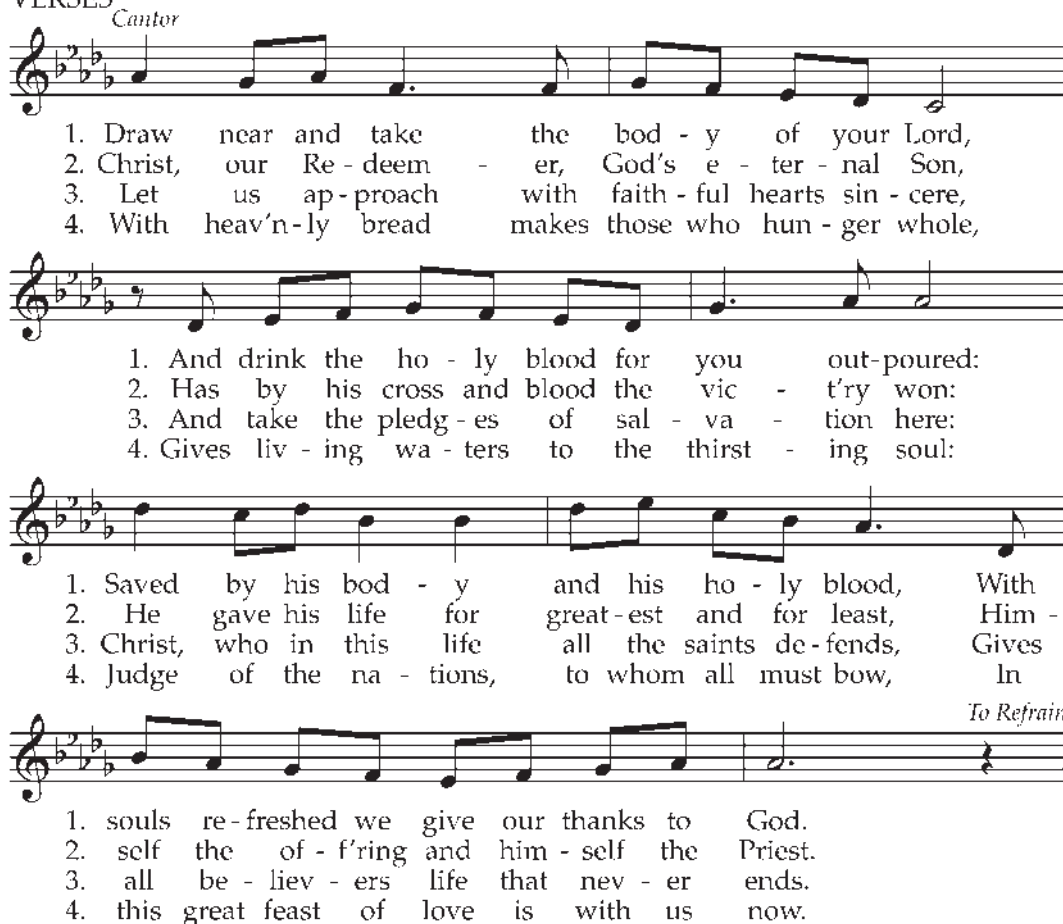

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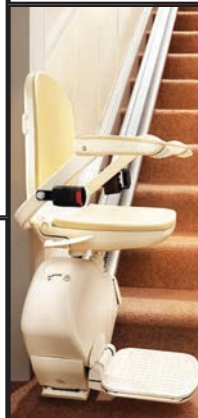
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
