Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Special Collection This Weekend

There will be a special collection this weekend for the Archdiocese for Military Services. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

“Are you afraid of death?” That’s a question not likely to be asked by a mainstream media person to someone on the street. Main reason: secularists, for reasons of their own, give wide berth to anything that is even remotely connected to God or religion. Lesser reason: death negates the bliss of any “I’m OK, you’re OK” kind of thinking.

But we should now and then ask that question of ourselves. No surprise to learn that most of us would answer “Yes.” Why? For one thing there is such an “eat, drink and be merry” outlook pushed by our present culture. For another, death is often put into such a scary context that no one in their right mind (not a Christ mind for sure) wants it to happen to them.

We note today the feigned interest of the Sadducees in the matter of the afterlife. I say that because they did not believe in an afterlife. They just wanted to mock the Master, especially His teaching about the resurrected life. As always, Jesus deftly handles the situation. He will not be dragged into a debate about who marries whom. He knew the questioners were using one of the oldest tricks in the book to tear down the credibility of an idea: sarcasm.

Instead, He reminds them of something they were forgetting: namely how their own great Moses spoke of God as a Lord of the living. Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, their great patriarchs, were now living in eternity.

Consider today the outlook on death espoused by the brave Maccabees brothers cited in today’s First Reading. No fear among them as they faced torture and death for their belief in Yahweh’s care for them. For us, we have the word of Our Lord Jesus Christ. He alone is the bedrock of our belief in our resurrection. Talk about a firm foundation for belief! He is our resurrected Savior!

Of course, the Irish have their take on facing death that sometimes brings a laugh or two. There is the story of the old Irish pastor who stopped in on Paddy Murphy’s wake. Everybody was back in the kitchen, having a high old time. The deceased, Murphy, was alone on the front room of his house in his coffin, which sat on the floor because all the furniture had been moved into the kitchen.

The pastor was appalled at this lack of respect for the dead and stormed into the kitchen looking for some furniture with which to elevate Murphy’s coffin. At his appearance the crowd fell silent. The pastor cleared his throat and declared in his brogue: “I want three chairs for Mr. Murphy please.” There was a pause, and then everyone in the kitchen shouted together, “Hip, hip, hip, hooray!”

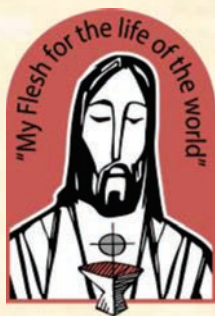

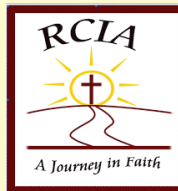

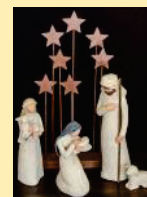

GLORIA: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you; we bless you; we adore you; we glorify you; we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: 2 Maccabees 7: 1-2, 9-14

It happened that seven brothers with their mother were arrested and tortured with whips and scourges by the king, to force them to eat pork in violation of God's law. One of the brothers, speaking for the others, said: "What do you expect to achieve by questioning us? We are ready to die rather than transgress the laws of our ancestors." At the point of death he said: "You accursed fiend, you are depriving us of this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up to live again forever. It is for his laws that we are dying." *(Continued on p. 10)*

After him the third suffered their cruel sport. He put out his tongue at once when told to do so, and bravely held out his hands, as he spoke these noble words: "It was from Heaven that I received these; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again." Even the king and his attendants marveled at the young man's courage, because he regarded his sufferings as nothing. After he had died, they tortured and maltreated the fourth brother in the same way. When he was near death, he said, "It is my choice to die at the hands of men with the hope God gives of being raised up by him; but for you, there will be no resurrection to life."

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 2: 16 – 3:5

Brothers and sisters: May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word. Finally, brothers and sisters, pray for us, so that the word of the Lord may speed forward and be glorified, as it did among you, and that we may be delivered from perverse and wicked people, for not all have faith. But the Lord is faithful; he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one. We are confident of you in the Lord that what we instruct you, you are doing and will continue to do. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ.

GOSPEL: Luke 20: 27-38

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. 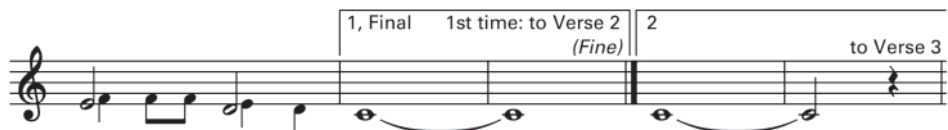

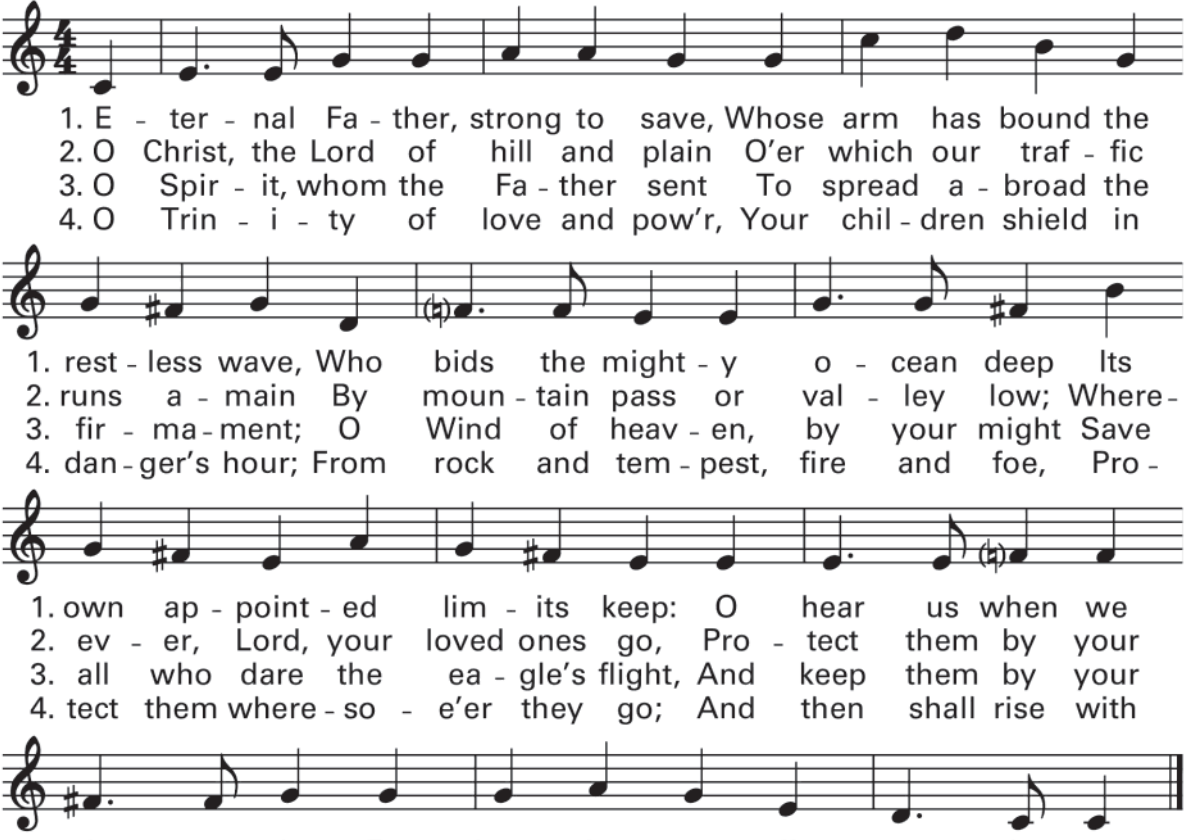

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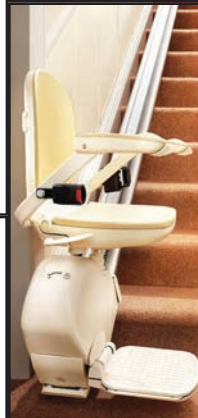
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
