Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Special Collection Next Weekend

There will be a special collection next weekend for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

In today's reading we hear about what is called the "end of times." No one knows exactly when that will happen, not even Jesus, only the Father. We first have the Old Testament reading from the last book of the Old Testament, Malachi, which means 'messenger of God.' Malachi was the last prophet before the New Testament era, about 400 years before Jesus. We do not know who actually wrote the book, but the message was to keep true to the Lord and persevere, just like the message of the Gospel and second reading.

In the first reading, just as in the Gospel, we get some good news and we get some bad news. The bad news of course is for the evil doers and the good news is for those who love the Lord. The main message is that if you stay close to the Lord, He will provide for you. The most important thing is to have faith in Him.

In the second reading we hear from Saint Paul and this is after the death, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. We have to remember what the people in the time of Saint Paul thought. They believed Jesus would be coming right back in the next couple of days, weeks or months. The letter is addressed to the Thessalonians because many of them had stopped working and were being unruly. They thought that since Jesus was to return soon, what was the point of working? Jesus would soon be returning and it was all going to be over soon. Paul tells them we do not know when He will return but in the meantime, work for your food. Persevere, stay close to Jesus in prayer and work quietly. These instructions continue for us today.

In the Gospel, Jesus is moving closer to His Passion. He is coming into Jerusalem as the Messiah and the people are very happy. In Jerusalem was the great Temple, at the height of its majesty. It was the center of life for the Jews, the center for culture, religion and economics. Jesus' followers have seen so many things, they heard Him speak, they witnessed the miracles; they believed He was in Jerusalem to become the new King David. And then Jesus tells them this beautiful Temple in all its glory will soon be destroyed and starts going on about being deceived by false leaders. They of course were saying, "what are you talking about you are our Messiah, why would we look anywhere else?" He goes on talking about wars, plagues and famines. He talks about being persecuted, being killed for believing in Him. What did all of this mean?

Jesus was going to Jerusalem to face His Passion and death and He had made this clear but the people did not process this in any way. To them, He was the King, and He was coming to claim what was His. But just as we hear in Malachi, with all this bad news there is some good, and the good overshadows the bad. Just like Saint Paul, Jesus tells them to persevere, believe in me. He will return and through perseverance in all of this, you will preserve your lives!

We are still waiting and our world is full of wars, plagues and famines. Maybe we are coming to the end. I do not know. In every generation there have been very bad times, but for us, just as Jesus said, we stay true to Him. We are doing this today, look at where you are. You are in Church and we are about to do exactly what Jesus asked us to do, see Him in the breaking of the bread. He is there in the bread and the wine and this Sacrament is really just a continuation of the Last Supper. Every Mass celebrated from the Last Supper is a continuation of the Last Supper.

We persevere, and we do what Jesus needs us to do. We will love our neighbor as ourselves and we will watch out for each other. Jesus will come back, and we will be waiting, happy, sober and vigilant. We will do what Saint Vincent DePaul did and encouraged us all to do, care for our brothers and sisters that are having difficulty, look out for them, as Jesus looks out for us.

Today, reflect on your ministry. How are you keeping faithful to Jesus? How can you come further out of your comfort zones to care for those in need? How do you stand when faced with persecution? How do you stand with those who are being persecuted? We all need to stand as one, strong together. Strong through the Blessed Sacrament, we are all one in it, and we are united body and soul in Jesus. And we are here to do His work until He returns.

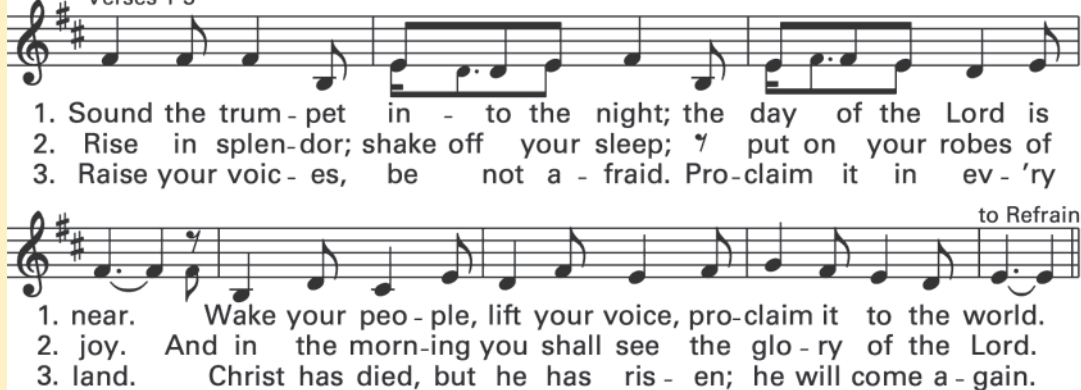

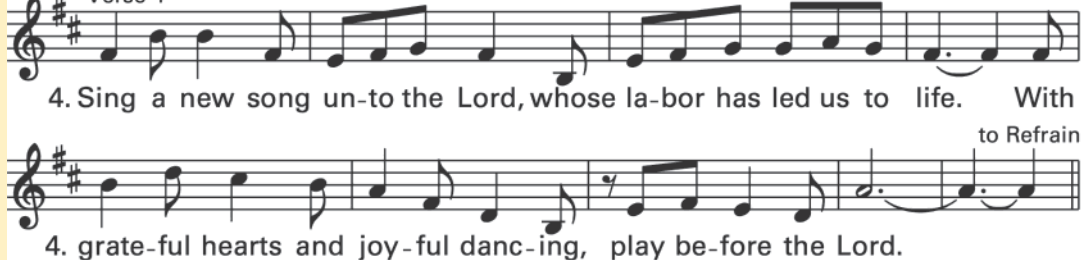

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GLORIA: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you; we bless you; we adore you; we glorify you; we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: Malachi 3: 19-20a Lo, the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the proud and all evildoers will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire, leaving them neither root nor branch, says the LORD of hosts. But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 3: 7-12 Brothers and sisters: You know how one must imitate us. For we did not act in a disorderly way among you, nor did we eat food received free from anyone. On the contrary, in toil and drudgery, night and day we worked, so as not to burden any of you. Not that we do not have the right. Rather, we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us. In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others. Such people we instruct and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to work quietly and to eat their own food.

GOSPEL: Luke 21: 5-19 While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here-- the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" he answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky.

"Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

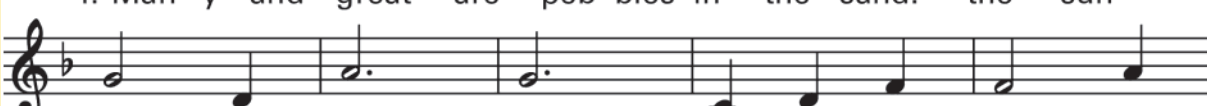

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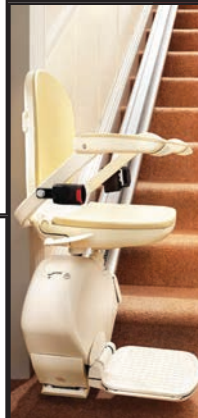
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
