Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

First Sunday of Advent: November 27, 2022

Brothers and Sisters,

We now start a new liturgical year with a new season. We want to be attentive to the Holy Spirit in this new liturgical year. Advent is a season that creates in us an attitude of listening and expectation. It is to contemplate the flickering flame of the candle in the dark. It is to realize that what we are waiting for will take shape.

Last Sunday we celebrated Jesus, the King of the Universe, the King of love who comes to transform the world. The Word of God does what is necessary to set us in motion, both inwardly and outwardly. These words are used once again like a wake-up call and a warning. “Watch! Get ready!” (Jesus) “The hour has come to arise from your sleep!” (St. Paul) “Come, let us ascend to the mountain of the Lord! Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.” (Isaiah)

Yet we are all very busy, doing our everyday tasks to satisfy our basic needs and the needs of our family. We sometimes keep moving and stay physically awake for hours fully mobilized with lots of ideas in our heads, thoughts, songs, inner images but not realizing that we are not spiritually awake.

Sometimes we may even have the feeling that we have too much on our hands, too much to do, too much on our shoulders, in our heads, and in our hearts. Can there be room for something else? Our life is full and already given, already occupied, and already counted. What more could we do?

Does the Lord want to add to our busy life when He asks us to watch? Yes! He knows that our burdens, our tasks, and responsibilities are quite immense. But precisely if the alarm sounded by Christ, the apostle Paul, and the prophet Isaiah, was the alarm clock we need, which would wake us from the sleep where all our activities keep us numb, too complacent, too alienated of ourselves day and night. What would we do then?

“Two men will be in the field,” says the Lord: “One is taken; the other left. Two women will be at the mill: One is taken; the other left.” What can this image mean if not the fact that there is a double possibility within us: that of being awake and that of being asleep, either in the fields of our external activities and occupations? Do we want to be taken or be left?

What will make the difference? The decision within us needs to be authentic in a state of conversion and reception of the Spirit of God, being clothed in Christ, and not curled up in a ball or enclosed in our bubble, without love, without prayer, without light, without any meaning to our lives.

The Word of God, on this First Sunday of Advent, does not add to it, overload us, irritate us or scare us. It wakes us up. It makes us realize in what torpor we are often plunged and by what illusions we sometimes allow ourselves to be lulled. This Word opens us to light, to broad daylight, to the great challenges of charity, justice, peace, sharing, and a just society. The Word urges us to conversion, for a profound change within us, which will open us to the realities of the Kingdom and allow us to orient the entirety of our life there. We are not going to abandon our tasks and obligations tomorrow morning. We will no doubt do the same things again, but differently, now with this addition of our deep attention, of true love, of renewed faith and hope, of a more authentic gift of ourselves for the cause of the Kingdom. What if we try to live by this Spirit in the Eucharist that we are celebrating right now?

I hope and pray this Advent Season will bring our young families back to Church. I hope the children continue to be exposed to the Eucharist and other sacraments that are available to them. I hope and pray those who let their lives be preoccupied by games, TV, or the social media activities understand that God gives them the opportunity to be ready. Let us do some spiritual activities by inviting someone back to Church as a mission to build our faith family. Let us continue to reflect on our Parish Advent Theme: “Emmanuel: God Present to Us in the Eucharist”.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 2: 1-5

This is what Isaiah, son of Amoz, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it; many peoples shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." For from Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of

the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and impose terms on many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

PSALM RESPONSE: *Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.*

SECOND READING: Romans 13: 11-14

Brothers and sisters: You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh.

GOSPEL: Matthew 24: 37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. 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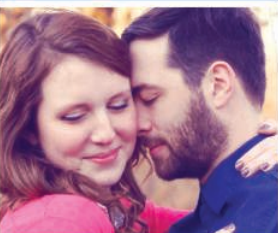
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
