Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: January 15, 2023

At the beginning of the year, we exchange wishes, and we have formulas to do it: "Happy new year, lots of health, may all your wishes come true." The Bible also has its formulas: In the first reading, we find one that is very beautiful; it is a blessing that God has passed on to his people: "May the Lord bless you and keep you! May the Lord make his face shine upon you. May he take you into grace! May the Lord turn his face towards you, and may he bring you peace!" This blessing was for the people of the old covenant. It is also addressed to the Church today and to each one of us. Whatever the trials that will come during the year, the blessing of God is always offered to us.

Since last Sunday with the feast of Epiphany, we are entering the cycle of Ordinary Time. Our Savior Jesus Christ whose birth we have just celebrated has good news for our humanity. This good news was announced to the shepherds and then to the Magi. The Gospels make us discover the marvels that the Lord has accomplished for the salvation of the world.

This Sunday's Gospel shows us Jesus coming to John the Baptist. We do not forget that the name of Jesus means: "The Lord saves". Now, on this day, we see him joining humanity wounded by his sin. Saint John reminds us that God does not abandon us. He sends His only begotten son to save us. John the Baptist knows Jesus very well because they are cousins, but in the gospel today, he expresses that he does not know him. We heard him saying twice: "I didn't know him", and yet, they are cousins; they must have met in their childhood. "It is of him that I said: 'The man who comes behind me has passed in front of me, for before me he was.'"

The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world is the child who took flesh from the Virgin Mary. He is the Love that takes Body in humanity. The testimony of the Baptist gives us a look of faith on the person of Jesus. The figure of the Lamb of God sheds light on the history of the Covenant by evoking the paschal lamb of the Exodus, the night of the deliverance of the People of God. He is also the suffering servant of the prophet Isaiah, led to the butchery. "Like a lamb," because of the sins of his people. He is also the victorious Lamb of the apocalypses who destroys evil in the world. His pre-existence confirms what Jesus will say to the Pharisees: "Before Abraham was, I am." Christ Jesus, mystery of the living God, gives us the Word of Life and restores us to the dignity of our being. In him, the human person rediscovers his origin in the mystery of God. John, the Forerunner, turns our gaze to Jesus.

Jesus came into the world to free us from the bondage of sin, taking on the faults of humanity. All this he did with love beyond all telling. There is no other way to overcome evil, if not the love that leads to laying down one's life for others.

This is how Jesus is presented to us in the guise of the "servant" who bears our sufferings, "who took on our pains", until he dies on a cross. It is the promise of Isaiah that is fulfilled far beyond all our expectations. He is the true "Paschal Lamb" who immerses himself in the river of our sin to purify us. God does not abandon us. He loved us the first "as no one has ever loved". We have just celebrated the birth of Christ the Savior at Christmas. It is the irruption of God among men to bring them salvation.

Mass intentions for the Parishioners of the Parish are to be celebrated at 1 Mass every Sunday, on Holy Days of Obligation, Easter and Christmas. No other intentions will be scheduled on these specific days.

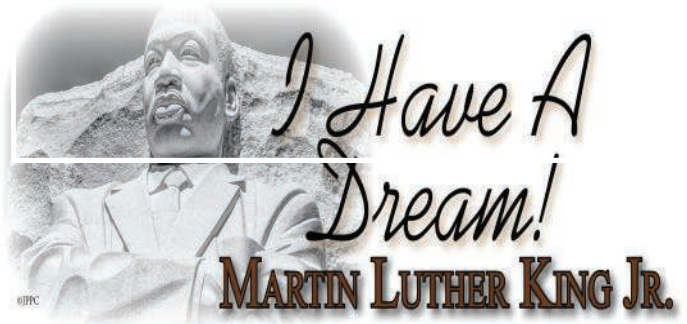

FIRST READING: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

The LORD said to me: You are my servant, Israel, through whom I show my glory. Now the LORD has spoken who formed me as his servant from the womb, that Jacob may be brought back to him and Israel gathered to him; and I am made glorious in the sight of the LORD, and my God is now my strength! It is too little, the LORD says, for you to be my servant, to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and restore the survivors of Israel; I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.*

SECOND READING: 1Corinthians 1: 1-3

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother, to the church of God that is in Corinth, to you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy, with all those everywhere who call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours. And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

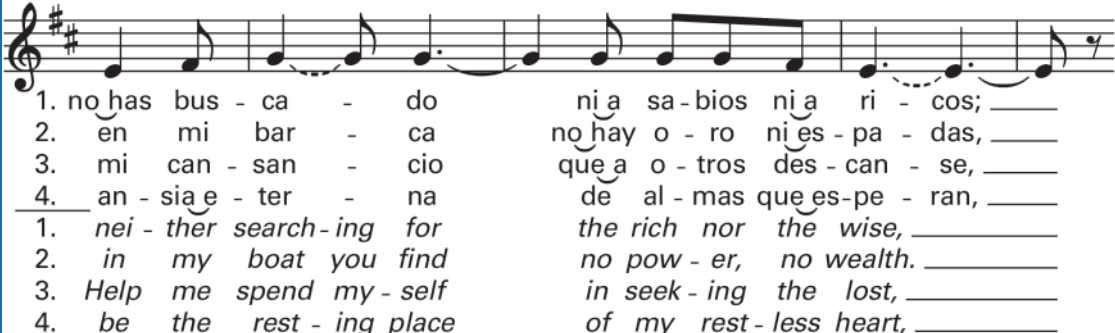
