Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Dear Parishioners,

I want to write to you this week about some important aspects of our parish which I spoke about briefly last week at three of the masses. You may see some movements and read somewhere in the *Retrospect* that our Good Shepherd School building has been under a new management. Good Shepherd School was closed during the Covid-19, and since then the school building became a complete part of our parish where we pay for all the maintenance and insurance to keep it in shape. Taking care of a building like this has been very expensive for our parish.

Great things are happening at our parish. The school building is currently leased to the Collingswood School District which is a very positive aspect for us because the building will continue to serve the community, and it will be used for the purpose it was created. Also, this arrangement will help the parish to continue to maintain its temporal goods (assets). Currently, the parish is maintaining 9 buildings. Some of them have not been in use for about 10 years. It is always our hope to sell or rent them so that we can reduce the number of buildings, which will then decrease our expenses.

Having many unused buildings in a parish does not make the parish financially viable. It is important to have fewer buildings, so that we may be a financially healthy parish. This is what the parish Finance Committee is working towards as they realized changes are necessary to safeguard the temporal assets of the parish. I know many people in the parish have stories or a remarkable personal attachment to each building and you'll always have those memories. I am certain that each building means a lot to so many of you in the parish. Yes, it is not a loss. It is a gain to rent the property out, because the buildings will have new life and new memories will be made in them. We need your support in every way you possibly can so we can complete this project to protect the temporal assets of our parish.

Know that I am with you, and we are in good shape. We are blessed to have generous people like you who contribute to the parish so we can celebrate the sacraments for your children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren; to celebrate your weddings and those of your family members; and to be with you for funerals of those whom you love, and to minister to you all. I am blessed to be part of such a viable parish. For example, we are blessed to have 280 children in Faith Formation.

Let us continue to work together to keep our Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish as a warm and friendly spiritual community which will be available for the next generations to come. Saint Teresa parish family members know each other, care for each other, and celebrate together in good and in bad times. Together we shall continue to serve and to work on your behalf for the protection and progress of the parish community.

FIRST READING: Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13

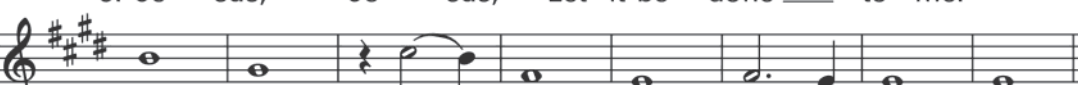

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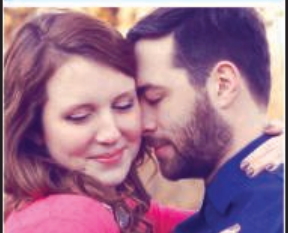
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
