Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time: February 12, 2023

The Gospel of Matthew was constructed in a way to parallel the Old Testament. In this Gospel, it is told in a way that parallels the story of Moses and the Ten Commandments. It's known as the antitheses. It consists of a series of six statements in which Jesus sets up an antithesis, an opposition, between the laws of Moses in the Old Testament, and the teaching of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount, the New Law in the Gospel. Moses went up the mountain and brought down the Ten Commandments. In this Gospel Jesus goes up the mountain and his disciples come to him and he teaches them. Jesus takes us up the mountain with Him and helps us understand the Commandments as God meant for us to understand them.

There is no difference between the Old Law and the New Law. This is made perfectly clear in the beginning of this Gospel. Jesus did not come to change the Law, but to fulfill it. This is why I usually always focus on the Old Testament. For us being Catholic, we need to hold on to our roots and they are the Old Testament. Reading and knowing only the New Testament is great, but the point is often missed if we do not look at the New Testament through the lenses of the Old Testament.

I always remember when Jesus told his disciples to "Be perfect as your Father in Heaven is perfect". It is not in this Gospel, but here Jesus describes what that means. The meaning is that while the Scribes and the Pharisees observed the letter of the Law, Jesus explains to us that we should follow the spirit of the Law. Where the Old Law was written on two stone tablets, the New Law is written in our hearts!

I believe that through the Holy Spirit we come to know the spirit of the Law. Consider the commandment "Thou shall not kill". That is the old law. It is also the new law, exactly the same, but it also includes what we know in our hearts to be true. Anything that leads to killing someone either physically or spiritually results in a type of killing of the person.

I subconsciously do this all the time and don't really think about it, do you? We do it when we give a person the "silent treatment" or when we criticize an idea that someone may have and tell them it is stupid. These are all intended to kill in one form or another. We should always remember what Saint Paul tells us, "Let us encourage each other daily while it is still today" Hebrews 3:13. We know it is wrong, but we are drawn to it almost instinctually. It is not the end of the world. Just keep trying in your heart to stop doing it. It is a constant battle!

Where the Pharisees and the scribes followed the letter of the law, spiritually many of them did not follow the spirit in their hearts. Many of us may not even know the letter of the law, but we know or believe the Spirit of the Law. The Pharisees and the Scribes may be clean on the outside, but it is all for show. For us, the goal is to be clean on the inside also.

At the very end of the Gospel Jesus tells us to "let your 'yes' mean yes and your 'no' mean no, anything else is from the evil one". When I reflect on this I think of the very beginning of the Bible. Adam and Eve are told by God not to eat from that tree, a solid "no." But what did the serpent do? It tried to rationalize that it was all right. Obedience, simple obedience, God said "no". God said that we are called to be obedient.

One of the reasons I worry so much about our world is that with so many controversial topics people are always trying to justify them. With all things I suggest we do what you were taught at a very young age and for me my basic core beliefs do go back to what I learned in the third grade. Ask yourself, "What would Jesus do?" The law is written on your heart, so just follow your heart. Pray for the Spirit to always guide you to simply do what Jesus would do. God will lead. In the end He always does! God Bless!

John Coltrane's iconic masterpiece, *A Love Supreme*, was recorded in December of 1964 and released in February of 1965. Its impact has only grown in the 58 years since.

The presentation will be a non-technical appreciation, geared for all, with additional time at the end for questions and discussion.

The John Coltrane Quartet of the early to mid '60s is widely regarded as one without peer, and this is their most impactful single work. As it turns out, one of the greatest and most influential albums ever recorded was also a prayer. Everyone should have a chance to hear it properly presented.

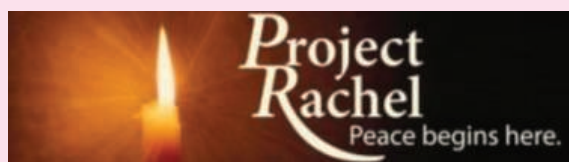

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord.*

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 2: 6-10

Brothers and sisters: We speak a wisdom to those who are mature, not a wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age who are passing away. Rather, we speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory, and which none of the rulers of this age knew; for, if they had known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But as it is written: *What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him*, this God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit scrutinizes everything, even the depths of God.

GOSPEL: Matthew 5: 17-37

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. Amen, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or the smallest part of a letter will pass from the law, until all things have taken place. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do so will be called least in the kingdom of heaven. But whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the kingdom of heaven. I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, *You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment*. But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; and whoever says to his brother, 'Raqa,' will be answerable to the Sanhedrin; and whoever says, 'You fool,' will be liable to fiery Gehenna. Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court. Otherwise your opponent will hand you over to the judge, and the judge will hand you over to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. Amen, I say to you, you will not be released until you have paid the last penny.

"You have heard that it was said, *You shall not commit adultery*. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body thrown into Gehenna. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body go into Gehenna.

"It was also said, *Whoever divorces his wife must give her a bill of divorce*. whoever divorces his wife - unless the marriage is unlawful—causes her to commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

"Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, *Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow*. But I say to you, do not swear at all; not by heaven, for it is God's throne; nor by the earth, for it is his footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. Do not swear by your head, for you cannot make a single hair white or black. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one."

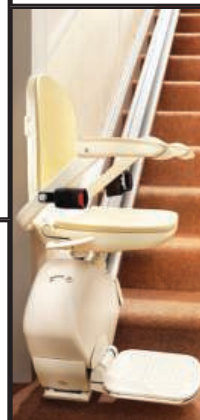
