Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Stephen Ministry at St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish

Dear parishioners,

Many of us face worries, anxieties, and fears during our lives. The death of a loved one, financial challenges, job loss, relationship issues, loneliness, sickness, disabilities, unsettling life changes, faith issues and others, may cause us to have difficulty coping. In such situations, even if the struggle is temporary, no one should have to suffer alone.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta is a “Stephen Ministry” Parish. Stephen Ministry is a caring ministry in which specially trained lay parishioners are commissioned by our parish to provide one to one Christ centered care to people who are experiencing a life challenge or crisis. They walk with you during difficult times to provide caring, nonjudgmental, empathetic listening. Anything that you share with them is strictly confidential. No one will know that you have a Stephen Minister. Their ministry is free and continues so long as you need it.

While many have been helped by this ministry in our parish there are others who may still not be aware of these services, or have not benefitted from them because they don’t want to admit that they could use some help.

I encourage all parishioners who are experiencing worry, loss, anxiety, life concerns or loneliness to take advantage of this wonderful opportunity.

John Coltrane’s iconic masterpiece, *A Love Supreme*, was recorded in December of 1964 and released in February of 1965. Its impact has only grown in the 58 years since.

Please plan to join us for a presentation of the four-part suite in its entirety. Background and commentary will be supplied by parishioner Ken Bossong, a life-long fan and student of the music. The presentation will be a non-technical appreciation, geared for all, with additional time at the end for questions and discussion.

The John Coltrane Quartet of the early to mid ‘60s is widely regarded as one without peer, and this is their most impactful single work. As it turns out, one of the greatest and most influential albums ever recorded was also a prayer. Everyone should have a chance to hear it properly presented.

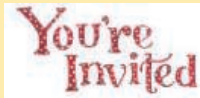

For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God, for it is written: *God catches the wise in their own ruses*, and again: *The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are vain*. So let no one boast about human beings, for everything belongs to you, Paul or Apollos or Cephas, or the world or life or death, or the present or the future: all belong to you, and you to Christ, and Christ to God.

GOSPEL: Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, *An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth*. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, *You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy*. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. 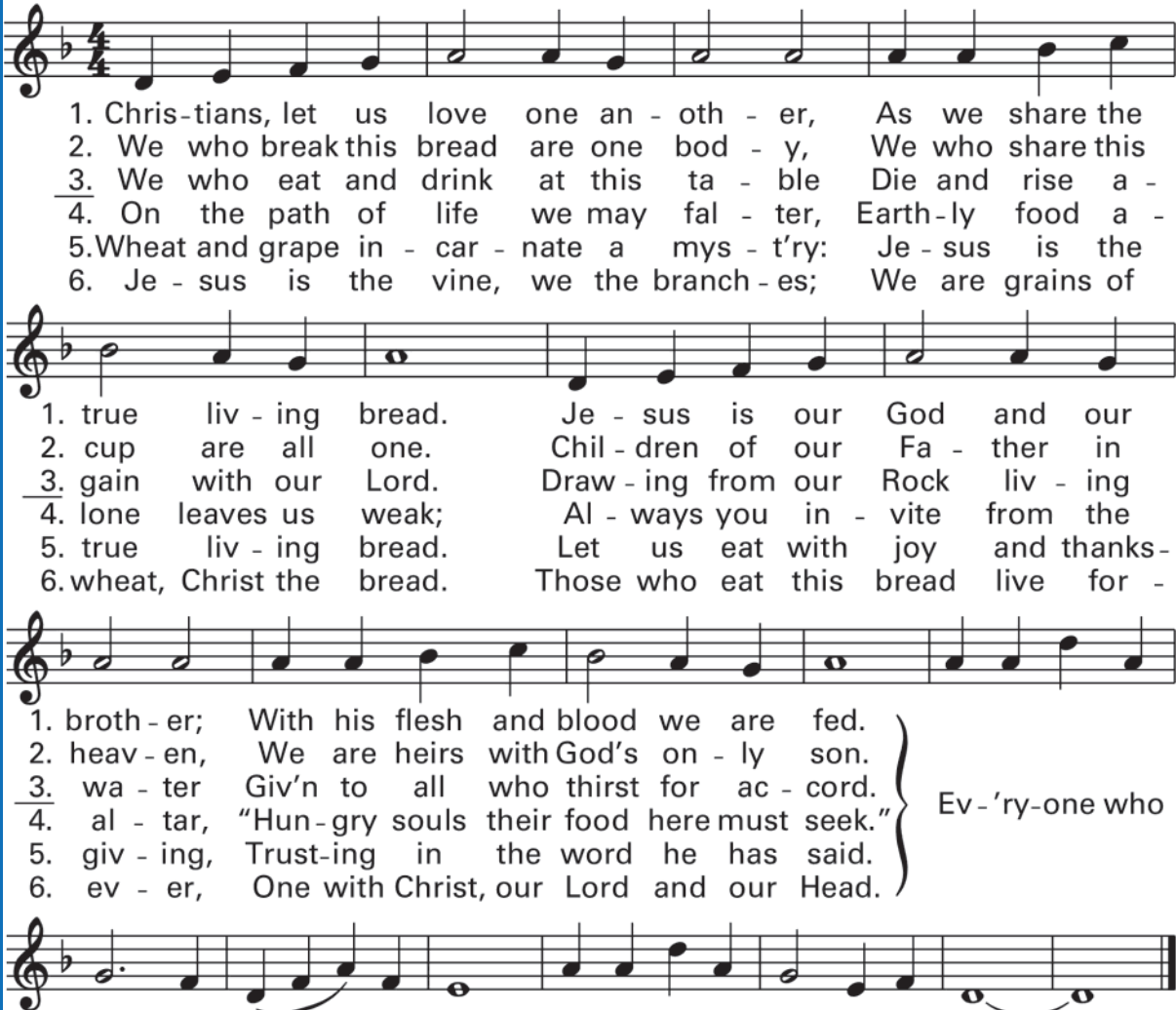
