Second Sunday of Easter: April 16, 2023

Today's reflection is on the Second Sunday of Easter also called Divine Mercy Sunday. Last week was Easter Sunday and with that we entered the Easter Season. Just as we have a Christmas season, we have the same thing for Easter. The Easter season will last for seven weeks.

During this Easter season we will look at a few different things. Of course, the primary focus of this season is the resurrection of Jesus on Easter of course. Most of the gospels for this season will look at the accounts of the resurrected Jesus. The first reading will not be from the Old Testament but from the Acts of the Apostles. With the Acts of the Apostles, we get a glimpse into early Christian life and the first preaching of the Good News. With the Easter Season we get many of the traditions of the Church that we have today. This is the beginning of the early Church. It all starts with Jesus coming through a door in a locked room where the ten apostles were hiding. Only ten apostles were there as Judas went off and killed himself, and Thomas was not in the room at the time. This event took place on Easter Sunday.

What did Jesus do? First, He greeted them, "Peace be with you" and why is this important? Because a few days before this it was Holy Thursday, and Jesus was showing His great love for them. He showed them in the breaking of the bread and the drinking of the cup, the New and Holy Covenant. He celebrated the first Mass with them. Jesus had only hours left to live, and He knew it. What would you do if you knew you only had a few hours to live?

Think of what happened on 9/11? The people in the trade center towers who were not killed right away - what did they do? Did they call their accountants or their bosses? No, they called the people they loved, their wives, husbands, mothers, fathers.... Nothing mattered except Love, and in the end this is all that does matter!!! Jesus did the same thing! Out of all the things He could have done in His final hours, He shared it with those He loved.

Now, why was this friendly greeting so important? Because at the one moment they should have all stood by Jesus, they let Him down; they abandoned them completely. But Jesus was not vengeful. He forgave them, no questions asked. He understood. He forgave them and showed them divine mercy. Jesus once again, as in the washing of the feet, showed his disciples what they should always do: love thy neighbor, to serve not to be served.

Next Jesus breathed on them and told them, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." This has a deep significance, the act of Him breathing on them. Can you think of when this happened before? In John's Gospel, it starts, "In the beginning there was the Word," the same beginning as the book of Genesis. Now think of the story of Adam. God breathed life into him, and he came into being.

With this breathing on the disciples they, like Adam, are now a new creation. Jesus has commissioned them to go out and spread the word, the good news. From right here they stopped being disciples and are now apostles. Think of the definition of the word apostle - one who is sent forth. This is where we begin as the Holy Catholic Church! This Church would have to figure out a great many things about Jesus. This was the beginning of the time of my favorite saints of the Church, the early Church Fathers, and to figure this out, this deep and sacred mystery, they would have to look into the past and also try to figure out the future.

The Catholic Church at this time was a clean slate. Reflect on the mysteries they would have to figure out: Jesus and the crucifixion. What was the real significance? Jesus, fully human, fully divine. Jesus the fulfillment of the Old Testament. Jesus savior of the world, not just for the Jews but for all people. From this moment came the great power of the Holy Spirit, teaching and revealing great mysteries, getting things wrong but also getting things right.

And what most people don't think of is that they wanted to figure out these things as fast as possible because they believed Jesus would be right back, in the next few days or months. They figured out a great deal of the puzzle, but there are still loose ends. There will probably always be loose ends.

But for us, we are to continue to unlock the puzzle, continue standing boldly by what these people died for, be willing just as they were to stand and die for a faith that defies understanding. Millions died for this Church, and they did not die in vain. We must continue to figure this out and we must also stand boldly in the defense of Jesus. Believing in the one-line Thomas got so right in today's Gospel, "My Lord and my God!"

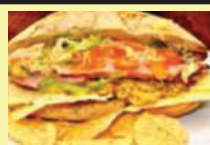

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

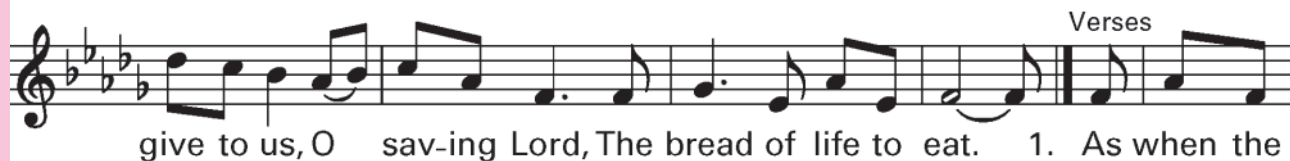

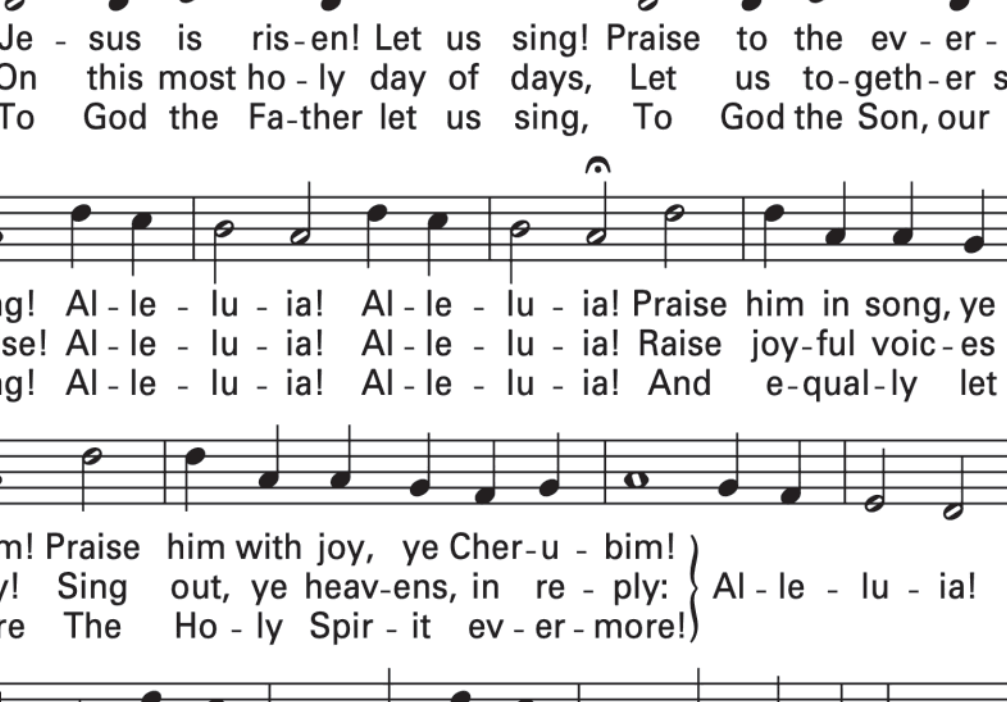
