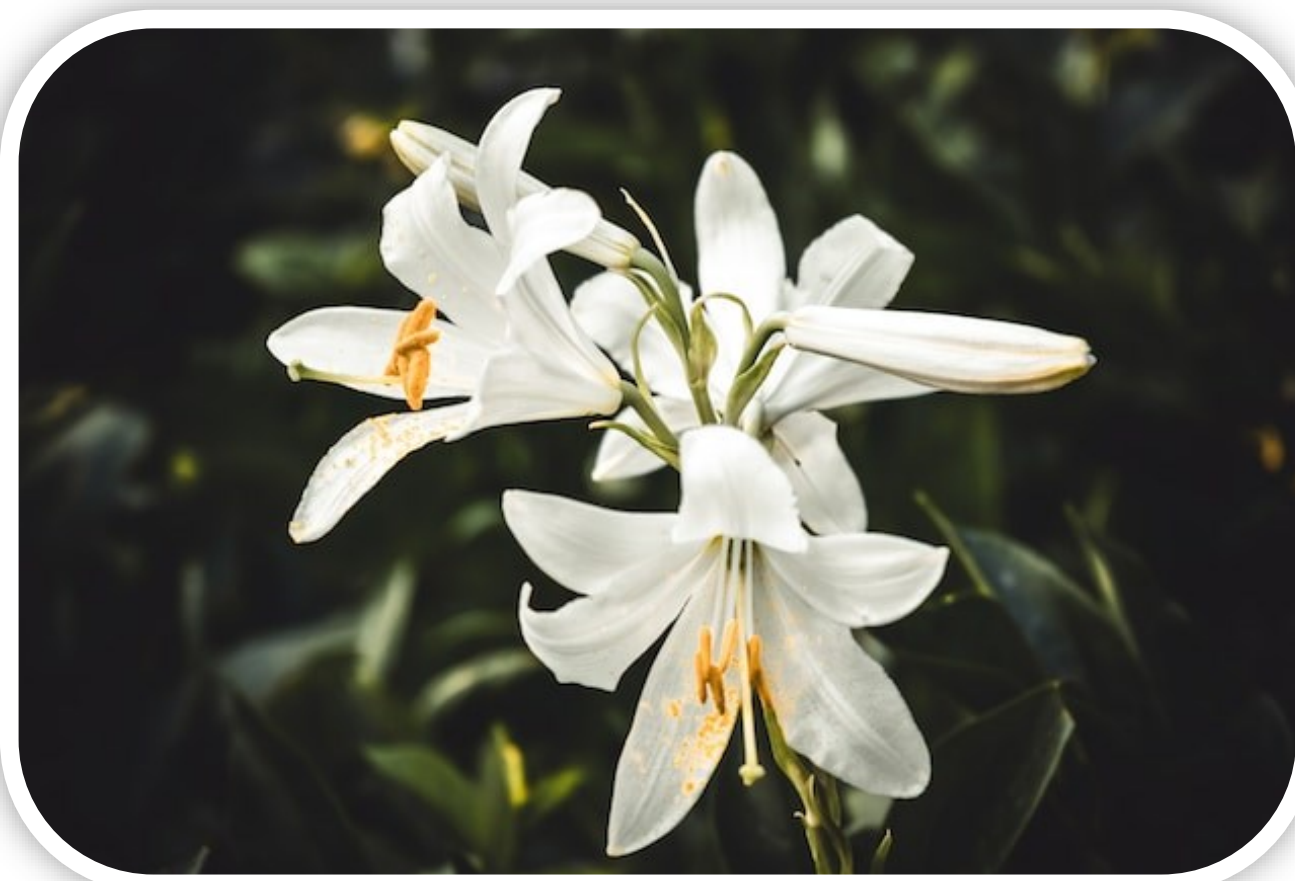

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord: April 9, 2023

The Lord is risen. Halleluia! Life has conquered death; Love has conquered hate; Light has driven out darkness! Throughout the Holy Week we have meditated on the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. For six weeks we have been reflecting on the living aspect of the Cross and the Eucharist. We thank Sister Claire and all the priests who have been helping us to deepen our faith with their wonderful reflections and to help us to prepare for this beautiful Feast of our faith. We thank all of you who took advantage of the opportunity to be part of this Lenten series and the Stations of the Cross. Also, we thank all the priests who have helped us with the beautiful penance service that we experienced in our parish. I am so grateful for their support with this important sacrament. It was a wonderful way for us as a parish to make ourselves ready to celebrate Easter which is the central element of our Christian faith. Our faith derives entirely from this primordial event, from its message of Happiness and Peace.

“Why do you seek the Living among the dead? He is not here, he is risen”. (Lk. 24:5-6) This was the question asked to the women in front of the empty tomb. This is also the fundamental question that every Christian should ask himself or herself on this feast of the Resurrection.

On this important feast of our faith, we are invited to go to the tomb, too, to look inside with the eyes of our imagination. Like Mary Magdalene, like Peter and the other disciple, John, we will see the cloths and the burial bands. We will look at the place in detail, but our imagination will be powerless to show us the risen Jesus. The only path open to us is that of faith. This faith is not a headlong rush or an esoteric representation; it is based on the Word of God. He gives us his Son who, by his lowering from the Cross, deserves the exaltation of the resurrection which makes all things new.

“If Christ is not risen”, says Saint Paul, “our faith is vain”. (I Corinthians 15:17). The resurrection of Jesus opens wide the door of the realities from above to all of us as his brothers and sisters. This feast not only shows us the power of God but gives us hope to walk with Jesus with a different purpose. He lives totally for God as the one who comes to be the expression of his father’s love. Like the risen Jesus who now lives totally for God, we too are called to live for Jesus. We rise with Him from our graves, and we live for God. The resurrection of the Lord is our resurrection. We, too, have been exalted because Jesus’ resurrection is the manifestation of our New Life.

Let us ask the Lord on this beautiful Easter day to help us to live like resurrected people. It is a day of joy. It is a day of liberation. With the newly brothers who received the sacrament at our parish at the Easter Vigil, with the risen Christ, let us seek things from above as Saint Paul invites us to do. We will thus be able to bring into our world a note of hope and joy. “The resurrection of Christ”, writes Pope Francis in *The Joy of the Gospel*, “produces everywhere the seeds of this new world; and even if they were pruned, they grow again, because the resurrection of the Lord has already penetrated the hidden aspect of this story, because Jesus was resurrected for the Salvation of the world. Let us not remain on the sidelines of this path of living hope!” (*The Joy of the Gospel*, 278). Let us greet each other on this Easter day by saying: “Christ is risen! Halleluia!

I wish you all a blessed Easter. May Jesus continue to be resurrected in your lives and in the lives of your Family.

GLORIA: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you; we bless you; we adore you; we glorify you; we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: "You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.*

SECOND READING: Colossians 3: 1-4

Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

SEQUENCE:

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer your thankful praises! A Lamb the sheep redeems; Christ, who only is sinless, reconciles sinners to the Father. Death and life have contended in that combat stupendous: The Prince of life, who died, reigns immortal. Speak, Mary, declaring what you saw, wayfaring. "The tomb of Christ, who is living, the glory of Jesus' resurrection; bright angels attesting, the shroud and napkin resting. Yes, Christ my hope is arisen; to Galilee he goes before you." Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining. Have mercy, victor King, ever reigning! Amen. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 20: 1-9 On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

At the words that follow, up to and including "and became man", all bow.

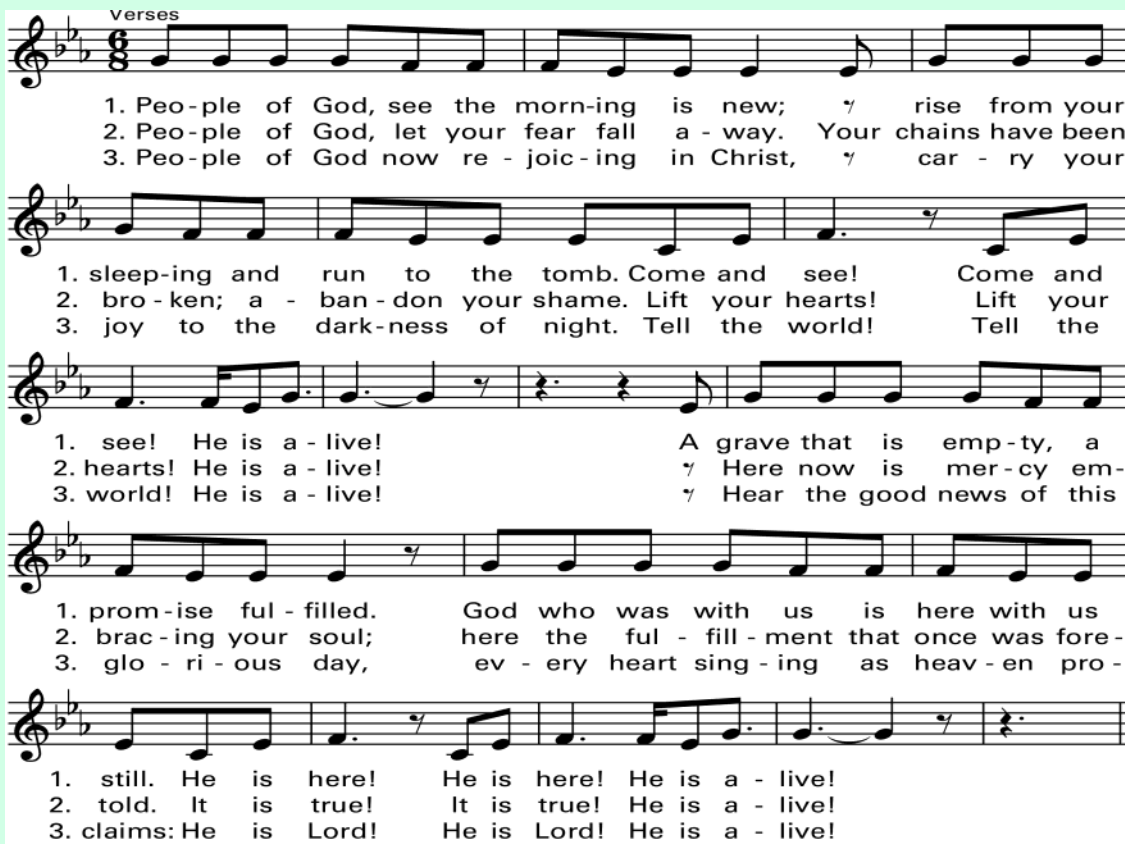
And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the

Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

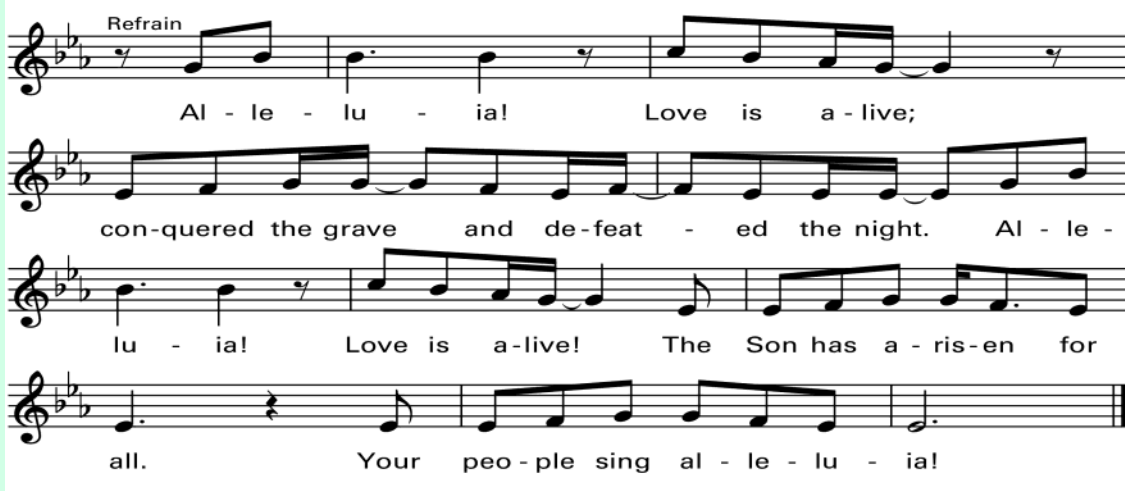

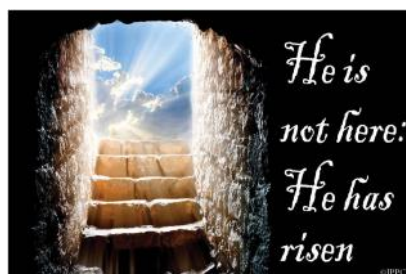
