Last Sunday the parish gave me a beautiful reception in the school cafeteria in recognition of my coming retirement. I want to thank everyone who came to wish me well. Your words and gifts meant so much to me. I especially want to thank Connie Stuhlemmer and her team for creating such a lovely environment and for gathering so many goodies to help with the celebration! Thank you to Hal Schwalm, President of the Parish Council, who spearheaded the retirement celebration and gifted me with a framed version of last Sunday's (surprise to me!) bulletin cover. Thank you to Ed Charlton, the President of the Men's Club, for the kind words and gift from their group. And to all the Faith Formation families—I so appreciate your gift and the sentiments that went with it. It has been my privilege to shepherd your children these past years.

This moment of leave-taking ministry at St. Teresa of Calcutta has given me reason to pause and reflect upon all the people and experiences I've had in the last 25 years. And that means my thanks reaches back years as I see the hand of God guiding and supporting me through each step of this journey.

Thank you from me and from our entire parish

I mentioned last Sunday that I have always been drawn to Gospel about the loaves and the fishes. In that story, the disciples tell Jesus that they cannot feed the crowd because they do not have enough resources. But Jesus takes what they have, blesses it, and subsequently feeds the crowd. We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2023-24 Faith Formation program. Contact the parish office if you are in need of a registration form. Families can register for the following models.

For Grades K through 7:

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School).

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

Copies of Baptismal certificates needed for:

Children registering for the first time who were not baptized at St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.

Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

SECOND READING: 1 Peter 2: 4-9

Beloved: Come to him, a living stone, rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God, and, like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it says in Scripture: *Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion, a cornerstone, chosen and precious, and whoever believes in it shall not be put to shame.* Therefore, its value is for you who have faith, but for those without faith: *The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, and A stone that will make people stumble, and a rock that will make them fall.* They stumble by disobeying the word, as is their destiny. GOSPEL: John 14: 1-12

And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works.
