Feast of the Most Holy Trinity: June 4, 2023

Last Sunday was Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. With red balloons and festive clothing, we celebrated, just like we do for birthdays in our own families. And just as birthday parties help to remind us of our family identity, so too the Feast of Pentecost helps us to see our communal identity. We are the church, a holy people. And we can do great things for the world—enliven it, heal it—when we let the power of the Holy Spirit unite us and inspire us.

This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Unlike Pentecost, this feast often feels too cerebral or remote because when we read or hear about the Trinity, we encounter words or phrases like personhood, essence, being, or three in one. These words fit well within a theological or philosophical treatise, but they are difficult to relate to in our day-to-day lives. Another common phrase regarding the Trinity is mystery. And indeed, trying to fathom God as a unity of three distinct persons can feel *mysterious*, as if it is meant to be out of our reach. And if it's something that we can never comprehend, why even think about it?

But we are not given doctrines and liturgical feasts to confuse us or distance us from God. On the contrary, our Church's teachings are there to help us to understand who God is and who we are in God's eyes. And when we catch a glimpse of those two truths, it can impact our every moment in a positive, life-giving way. This is especially true of the Doctrine of the Trinity.

One of the first things we learn from our religious education is that we are made in the image and likeness of God. We don't say that we physically resemble God, but that we are like God (though flawed and sinful) in our deepest interior sense—mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. But when we say "God" we need to remember that we are not talking about a lone Being, but a community of love, a Trinity: The Father loving the Son loving the Holy Spirit loving the Father.... The very essence of God is relational. And since we are people made in the Trinity's image and likeness, we are at heart also relational, born to be in communion with God and with others.

That is why we feel most alive and in flow when our relationships are flourishing and why we feel most pained when our relationships are suffering. That is why we say sin involves the breaking or damaging of a relationship, with God or others. We are not designed to be islands or rugged individualists. We were made to love and give of ourselves. The Trinity reminds us of our deepest identity, reminds us that we must never put our jobs or our hobbies ahead of the people in our lives. When we live and honor the mystery of the Trinity each day, we become the people God intended us to be.

Faith Formation Registration

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2023-24 Faith Formation program. Contact the parish office if you are in need of a registration form. Families can register for the following models.

For Grades K through 7:

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.
Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

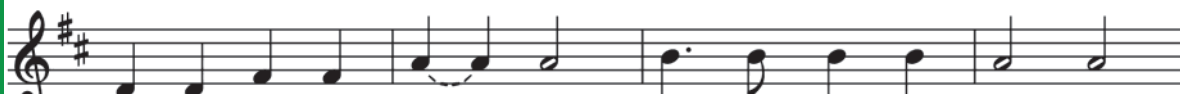

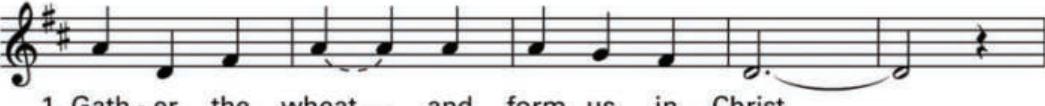

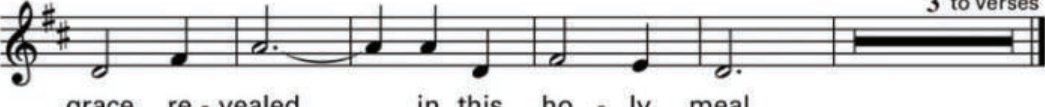
