Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: June 11, 2023

Today is the feast of Corpus Christi, which is Latin for “The Body of Christ.” I have preached before about the importance of the Eucharist and you might be thinking that maybe I am making too much about it. But this is not an “it”; this is not a “thing”; The Eucharist is a “whom”. It is the Body of Christ, it is Jesus— His body and His divinity. If you are anything like me when you look at the Eucharist; you do not understand but you believe.

And I am not sure about you; but I am fine with this. I very simply believe because I believe what I read in the Gospel, and I believe in what our Church through the guidance of the Holy Spirit teaches. My understanding is limited; but remember we do not walk by sight. We walk by faith and my faith is in Jesus and what He tells us in the Gospel, this Gospel in particular. When we listen to this Gospel Jesus tells us that He is the Living Bread which came down from Heaven. He also told us that “whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me and I in him.”

It is amazing that anyone listening to Jesus would have thought he was talking about cannibalism. And this is probably what those listening thought, but they continued to listen. They did not dismiss Jesus as a crazy person. They recorded what he said and stored it away, having no idea what it really meant, kind of like the prophecies of Isaiah. They had no idea what they meant at the time but knew one day they would be very important.

I wonder if Jesus’ disciples even thought about this during the Last Supper, the first Mass. I doubt it, but the apostles thought about this and through the Holy Spirit, they put that story together with what Jesus told them about eating his Body and Blood.

They knew and believed in the story of Moses, and they believed that God gave the Israelites manna to stay alive in the desert. The Gospel of Matthew was written before John and used the backdrop of the Exodus story as a framework. For example, in the Jewish scripture Moses went up the mountain to receive the Ten Commandments. Jesus went up the mountain and took the disciples with them to give them the Beatitudes. He explained to them that the greatest commandment is to love God and neighbor. He told them by living this commandment, the Ten Commandments are already being followed. He explained to them that the commandments are not a set of rules that must be rigidly followed, but are gifts given to them by God for a way to live a happy life. Loving God and neighbor suffices, because if you live by that commandment, you are already following the ten.

In the Gospel of John, he used a similar framework as Matthew. From the Jewish Scripture, they knew and believed that God gave the Israelites manna in the desert. Through the Gospel we hear today and what Jesus said at the Last Supper, they were blessed with the knowledge that the Eucharist is the bread we need for the journey to Everlasting Life.

So, today we celebrate the gift Jesus gives us in the Eucharist. Something happens during Mass, something we will probably never fully understand until Jesus tells us. Is it really Jesus? I believe it truly is, and I see it as the most important gift Jesus gave us. I find myself thinking about the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Jesus walked beside them, explaining the scripture and for a moment was present to them in the breaking of the bread.

Faith Formation Registration

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2023-24 Faith Formation program. Contact the parish office if you are in need of a registration form. Families can register for the following models.

For Grades K through 7:

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th. Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

GOSPEL: John 6: 51-58

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

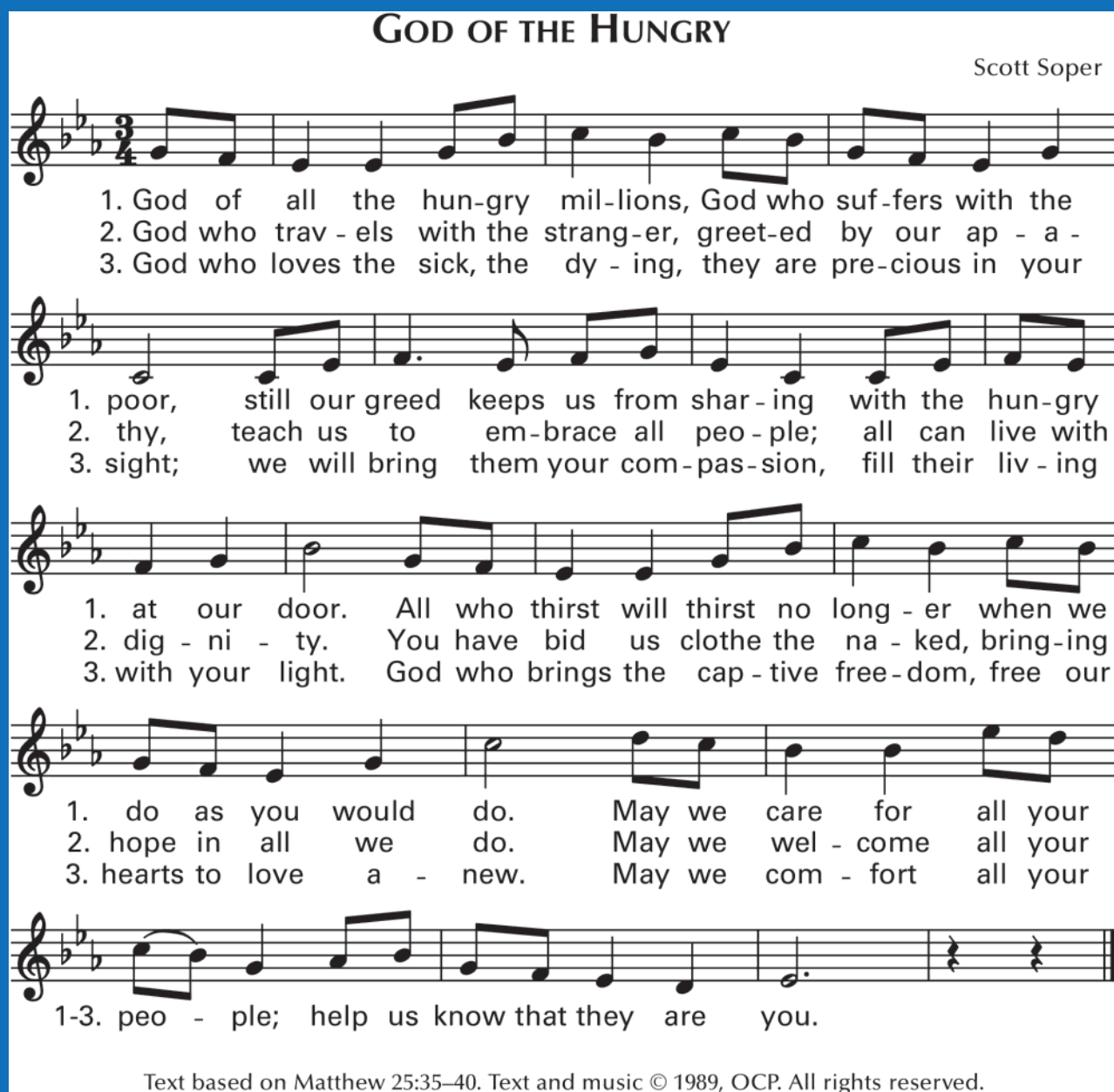

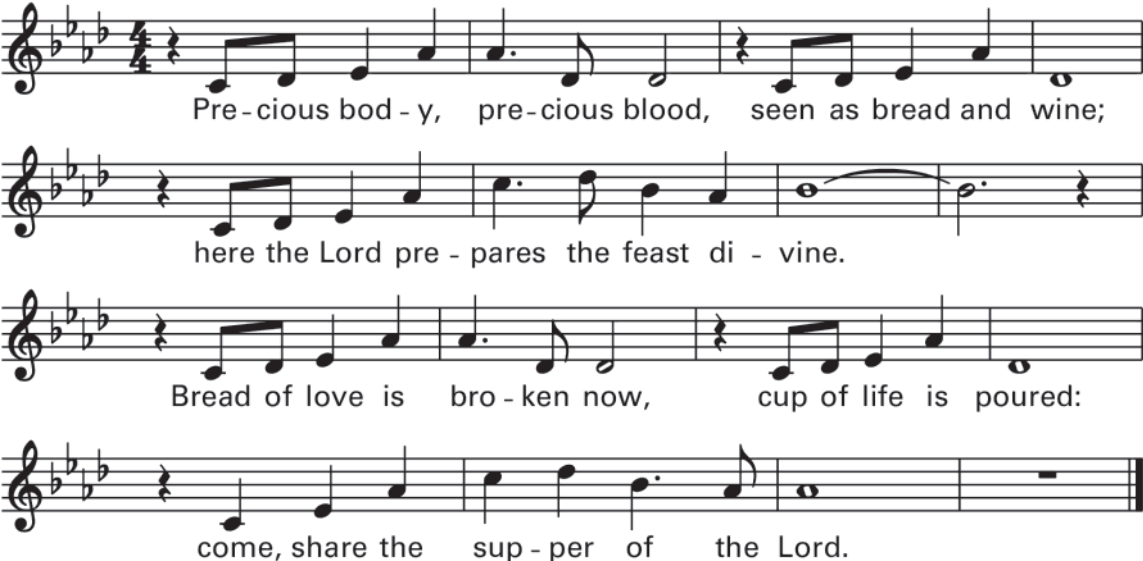
