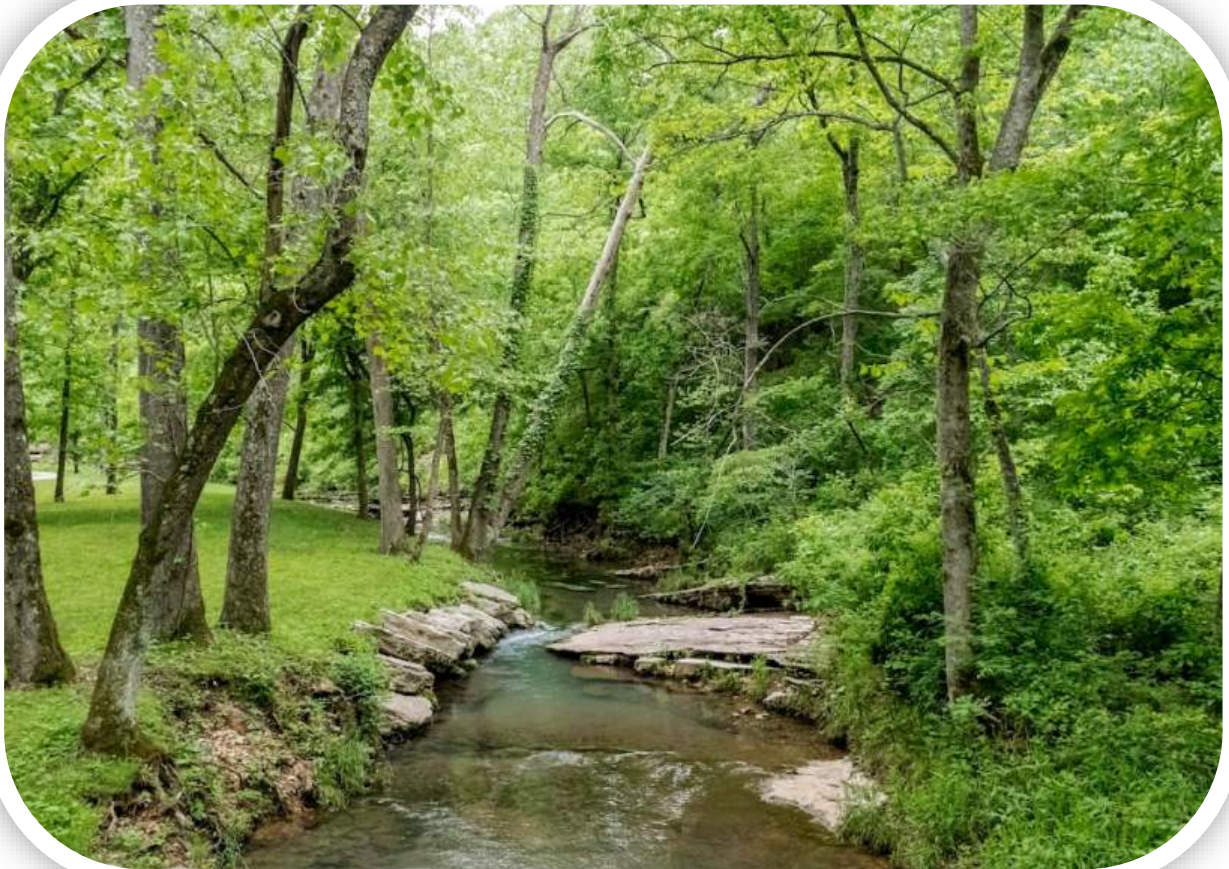

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time: June 25, 2023

Chapter 10 of the Gospel of Matthew reports the 2nd great discourse of Jesus: his mission instructions to the twelve apostles. Last Sunday, we heard the first 8 verses: today we jump to verse 26. But in this interval, Jesus said something crucial in warning his disciples of the dangerous fate that awaits them: "I am sending you as sheep in the midst of wolves...Men will hand you over to the courts...The brother will hand over his brother to death...You will be hated by all because of my Name...". And this grave warning was explained by this statement at the heart of the chapter: "The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant above his lord..." (verses 24-25)

When Matthew wrote his gospel, the Church experienced the reality of these announcements. Everywhere it is severely judged, spied on, criticized, denounced; Etienne was lynched; Jacques decapitated; Peter and Paul put to death; many others no doubt suffered beatings, appeared before the courts, experienced torture, executions, death. The disciples asked themselves: why this relentlessness of the world against us? They read the Gospel again and regained courage: not only had the Master said so, but by accomplishing the mission in the midst of suffering, the apostle knew that he suffered the same fate as his Lord and that he thus resembled him more at every step of their mission.

But faced with the pressure of threats, the possibility of suffering, how not to tremble? Even in our times, we have so many who have withdrawn themselves from faith. Those are the ones to whom this gospel is announced today. We are Catholics in good times and in bad times. Therefore, we need to continue to keep the fire of the Holy Spirit alive in the midst of our struggle. Remember these words of Jesus: "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 10:32-33).

It is our mission to confess that Jesus is our Lord in every circumstance of our lives. Jesus was misunderstood, insulted, accused, condemned. He warned us very clearly that we would suffer the same fate. It is impossible for it to be otherwise. The authentic Gospel will never be welcomed by all because it challenges us in a radical way. In the face of all the Caiaphas and all the Pilates who accuse Jesus of being a blasphemer and affirm that he is dead, the disciples must proclaim that Jesus is the Son of God and that he is alive. In the trial of Jesus which continues in history, we are his witnesses for the defense, his defenders, his lawyers. If we fulfill this function, then we can confidently look forward to appearing before the celestial court in Heaven where there will be the only true tribunal where the value of all life will be judged in total Truth: before God, Jesus will be for us what we have tried to be for him: our "paraclete", our attorney. For to announce Jesus Christ is to defend our redemption.

Brothers and sisters, may this the word of God free us from all fear, may it give us the strength to be his witnesses at every moment in our lives. His words are words of life, words of hope, words made flesh to be among us, which join us in the greatest secret of our loyalty, which keep us upright and get us going again; but the Lord entrusts it to us for all those he loves, all those he gives us to love.

Faith Formation Registration

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2023-24 Faith Formation program. Contact the parish office if you are in need of a registration form. Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7:

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School).

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

Copies of Baptismal certificates needed for: Children registering for the first time who were not baptized at St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.

Sing to the LORD, praise the LORD, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!"

SECOND READING: Romans 5: 12-15

Brothers and sisters: Through one man sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all men, inasmuch as all sinned— for up to the time of the law, sin was in the world, though sin is not accounted when there is no law. But death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those who did not sin after the pattern of the trespass of Adam, who is the type of the one who was to come. But the gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many.

GOSPEL: Matthew 10: 26-33

Jesus said to the Twelve: "Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
