Summer's here! For families with children, it's time for camps and pools and sports and barbecues and playing and just hanging out. For others, it may be time to visit or be visited or finally take that long awaited vacation. Summer is often the time to step back from the busyness of the year. Come August, parents will hear a lot of "I'm bored," but right now, getting out and away from the normal routine feels fresh and exciting. Spending time together, making an extra effort to pay attention to each other, is an important goal these next few months. And yet, here in the beginning of summer, today's Gospel sounds a jarring note. All the loves in our lives cannot supersede our love of God.

Scripture scholars often speak of the "hard sayings" of Jesus. These are teachings or sayings that don't seem to fit in with a Jesus who preaches peace and love, a Jesus we feel comfortable with. For instance, when Jesus says in Matthew's gospel: "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword" (10:34), it can be troubling. Isn't Jesus called the Prince of Peace? When Jesus states "Let the dead bury the dead" (Mt 8:22) it confuses us. Are we not supposed to care and carry our loved ones through to life's end? So today, when we hear that "anyone who loves his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me" (Mt 10:37) it sounds very unnatural. Doesn't the fourth commandment require that we honor our father and mother?

The vocation of family life, whether as parents, grandparents, children, sister or brother, requires attention to each other. We all know in our bones that family life suffers when we are too busy or too distracted to really listen and notice each other. And because family life is a vocation, a calling from God, we must give ourselves to this call with all of our energies and abilities. Stated differently, we are *not* doing God's will when we ignore our families or shirk our responsibilities. And yet, what do we do with those words of Jesus that speak of forsaking our families?

We can take Jesus' words literally and continue to feel confused *or* we can take them and honestly wrestle with them. When I do that, I realize that Jesus is reminding us that even within our family life, there must be something *or someone* more. The question then is not about how much we love our family, but about how much we love Jesus. What place do we give Jesus in our lives? How much urgency do we feel to help our families know the Lord? Are we convinced that faith in God IS the main source of happiness and strength for our children, our brothers and sisters, our own parents?

Most people will not be asked to ignore family responsibilities in order to head out in service for the Lord. But we are all asked daily to make God the center of our lives. As we enter fully into our summer schedules, we must make sure to include God in our plans: attend mass weekly, find a different church while on vacation, do a summer service project together, institute new prayers into our daily lives like the rosary, say grace before meals at a restaurant. Summer *is* a time for renewal and there is no greater source of renewal and strength than God. When we invite God into our summer, our families and ourselves will be blessed abundantly.

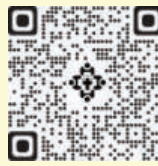

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 4: 8-11; 14-16a

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight. Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

SECOND READING: Romans 6: 3-4; 8-11

Brothers and sisters: Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL: Matthew 10:37-42

Jesus said to his apostles: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple— amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."
