Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: July 9, 2023

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart, and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Think about the invitation Jesus is offering to us. Go back to the beginning to Adam and Eve and the fall of man. Adam and Eve lost everything, and now they had to fend for themselves. Think of all the things they now had to do on their own. They would come to know sickness and death; they would have to work the earth to produce food. Most importantly they would have to live with something they learned from the tree of knowledge, sin, the heavy burden of sin; jealousy, anger, hate, selfish pride, worry, addiction, lust and all the bad things that come along with it. These are the things man has inherited. They are burdensome, but we are so used to them that we just deal with them without thinking. All through life we carry them and there is no end in sight. We are tired and so often feel on our own. That's life for many to a large extent!

Those bills are not going to pay themselves. The possible addiction that you or someone close to you has is embarrassing and keeps creeping back no matter how much you try to control it. The cancer or sickness of someone you love brings unbelievable sadness. What do we do? What can we do?

Now think of the invitation Jesus gives us. What did He say? "Learn from me". And what do we learn? He goes before us always! Before Jesus asked us to fast, He fasted for forty days. Before Jesus asked us to pray, He prayed himself. Before Jesus asked us to be baptized, He was baptized. Before Jesus asked us to lay his hands on the sick, He did that also. He goes before us always!

Now think about the yoke. No, it has nothing to do with eggs. It is a simple farming tool. A yoke was a wooden beam that usually connected two oxen together to pull a heavy load. Using this tool, they could do much more work than with just one ox. The people also learned it was wiser to join a well-seasoned ox, one that was already used to heavy loads and knew the ground well to avoid holes and other obstacles with a younger less experienced ox. So here we are burdened with all the problems of the world, and we must simply deal with them. If we think of ourselves as the less experienced ox that must carry the heavy load, we can now think of Jesus as the other well experienced ox who knows all the tricks. Jesus will lead the way, taking on much of the burden himself. We just have to hang on with Him and faithfully trust in Him.

That is the message here. We are so used to a heavy load. We are very tired and there is no end in sight. Jesus sees our pain and knows we were never meant for this; out of His wonderful mercy He wants to help us. But wait, not so fast! Jesus loves us and wants us to follow Him always in everything we do. He is meek and humble of heart, and we need to be likewise. One important thing to remember is that we are the hands and feet of Jesus. For this to work, we need to take all our worries and concerns, all the issues that weigh us down and give them all to Jesus.

Trust in Jesus and He will take care of them. Think of some of the really bad events that have happened in your life. What happened when you turned them over to Jesus? Somehow, not always, but many times those problems simply melted away. That has been a common occurrence in my life. Jesus has always been there for me. Out of thankfulness, I became a deacon.

Trust me on this: give your problems to Jesus and trust in Him. But wait. Hold on. When you do this there is one thing to consider. Jesus came to serve and not to be served, so we must do likewise. The way we join this yoke with Jesus is to serve others! That is the one big trick Jesus, this well-seasoned ox, teaches us.

Serve others and Jesus will serve you. Just as Jesus served so many and His Father in Heaven served Him, we must do the same. Take up the yoke Jesus wants to give us and learn from Him. We will find not just rest but peace, balance and an understanding of what it really means to love God and neighbor.

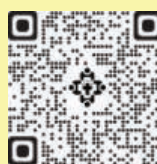
Post Cana (Young Married Couples Group) at St. Teresa of Calcutta
