Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

At the time of Jesus, all the Jewish people were waiting for a Messiah who would restore David's political kingdom and his authority over other peoples. Jesus refuses to respond to this aspiration. He has a different mission. That is why, in the middle of His going up to Jerusalem, when He had already worked long enough as He ministered to his disciples, He took them one day outside of the Jewish territory, to the region of Caesarea, the city Philip had built in honor of the emperor Augustus. It is there, outside of Israel, that He asks them, "What do people say about the Son of Man?" That means about Him. But what really interests Him is to have the answer of his disciples, "And you, who do you say that I am?"

The responsibility entrusted to Peter is challenging but great. One might even think that God is taking a risk by trusting Peter with His mission. What if He is wrong? What if Peter was too demanding? These questions cause confusion in us who know very well from our own experience the fragility and fickleness of human nature. But to think like this is to forget that if Peter's authority is based on the zeal of his faith; this is based on Christ.

We all remember Peter's journey was great and at the same time had a lot of failings, doubt, betrayal, and forgiveness. Jesus always gives us another chance to regain our strength when we fall. He is not looking for perfection in us but the willingness to be perfect and try our best to remain on the road of Salvation. He knows Peter was weak, but He also knows his willingness to follow Him.

There is an invitation here to keep focusing on our strengths and not on our weaknesses. Like Peter, we, in order to confess that Jesus is the Son of God, follow him; To follow him is to respond to his call; to exercise our responsibility is to bear witness to his Love.

The question was asked of all the disciples, and it is in the name of all that Peter answered. In the same account, found in the Gospels of Mark and Luke, Peter's response is "You are the Messiah" or "the Messiah of God." In the Gospel of Matthew, the answer is more elaborate, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." The "Son of Man" is therefore the "Son of God." He is "God among us," the "Emmanuel" according to the title given to Jesus at the beginning of the Gospel of Matthew. As Peter answered in the name of all the disciples, it is to all of them that Jesus answers when He Himself addresses Peter. The profession of faith that Peter expressed is the rock on which Jesus will build his Church of which Peter himself is a member. It should be noted that in the Greek text, the word "stone" is rendered by two different terms which are not synonymous. Petros (you are "Peter") designates a stone that can be moved and even thrown. But petra ("on this stone") means a solid and immovable rock. This rock on which Jesus will build His Church is not the person of Peter, but his profession of faith, made in the name of all the disciples.

Jesus likewise uses two images to designate his Church. First, that of the house built on rock and against which the power of death will have no force and that of the keys, that is to say the power given to the community to admit into its midst those who seek salvation and to exclude those who refuse it. These "keys" should not be seen as a personal power of Peter over the Church, but rather a power of the Church represented by Peter. The First Vatican Council understood this well when it did not define papal infallibility as an individual prerogative but said that the Pope, when he speaks ex cathedra, exercises "the infallibility that Christ gave to His Church."

The Church is not just a simple material organization with very visible activities, like the Pope's journeys, for example. It is a spiritual reality: the people of God. This is why we cannot say, "I am content to practice my religion, to exercise my faith in my own way, all alone." We come together in community as we do on this Sunday. We come together to express our faith in the Lord, to live it under the movement of the Spirit, in union with the pope and the bishops and with our pastors.

When Jesus orders His disciples not to tell anyone that He is the Messiah, He obviously does not forbid them to profess their faith as Peter has just proclaimed it in their name, but to present Him as the Messiah as He was expected by the people. He does not come with royal power but with the humility of a servant.

This question that Jesus asks his disciples in this Gospel story, he also asks each of us. For us, who is Jesus?

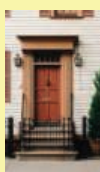

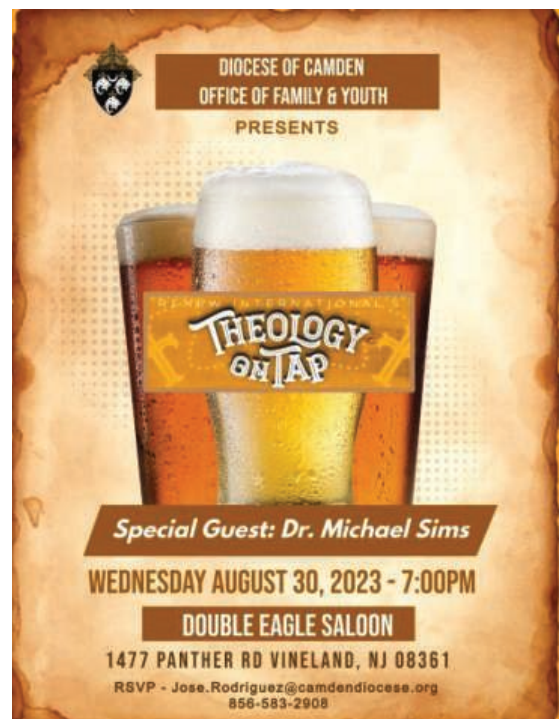
