No matter how old we are, there is something that stirs in us when we hear the words “Once upon a time.” It’s our perennial love of a good story. I daresay from the stories that Jesus told His apostles they rightly called Our Lord “Master.” And so, He remains.

Today’s parable of the wedding feast, in which Jesus capitalized on a well-known image of messianic times, had a certain “punch” to it that the chief priests and elders of the people did not like in the least. Just a few verses prior to those we hear quoted today in Matthew’s gospel passage, we read this: *“When the chief priests and elders heard His parables, they saw that He was referring to them; they wanted to arrest Him, but they were afraid of the people, who looked on Jesus as a prophet.”* (Matt. 21: 45-46)

These were educated men. Perceptive men. They recognized themselves in the negative reactions some people in the story had to the banquet invitation. Perhaps they felt the guilt that follows any denial of God’s ways in one’s behavior. Blind guides indeed!

Of course, the Holy Spirit wants those same parables put to the ears of every generation. They present us with timeless truth and nothing but the truth.

Here is another story, also about a wedding, that further illustrates Our Lord’s teaching in another way:

William M. Dyke was a young man who became blind at the tender age of ten. Despite this handicap, he grew to be a very intelligent, witty and handsome young man. While attending graduate school in England, William met the daughter of an English admiral. The two soon became engaged. Though never having seen her, William loved her very much.

Shortly before the wedding, at the insistence of the admiral, William submitted to special treatment for his loss of sight. Hoping against hope, William wanted the gauze from his eyes removed during the ceremony. He wanted the first thing he saw to be his wife’s face.

As the bride came down the aisle, William’s father started unwinding the gauze from around his son’s head and eyes—still not knowing if the operation had been a success. With the unwrapping of the last circumference, William looked into the face of his new bride for the first time. “You are more beautiful than I ever imagined,” he said.

Like the young groom, though we have never seen Jesus, it will be worth the years of darkness to “see Him as He is.” (1 John 3:2)

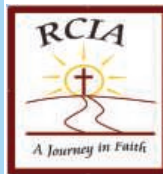
Men's Club Minute

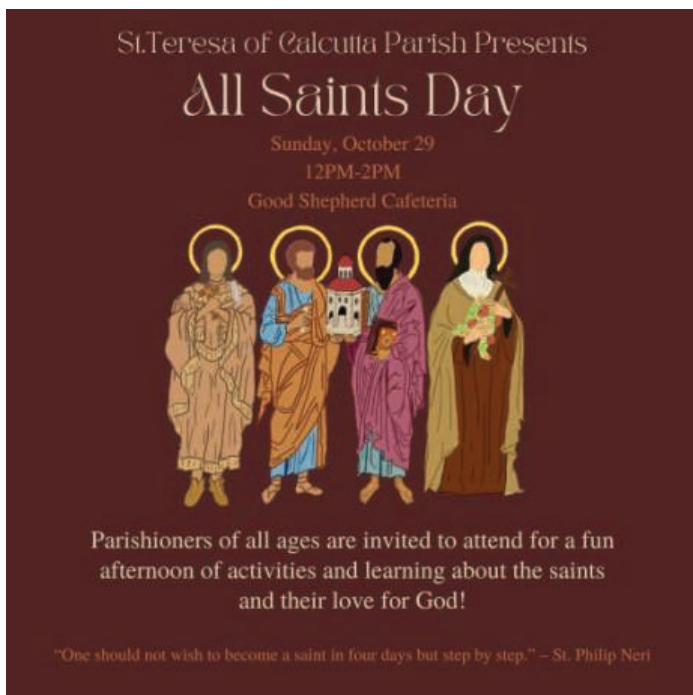

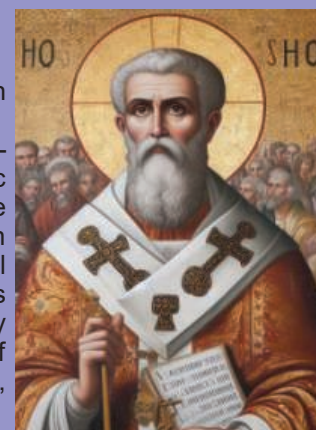
Saint of the Week: Ignatius of Antioch

Feast Day: October 17th

Patronage: Against throat diseases, the Church in the Eastern Mediterranean and North Africa

St. Ignatius of Antioch is one of the five "Apostolic Fathers," and was the third Bishop of Antioch. He was a disciple of St. John the Evangelist and is known for explaining Catholic Church theology. Ignatius was arrested by Roman soldiers and taken to Rome where he was sentenced to death at the Coliseum for his Christian teachings, practices, and faith. On his way to being martyred in Rome, he wrote letters to the early Christians, which we still have today. St. Ignatius's greatest priority was the unity and order of the Church. He was willingness to suffer martyrdom rather than deny his Lord Jesus Christ and ensure the unity of the Church. St. Ignatius did not want the focus to be on his suffering, but on the love of God which strengthened him. He knew the price of commitment and would not deny Christ, even to save his own life. St. Ignatius of Antioch pray for us.

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

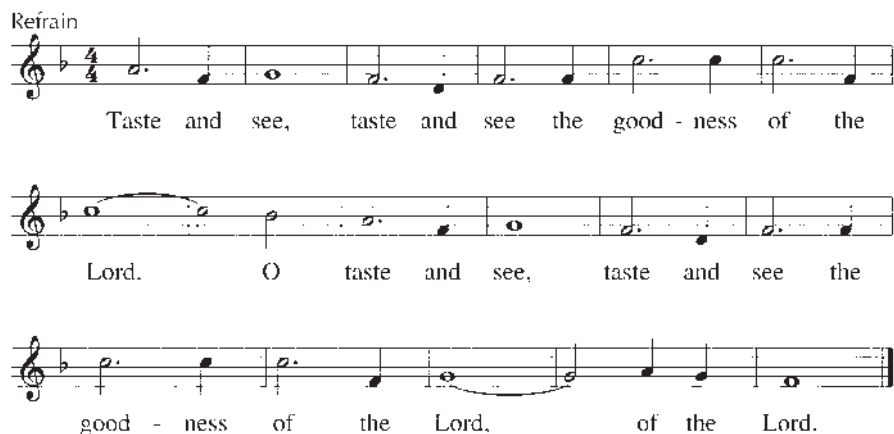
First Way Baby Bottle Collection

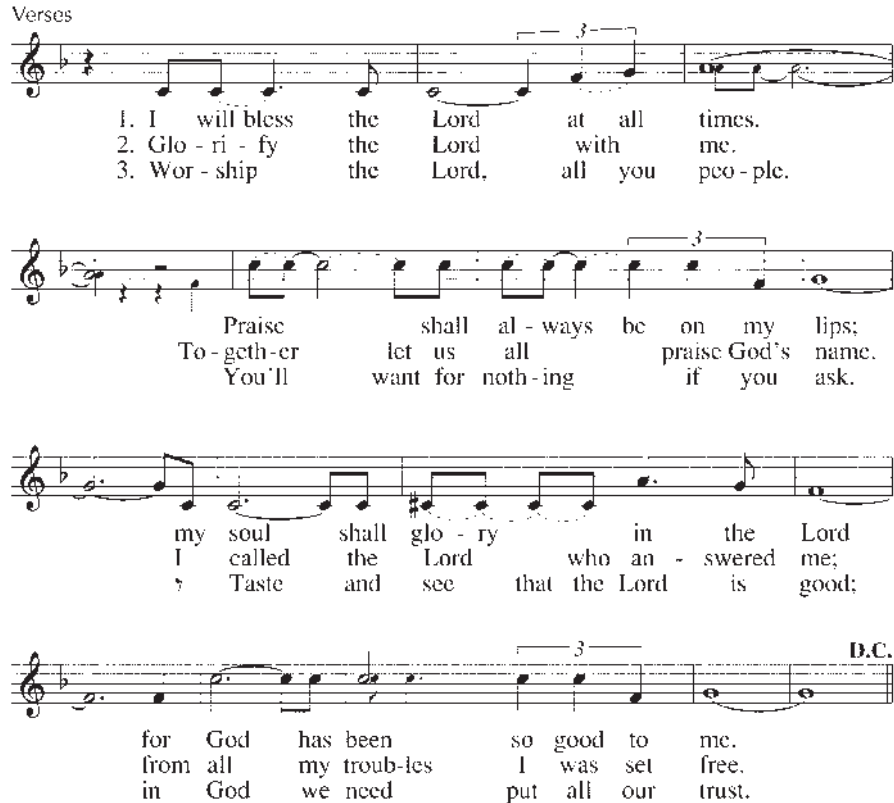

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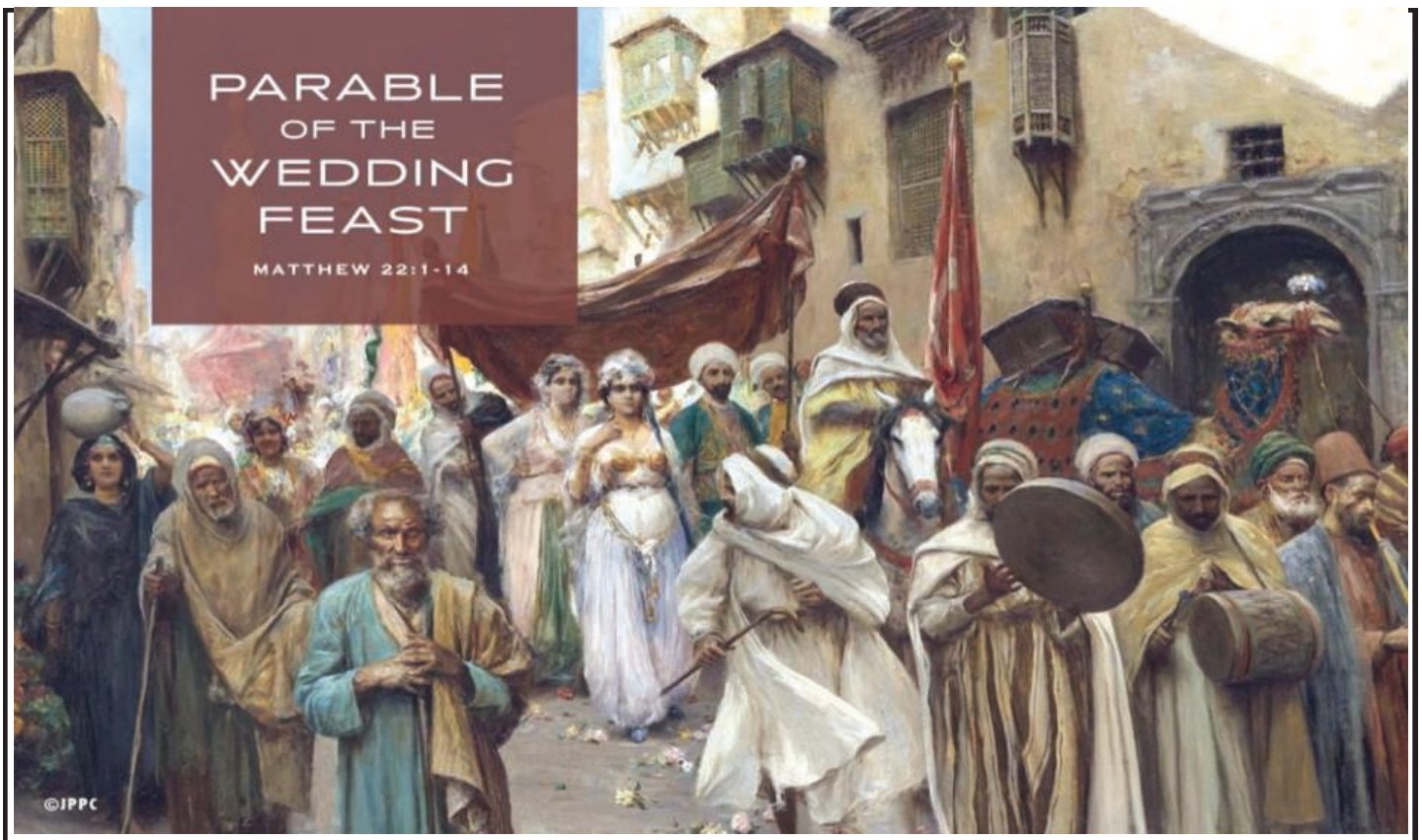
