Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Walking the Walk

At first glance, the meaning of today's readings could not be any clearer. In the Hebrew Scriptures (before the time of Christ) and in the Gospel of Matthew, we hear condemnation of the religious leaders of the times. We all know the phrase—do what I say, not what I do. Jesus doesn't use that familiar line but he comes pretty close as he decries the hypocrisy he sees:

"The scribes and the Pharisees
have taken their seat on the chair of Moses.
Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you,
but do not follow their example.
For they preach but they do not practice.

We are very familiar with hypocrisy these days. It is everywhere. In politics, religion, business—there seems a new level of falseness, so much so that it has become common to read and hear about a loss of faith in the institutions that bind people as a society. This dismissal of institutions has resulted in the post modern turning to self, in which a person creates his or her own barometer of right and wrong because the right and wrong espoused by the institutions is damaged by the aforementioned hypocrisy. That is why the moral weakness of leaders is extremely problematic—it causes people to turn away from the good in the institution, using the excuse of the bad stuff from bad leaders.

It is easy to hear today's readings and look outward and away from oneself. After all, Jesus' reprimand of the religious leaders is unambiguous. But that is one of the greatest temptations and one of the worst mistakes we can make when reading God's word. When we instantly breathe a sigh of relief and say, "O good, this doesn't apply to me," we are not hearing the full import of Jesus' message. Instead of looking outward and identifying all the hypocrites we know in various fields, maybe we should check ourselves first. Maybe God wants a more pure version of ourselves

Can we honestly say that we live without hypocrisy? That our actions are without bias or willful ignorance? I can't. It is an uncomfortable exercise to look at oneself and think about daily choices—what and where we purchase food and other items, how we spend our free time, or what we think about others in our hearts.

Jesus calls out the religious leaders because they are on the front line of his battle. He needs them to be better. But God needs all of us to take seriously the call to be other Christs in the world. As I've written before, this doesn't happen with mere will power. It develops through a commitment to prayer and practice of one's faith. We need to stay within the radar of God's word so God can change us and heal us. Staying within God's radar involves lifting our hearts to God each day. This means different things for different people but I can offer one practical suggestion that just might be doable for busy lives. That is: think about your playlist. What do you listen to each day?

Last week I read about Jalen Hurts' workout playlist. My immediate thought was that if I only listened to those songs I would surely be in shape! Not quite! But what if we could employ a playlist to get our spiritual lives in shape? Instead of using our energy to point and be angry at the insincerity of others, what could we listen to that would inspire us and enlarge our own understanding of God's call? Perhaps each one of us could pick a spiritual song for the week and play it when driving, when on a morning walk, when doing some menial task. Play it over and over. Let it sink into our bones. Let it become God's word to us. Let it begin to change us.

We cannot control the actions of others, especially those in authority, but we do all have a small sphere of influence, beginning with ourselves. Jesus tells us to look at our own lives first and "do and observe all the things whatsoever they tell you." He asks us to live loving and moral lives. He does not let us off the hook because others are talking the talk but not walking the walk.

FIRST READING: Malachi 1: 14b—2: 2b, 8-10

A great King am I, says the LORD of hosts, and my name will be feared among the nations. And now, O priests, this commandment is for you: If you do not listen, if you do not lay it to heart, to give glory to my name, says the LORD of hosts, I will send a curse upon you and of your blessing I will make a curse. You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction; you have made void the covenant of Levi, says the LORD of hosts. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. 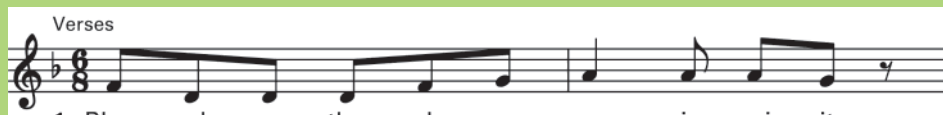

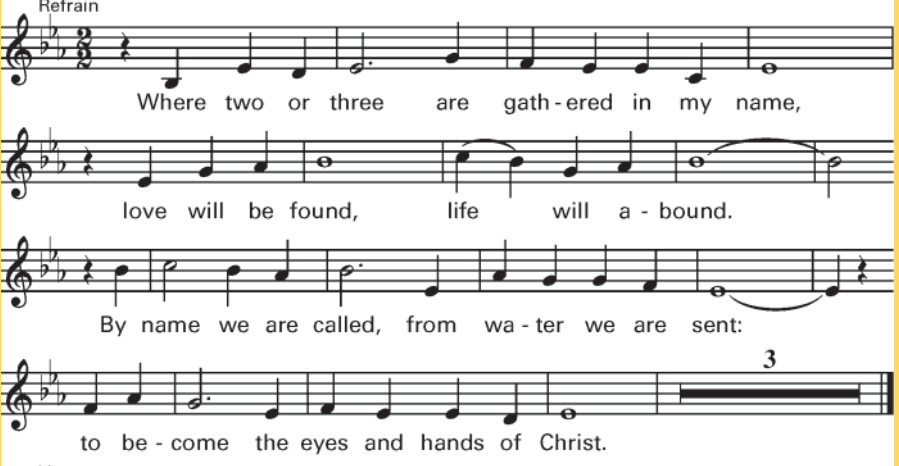

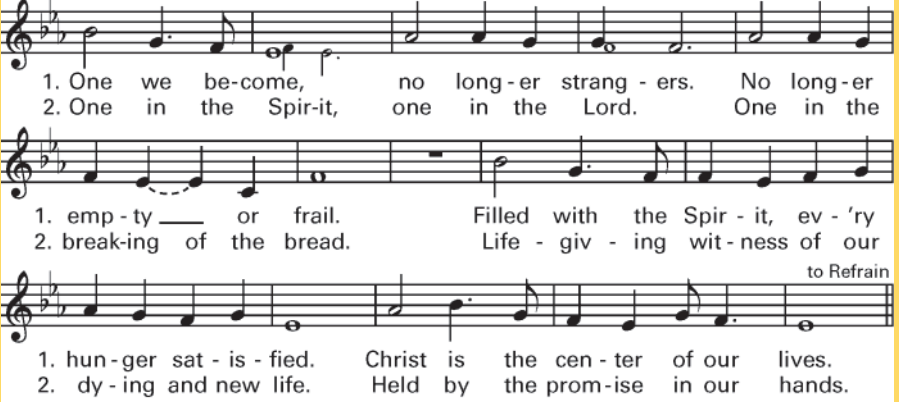
