Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Sanctuary Candle



The Sanctuary Lamp will be burned this week in memory of:

St. John: The sanctuary candle will be burned this week for Mary VanNote r/b her Husband and Family.

In today's Gospel we have another parable. This parable is only seen in the Gospel of Matthew. We have all heard this story many times, but if you are anything like me, you could never figure out the meaning. Jesus is talking to a Jewish audience, and for them to understand, He compared it to something they were all familiar with, a wedding feast.

Ancient Jewish weddings, from what we know, took a great deal of time. They started with a betrothal. Here the bride and groom would get married, but they would not live together or consummate the marriage. Instead, the groom would go and build a home for his bride and organize the wedding feast and, as you can guess, it took a while. When everything was set, there would be a great week-long wedding feast. When the groom had everything set, he would send word to his entourage, which included the bridesmaids, and there would be a procession to the house for the feast. The bridesmaids were simply to wait and be ready because they did not know when this would happen, and it could be day or night. The bridesmaids were to light the way of the procession if it happened at night.

So here is where the story takes some unexpected twists. The five that were not ready asked the five that were for a little help, they had no oil; but they would not help. Instead they tell them to go to the store and buy some. How are they to do this at midnight? It was not like today where we have stores open 24 hours; it does not make sense. Also, usually the procession was not far from the house, so was it really necessary to go at all. The second twist is that after the maids get their oil and they go to the house, the groom tells them he does not know them. This is weird. At any wedding would you not allow the friends of the bride inside? So, we have these two twists. What do the oil for the lamp and the denial of access into the house really mean?

There is obviously some symbolism here. Jesus usually compared things to a wedding or a wedding feast, but what is it? We find out at the end of the story that Jesus is talking about the final judgement. "Watch therefore, for you know neither the day or the hour." The bridesmaids are symbolic for us. We can either be prepared or not. The five wise virgins are prepared and the other five are not prepared. The ones prepared are welcomed into the kingdom of God, heaven. The other five are excluded, hell. This is how we know hell: it is simply the absence of God.

Notice the wording, "I do not know you." The significance is that if we are to have a relationship with the Lord, we must know Him and He is to know us. We can do many good works, and they are important, but what is more important is this relationship. Good works and our personal relationship with Jesus are doing the Will of the Father. Think about this. They are all virgins, abstaining from the earthly pleasures of life, a big sacrifice, but half of them are still rejected. It wasn't enough. The lamps are what we do, how we shine. The oil is what makes the lamps shine. The more oil the better. Jesus tells us that we are the light of the world. The light we give from is the oil in our lamps.

Now connect this with the first reading which is from the Book of Wisdom. This is the key. In all that we do we should seek the Wisdom of God. Through Wisdom, we figure out the good works we need to do, and Wisdom is usually referred to as a woman. "She is easily found by those who seek her. He who rises early to seek her will have no difficulty, for he will find her sitting at his gates."

What is the one thing that we all know is so important, but if you are anything like me, you don't do as well as we should? This is morning prayers. Seek the Lord each morning. Start and plan your day around Him. That personal relationship Jesus desires to have with us is found in seeking Lady Wisdom. We are all called to this deep personal relationship with Jesus and only through prayer can we do this.

Through prayer comes wisdom, the truth of God himself. Your personal relationship with Jesus lies in the wisdom we obtain through prayer. Contemplating on God, figuring out how we can do His Holy Will, is how we find the path Jesus has exclusively for us. And each of us is different. It is personal for each of us. Only through prayer can we figure out the way to have enough oil for our lamps to shine before all.

Laudato Si': A Weekly Tip on Caring for Our Common Home

Consider installing LED lights at home. While LEDs cost more up front, they last far longer — up to 23 years. During that time, total operational cost for an LED is about \$38, compared with \$48 for CFLs and \$200 for incandescent bulbs. A big part of the savings is reduced electrical usage for the same brightness.

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

St. John Lateran is the pope's main church, serving as the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides. It has a rich history dating back to the fourth century when Constantine donated land from the Lateran family to build the first basilica. Over the centuries, it endured fire, earthquakes, and wars, but it remained the church for papal consecrations. In the 14th century, it was in ruins when the papacy returned to Rome from Avignon. Pope Innocent X commissioned the current structure in 1646, making it one of Rome's most impressive churches. The facade features 15 colossal statues, and beneath its high altar, Saint Peter's tradition holds that Saint Peter celebrated Mass on a small wooden table.

For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep. Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words.

GOSPEL: Matthew 25: 1-13

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.' Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

At the words that follow, up to and including "and became man", all bow.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

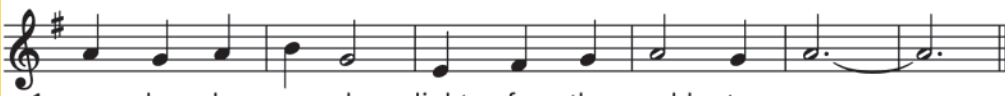

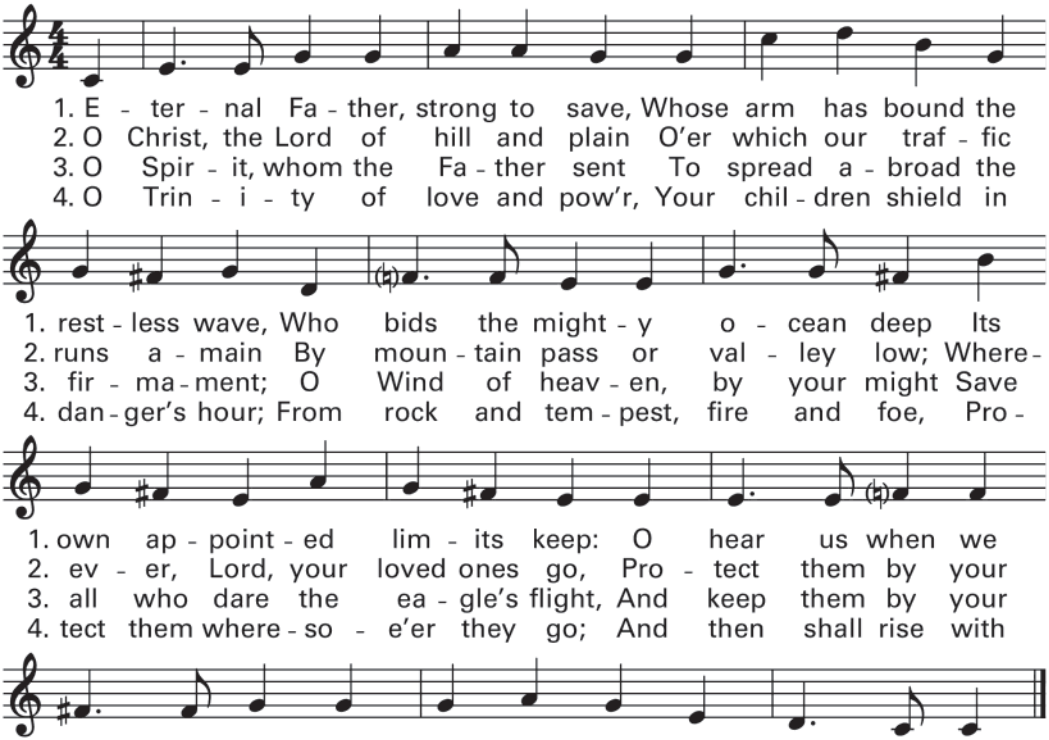

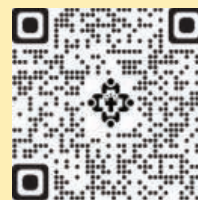
