Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe: November 26, 2023



This is the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. This Sunday we celebrate Jesus as the King of the Universe. This feast was established by Pope Pius XI on December 11, 1925, to support the Church's fight against the political and social ideologies of the modern world and restore Christ's sovereignty over the world. We conclude the cycle

A with the gospel of Matthew, and we will start cycle B with the gospel of Luke.

During this past year we explored the gospel of Matthew which teaches us that Jesus is the son of God. He is the promised Messiah. We thank God for giving us the possibility to share his words as a community and in many different aspects of our lives during this past liturgical year. Some of us had the opportunity and the blessing to attend church most Sundays this past year and some of us, because of some situations of our life, did not have a chance to do so. As we start the new liturgical year, let us ask the Lord to increase our faith and our desire to be good stewards in our community and our faith.

To celebrate Christ, King of the Universe, King of the Cosmos, is to place ourselves before Him, and before His greatness, to acknowledge our humanity and humility, in this great universe, of which we are an integral part.

The biblical texts for this Sunday present this King to us as a shepherd who gathers his flock. This is the message we heard from the prophet Ezekiel (1st reading). The King whom we celebrate on this day is presented to us as an attentive servant who puts himself at the service of the weakest while watching over the healthy sheep. This is how God never ceases to show us all his goodness.

Today's Gospel reminds us that the Kingship of Christ is that of the shepherd who devotes himself to each of his sheep. He is so close to the little ones and the excluded that they become the reflection of his love. The Lord truly presents Himself to us as "Lord," the one who has power. I was quite struck by what we are taught in the gospel: the Son of Man who comes in his glory, all the angels with him, and He sits on his throne of glory. Dom Dupont, an Abbot of Saint Peter Abbey, stated: "This description of Jesus defines the character of the Son of Man in three attributes which in the biblical and Jewish tradition qualify as the eschatological coming of God Himself." Father André Feuillet went a little further with a clear affirmation, "This is the strongest affirmation of the divinity of Jesus." All this to say that this passage from Matthew is not simply a little examination of philanthropy; it invites us to measure our actions with a certain seriousness before the very Mystery of God who created us.

This week will be Thanksgiving. Let us give thanks to God for giving us the gift of His life to redeem us. We are all so grateful for the gift of health and the gift of our time, treasures, and talents that we are called to share with Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish Community. We are so grateful for giving us people to love us and to care about us. We are grateful for giving us our places of worship so we can gather as a community in our own parish which we claim as our Spiritual Home. Praise the Lord for helping us overcome all the hardships in our lives so we can experience all His goodness to us and to our families. On this week of thanksgiving, I wish you all a blessed time with your family and friends. Remember Jesus is our King, and we are all Princes and Princesses in this world. We are called to express his love to all.

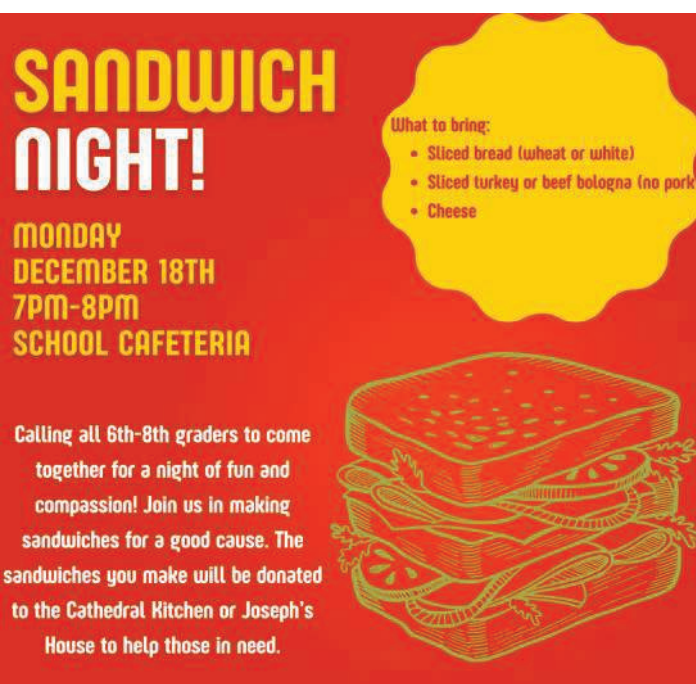

Greccio

In 1972, while residing in Assisi and writing a book about St. Francis, the author first visited the Franciscan shrine of Greccio, Italy. Greccio holds significance because it is where St. Francis initiated the tradition of the live Christmas crèche in 1223. The town, situated near Rieti, is considered the geographical center of Italy. St. Francis wanted to celebrate Christmas in a unique way, organizing a midnight Mass with real animals to convey the humility of God in becoming a vulnerable baby. The celebration aimed to show the proximity of God to people and encourage a personal connection with the Christmas story. The live crèche tradition has since spread globally. The article also emphasizes the transformative impact of St. Francis' meditation practices and his embodiment of Christ's love, evident in his living representation of the crucified Christ. Greccio symbolizes the grace of the Incarnation, highlighting the preciousness of humanity and the joy in God becoming one of us. The town, much like Giotto's artistic portrayal, brings the Nativity story to life in the context of 13th-century Italy, emphasizing the accessibility and relatability of Christ's birth in one's own place and time through the live Christmas crèche tradition. 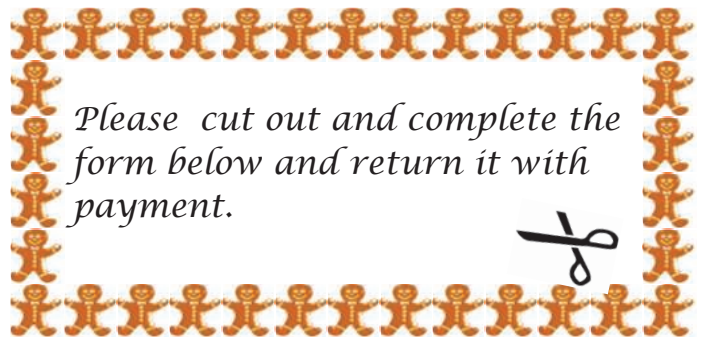

FIRST READING: *Ezekiel: 34:11-12, 15-17*

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly. As for you, my sheep, says the Lord GOD, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.*

SECOND READING: *1 Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28*

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first fruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

GOSPEL: *Matthew 25: 31-46*

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

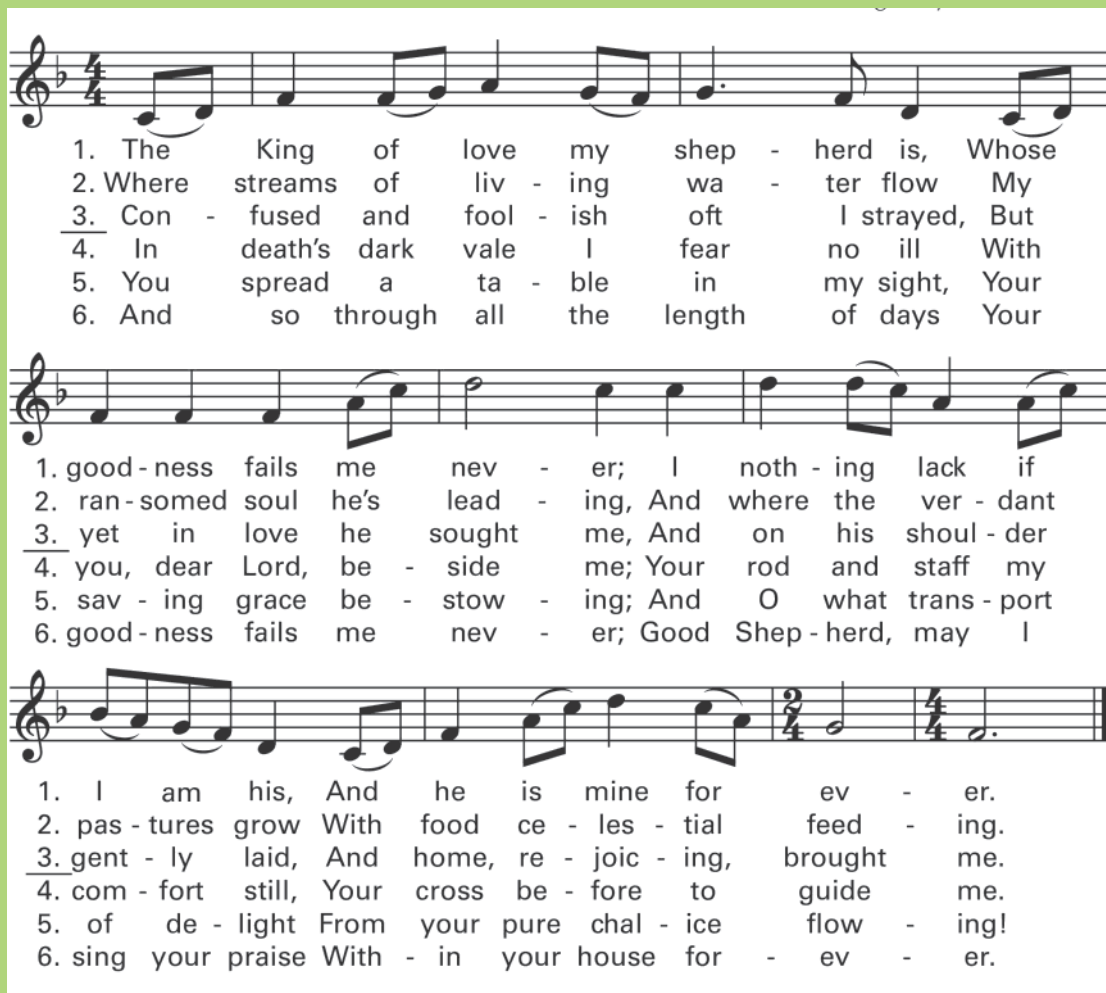

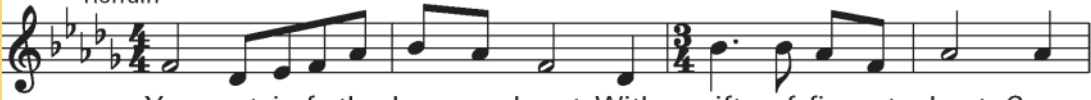
