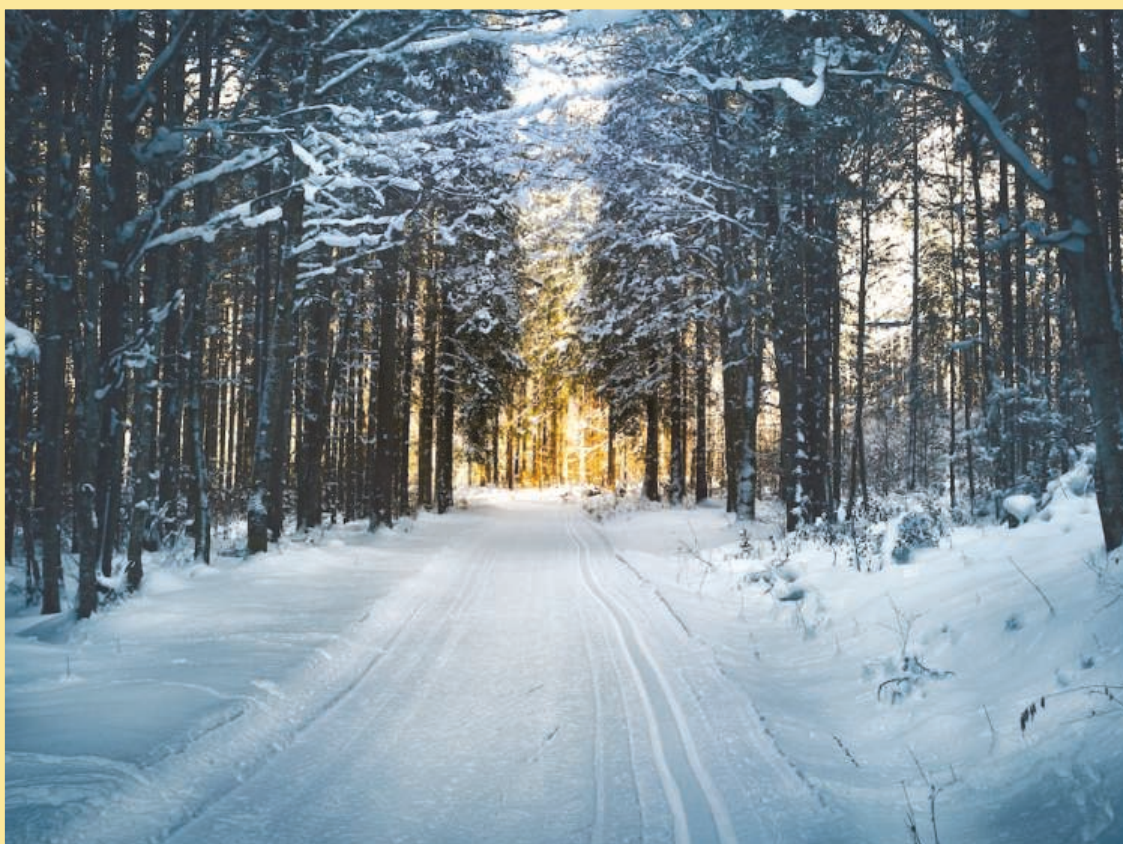

Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: January 14, 2024

In today's Gospel we hear about how Andrew, Peter and a third unnamed disciple became followers of Jesus. The unnamed disciple is believed by many to be the beloved disciple, Saint John, the writer of the Gospel of John.

The story begins with John the Baptist. Andrew and the unnamed disciple were disciples of John the Baptist. We usually think of John the Baptist as a loner in the wilderness, but we must remember he was rather famous. People were leaving the cities just to go out to see him. John preached about turning from sin, a baptism of repentance, and the coming of one much more powerful than himself. John had been waiting his whole life for the Messiah, and believed he would eventually meet him. Well, along comes Jesus one day and John baptized Him and to his wonder, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him like a dove. There is no longer any doubt. I think what he probably did was encourage his disciples to follow Jesus.

I think the whole time Andrew and his friend were with John, John probably kept telling them the Messiah was coming and they just had to be patient. He will be the one that they want to follow. Finally, the person whose sandals he is unworthy to loosen is right there! The search is over.

John liked to talk in riddles, so here is John being John. He could have just said, "Hey everybody! Here comes the Messiah," but he did not. I think he may have said this in code so only his disciples would know. So, he announced Jesus as the Lamb of God. After this John was calling Jesus the Bridegroom. Here also only those in John's circle knew it was a reference to Jesus. It would not have made sense to anyone else because Jesus was not married. Andrew and his friend knew when they heard their teacher say those words, "Behold, the Lamb of God" that Jesus was the Messiah and they quickly followed Jesus. They spent some time with Jesus and at about 4:00 pm Andrew knew this really was the Messiah, so he quickly excused himself and went to get his brother Simon. Simon came immediately and as soon as Jesus saw Simon, he renamed him Peter, meaning "the rock."

They might have thought life would be easy now that they are with Jesus, but not always. So many people in Jesus' life came and went. Remember when Jesus was talking about eating His Body and drinking His Blood? So many people up and left; they thought he was crazy. But Peter said to Him, "To whom else can we go? You have the words of everlasting life." They were in this for the long haul. They were the true believers. But as loyal as they were at the crucifixion, Peter "the rock," abandoned Jesus, so they were far from always perfect followers. They had to figure out that Jesus was a man on a mission and the mission was to do the Holy Will of the Father. Jesus was loyal to His Father always, and for them to be good disciples, they must also do the Will of the Father.

Think of how blessed they were after the crucifixion, but they had great fear. They were locked in that upper room for fear their lives would be taken by the Romans. The fear and the depression that they had were wrong and so was John the Baptist, but only a few days later it was Easter Sunday. Jesus always gets us through, no matter what! Soon after this, the disciples would be baptized with fire, just as John the Baptist kept telling them. The story is absolutely fascinating, and it continues today.

For us - God leads us just as He led these disciples to Jesus. If we really reflect on our lives we have all had life-changing moments just as they had. We may not have had someone proclaim, "Behold the Lamb of God" to show us the way, but God definitely put events in our lives that have completely changed the trajectories.

Think about it: your wife or daughter is pregnant. This news may be a shock and you wonder how you are going to handle this, but in the end that child may be the greatest blessing you ever had. You lose your job and have no idea what to do, and soon after you have a job doing exactly what you truly love. Your boyfriend or girlfriend broke up with you and you are devastated but you soon find the person of your dreams.

God is Love! If you keep your faith in Him and keep looking for Him, He will lead you exactly where you should be going so that you are always doing the Will of the Father, just like Jesus, just like the disciples.

Today at Mass think of this at the Lamb of God. We are disciples, just as they were and if you think about it each of us has some pretty incredible stories also! God Bless!

St. Anthony of Padua (1195-1231)

Feast Day: January 17th

St. Anthony of Padua dedicated his life to following the gospel call of leaving everything to serve Christ. His journey began as a young man when he joined the Augustinians in Lisbon, forsaking wealth and power for a life of service to God. Filled with a longing to be close to Jesus, he later entered the Franciscan Order with the intention of preaching to the Moors. However, an illness prevented him from realizing this goal, leading him to Italy, where he spent his time in prayer, Scripture study, and menial tasks.

St. Anthony's humility and obedience stood out when he accepted the unexpected task of speaking at an ordination, delivering an astounding sermon that showcased the Spirit's power. Renowned for his prayer life and theological knowledge, he became the first friar to teach theology to his peers. His mission to preach to the Albigensians in France demonstrated his ability to use his deep understanding of Scripture and theology to convert those who had been led astray. After leading friars in northern Italy, he settled in Padua, where he continued preaching and writing sermon notes. In his final days, St. Anthony withdrew to a hermitage, praying and preparing for death. He passed away in Padua on June 13, 1231, and was canonized less than a year later, eventually being named a Doctor of the Church in 1946.

How does St. Anthony of Padua's decision to leave a life of wealth and power to serve God inspire you in your own journey of faith?

In the face of illness and challenges, St. Anthony found a way to continue serving God. How can we approach obstacles in our lives with a similar sense of perseverance and trust in God's plan?

FIRST READING: 1 Samuel 3: 3b-10,19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 6: 13c—15a, 17-20

Brothers and sisters: The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. GOSPEL: John 1: 35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

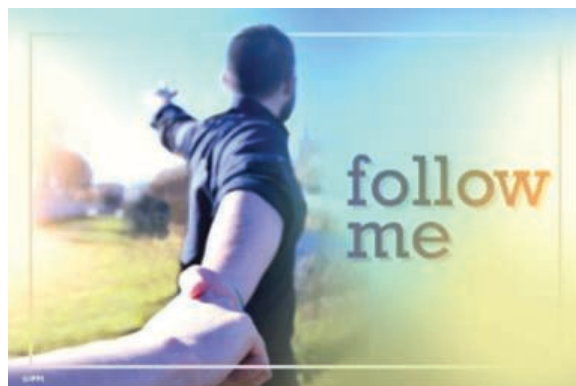
