Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time: January 28, 2024

In the first reading from the book of Deuteronomy, we heard an old episode that reminded us of what happened at Sinai in the time of Moses: The people were gathered at the bottom of the mountain; they heard the voice of God speaking to Moses. His heart was torn between wonder and fear. In the end, fear won out. "I no longer want to hear the voice of God," he said, "because I don't want to die." God responded by announcing the coming of a prophet, a man who will not speak in his own personal name but in the name of God; a man who will speak the very words of God.

The text of Deuteronomy specifies that this man must not speak any words other than those which come from God. We might wonder why it was certain in providing this clarification. In fact, you should know that this text was written much later to warn the people against false prophets. In Jeremiah's time, there were many fine talkers, "What they preach is only a vision of their imagination. Their words were not of the Lord." (Jer. 23:16).

The true prophet is the one who is the spokesperson for God before others. Throughout the Old Testament we see prophets reminding the people of Israel that they are the people of the covenant. They denounce ruptures and transgressions. They call people to conversion. Through our Baptism and Confirmation, we are called to become prophets by transmitting the Word of God to others. Saint Paul insists on this point. He tells us that we must "be undividedly attached to the Lord." Elsewhere, he reminds us that "time is limited." This message is a response to very concrete questions that Christians of his time were asking themselves. He specifies that wanting to please your husband or wife is good, but the most important thing is not to forget the affairs of God. This is a top priority for every Christian. This call applies to us today.

There are many things that come before "God's affairs," before prayer, before Sunday mass, before registering a child for catechism. We all have to convert to the One who gives all meaning to our life. Our mission is to be faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ.

The Gospel for this Sunday reveals to us that Jesus is this prophet announced by Moses. He is a powerful prophet in words and actions. Saint Mark tells us, "He taught as someone who had authority." He does not just repeat what he has studied. He speaks with the authority of God.

The Church today has received the mission of proclaiming this word of God. In a world chained by hatred, violence, selfishness, and insecurity, the preaching of Jesus is more necessary than ever. This world needs to hear a word that liberates and gives hope. We are all sent to shout the good news in season and out of season.

If we want to be messengers of the good news, our whole life must be imbued with this love which is in God. To do this, we begin by nourishing ourselves with the Word of God and by letting ourselves be transformed by it.

As before in the synagogue, the same Jesus joins us in all our churches, our ministries and our own personal life. He makes us hear his Word every day at mass. He comes to free us from all our possessions. Let us open ourselves to the Word which heals us. With him, our actions and our whole life will become consistent with his words. By welcoming the liberating Christ, we can be freed from everything that prevents us from following Christ. Blessed Sunday to you all!

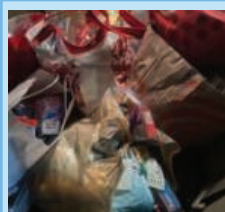

St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest and Doctor, 1225-1274

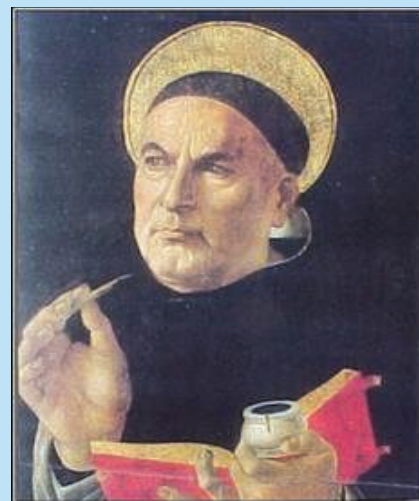
Feast Day: January 28

Patron Saint of: students, schools, colleges, and universities

Thomas was the son of a count and a relative of both the Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire and the King of France. At the age of five, his parents sent him to the Benedictine Monastery at Monte Cassino to be educated in the hope that he would eventually become the abbot there.

In about 1239, the Benedictines sent Thomas to the University of Naples to complete his education. He disappointed both the Benedictines and his family by joining the Dominicans at Naples in 1244. This move was so strongly opposed by his family that they had him kidnapped and held him in the family castle for over a year in an attempt to dissuade him. Thomas persisted, however, and after more studies in Paris and Cologne with St. Albert the Great, he was ordained around 1250.

Continuing his studies, Thomas Aquinas became a master of theology. He then moved on to teaching and writing, first in Paris and then at Naples, Rome, Orvieto, Anagni, and Viterbo. It was during this period, from 1259 to 1268, that Thomas began his greatest opus, the Summa Theologica, a work that deals with Catholic theology in its entirety.



Although Thomas drew a sharp distinction between faith and reason, he emphasized that the fundamental Christian doctrines, though impossible to establish by reason, are not contrary to reason and reach us by revelation. Nevertheless, he believed that such truths as the existence of God—as well as God's eternity, creative power, and providence—can be discovered by natural reason.

Thomas Aquinas is considered the preeminent spokesman for the Catholic tradition of reason and of divine revelation. His writings are required study for all theological students even to this day. He was canonized a saint in 1323 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V in 1567.

Thomas Aquinas was a theologian of unparalleled insight. For hundreds of years, his writings have been the basis for almost all theological study. While not everyone would want to delve into the writings of Aquinas, all Catholics should strive to learn more about the teachings and traditions of the Church.

Spend some time learning about the Catholic faith. Check the U.S. Catechism of the Catholic Church, your parish library, or a religious book store to see what is available there.

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 18: 15-20

Moses spoke to all the people, saying: "A prophet like me will the LORD, your God, raise up for you from among your own kin; to him you shall listen. This is exactly what you requested of the LORD, your God, at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, 'Let us not again hear the voice of the LORD, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die.' And the LORD said to me, 'This was well said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it. But if a prophet presumes to speak in my name an oracle that I have not commanded him to speak, or speaks in the name of other gods, he shall die.'"

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.*

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35

Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties. An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided. An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband. I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

GOSPEL: Mark 1: 21-28

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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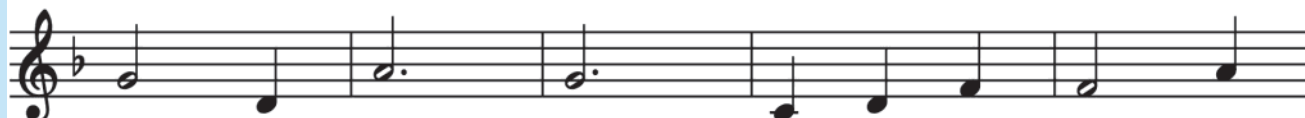
