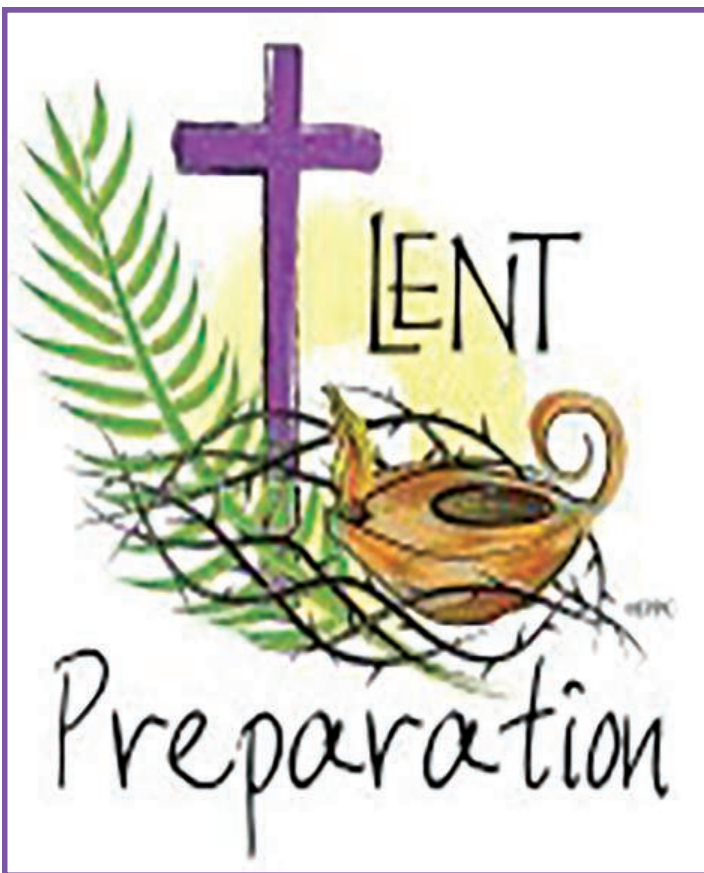

Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time: February 11, 2024

In the Gospel today we have the story of a leper who approached Jesus and asked him to be healed. Three words describe the lives of a leper: discrimination, isolation, abomination. They were severely discriminated against and told to wear rags, to never approach anybody and to warn anybody coming close by yelling out, “unclean, unclean.” They were isolated, cast out and sent to live far away from anybody, even their family, and they were considered an abomination, believed to have committed a sin so horrible that God was cursing them. Spiritually so many thought they had no hope, rejected by God himself.

The leper in this story was breaking a big rule, and it could have resulted in him being severely punished, if not killed. Lepers were never to approach a healthy person, but I see this differently. I see him as having great faith. Even his words are a demonstration of faith: “If you wish, you can heal me.”

Jesus is teaching us the greatest commandment: Love God with all your mind, heart and soul, and your neighbor as yourself. Jesus is showing the extremes of this commandment. Mother Teresa cared for many people who were poor, sick and dying and cared for them as if they were family. She also operated a foundation that took care of lepers. The Spirit of God led her to do amazing things!

One person who really lived this Gospel was St. Damian of Molokai. He came to love and die for the people in his community, who happened to be lepers. Father Damian was born Jozef De Veuster of Belgium in 1840. He was raised on a farm until he was 19 years old and joined a religious order. He wanted to be a priest but did not have the book smarts. He was just a simple farm boy, but he never gave up and eventually he did become a priest.

He was sent to Hawaii to do missionary work and, at the time, leprosy was sweeping the islands. The Hawaiian people had been isolated from outsiders for at least five hundred years. When European explorers arrived, they brought with them leprosy along with smallpox.

Damian saw bounty hunters rounding up people who were infected, rich and poor alike, taking them away from their families and their homes and sending them to a remote isolated location on one of the islands. Ships would just drop them off and they had to fend for themselves. There were no houses, no shelter of any kind. They were completely abandoned.

The Church wanted to send missionaries to care for these people on a rotational basis and Damian was the first to go. He was there for about a week and saw how bad the conditions were. I am sure he did not like being there. It was a very sad, lawless place where death was all too common. The smell of rotting flesh was so strong he took up smoking a pipe to deal with it.

Damian realized something; he was not the smartest priest by any means but the skills he learned from being a farm boy could come in handy so he could do a lot of good in this community. He requested to remain there permanently. He knew it would mean never seeing his family again and probably dying from leprosy himself, but this was exactly where Jesus needed him.

He created a sense of law and order. He built houses for the people, showed them how to farm and take care of animals. He also built hundreds of coffins and dug over a thousand graves. With whatever government money he was given he built orphanages, schools, and hospitals. He also is said to have walked about ten miles every day to visit his patients who were bed ridden.

The people accepted and loved him, just as he loved them. Many were baptized. He wanted to show he was there with them and one with them so he let some of his personal boundaries slide and shared common items with them. Eventually he contracted leprosy himself and he said, “I make myself a leper with the lepers to gain all to Christ.”

For not being very book smart, this sounds just like St. Paul, “I make myself all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some.” Saint Paul also said, “Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible.”

God many times uses us to do His will in answering prayers. I see Father Damian as being an answer to the prayers of hundreds of lepers in this colony. He saw his calling and it has been said that as depressing as the colony was he was known to be joyful every day. When you have the Spirit of God, this is how you are. When you love what you do, you can’t help but be happy even in such horrible conditions.

When I started writing this reflection, I thought that Jesus touching the leper was an extreme example of loving your neighbor, and it is,. However, I do not recommend touching anyone with an infectious disease. But Saint Damian lived this Gospel, and he did just that. He gave up his life for that of his friends.

You live all the Laws in Scripture by simply obeying the two Laws Jesus gave us: “Love of God and Love of Neighbor.” It is amazing how deep it goes and amazing that if you listen to the Holy Spirit, it will lead you to people that really need you, and when you listen to the Spirit, you will do everything with a happy heart.

Listening to that voice is going to lead us to Jesus in others, and if you have the Spirit, it will remove all traces of fear and confusion. Think of Saint Peter. After Pentecost, he was a completely different person. Instead of denying Jesus at the crucifixion, with the Spirit he never backed down again and he became “The Rock,” in the end, accepted his fate just as Jesus did and so many of his friends.

Lenten Days of Fast and Abstinence

Days of Fast

Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound to the mandate to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting entails eating one “normal” meal and two smaller meals.

Days of Abstinence

Catholics ages 14 and up are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays during Lent.

Sacristans Needed

We are currently short one sacristan and our regular ones are filling in taking extra masses. 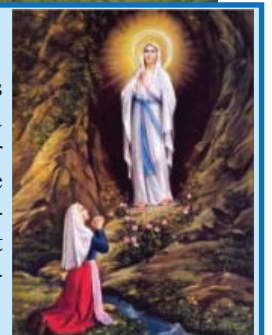

St. Bernadette

St. Bernadette Soubirous, born into poverty in Lourdes, France, on January 7, 1844, faced early challenges with poor health, which persisted throughout her life. At the age of 14, Bernadette encountered a vision of a beautiful lady at the Massabielle grotto, later identified as the Virgin Mary. Despite skepticism from her family and the community, she faithfully visited the grotto, experiencing a series of apparitions known as the "holy fortnight." The Virgin Mary instructed Bernadette to drink from the spring, leading to miraculous healings. Facing scrutiny, Bernadette's authenticity was later confirmed, and she entered the Sisters of Charity at Nevers, embodying humility and sacrifice until her death on April 16, 1879. Miraculously, her body remained incorrupt, contributing to her canonization by Pope Pius XI in December 1933.

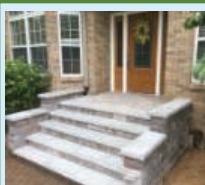

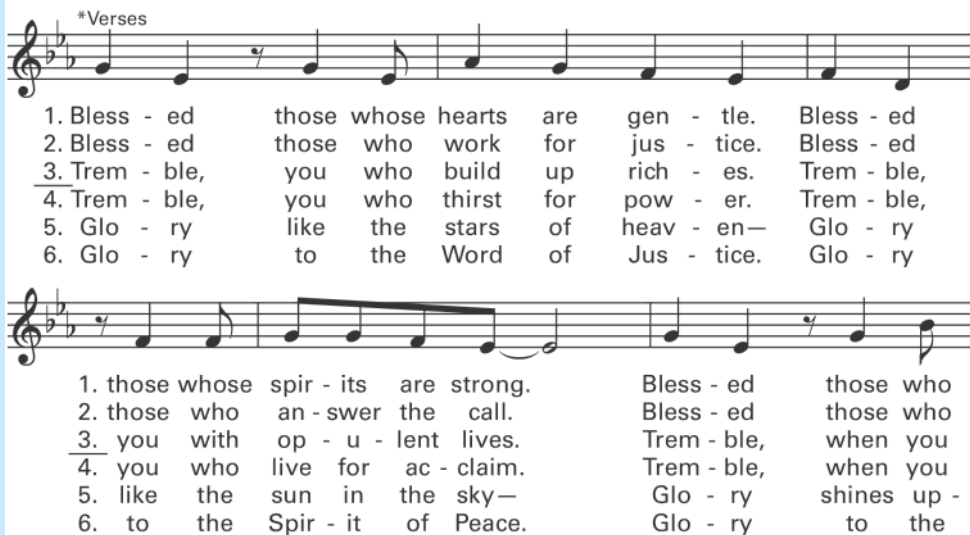

FIRST READING: Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, “If someone has on his skin a scab or pustule or blotch which appears to be the sore of leprosy, he shall be brought to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests among his descendants. If the man is leprous and unclean, the priest shall declare him unclean by reason of the sore on his head. “The one who bears the sore of leprosy shall keep his garments rent and his head bare, and shall muffle his beard; he shall cry out, ‘Unclean, unclean!’ As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is in fact unclean. He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp.”
