First Sunday of Lent: February 18, 2024

We enter another season in the Church. As you may see it, the colors once again change and there are some restrictions in the liturgy. This is the reason we don't sing Alleluia. Lent is a moment of fasting, a moment of reconciliation to prepare ourselves to celebrate Easter which is the resurrection of the Lord. As we may observe it, Lent always begins with a gospel on the Temptation of Jesus in the wilderness.

The Church assigns temptation stories to the beginning of Lent because temptations come to everybody. We seem almost genetically programmed to surrender to them. We are surrounded by all kinds of temptations. They have become so familiar to twenty-first century life that we barely notice them or label them as temptations.

Lent leads us to forty days of fasting and prayer. The number "forty" was the Hebrew way of expressing a long period of time. We find it used in the recounting of various incidents in Jewish history: a) forty days of rain in Noah's time, b) forty days which Moses spent on the mountain with God (Ex. 34:28), c) forty days during which the prophet Elijah traveled in the wilderness (II Kg. 19:8). *The wilderness* was probably a desert in Judea, perhaps the great deserts of Horeb or Sinai, where the children of Israel were tried for forty years, and where Moses and Elijah fasted forty days.

The gospel reading today gives us a way to understand our lives as followers of Christ and to be vigilant, to stay watchful, not let us be taken by the evil spirit. If the devil did not have any fear to challenge Jesus who is the ultimate Divine Son of God, for us it is worse. With prayer and faith in God, Jesus did not let himself be taken by devil's offer and challenges. During this Lenten Season let us ask God for the grace to stay vigilant and always be attentive to his word.

May we be faithful and obedient to God in all kinds of trials of life. In the desert of life, we come to know ourselves, our strengths and weaknesses, and our divine calling. May we understand that this Lenten season is a time to improve our relationship with God, set aside a place and time to increase and improve our prayer life. May God continue to help us to be distanced ourselves and from the many noises and voices that bombard our lives every day.

Let us ask the Lord for the grace and strength to hear his voice and open our hearts to follow him. We have so many spiritual activities the parish council and I created so we can live the Lenten season with a fervent faith. You are strongly encouraged to support them and to make them part of your Lenten desert experience. Do not hesitate to be part of our Friday Evening Lenten retreat in which we invite a different speaker to give us some Lenten Spiritual Boosters Talks. It is a time to reconcile with the Lord. Every Wednesday night confession is available at Saint John Church. Each year the season of Lent is given to us as a time when we can take stock to go further in our spiritual journey.

Let the Lenten journey be nourished by the Word of God and the actions that the Church offered us on Ash Wednesday: prayer, almsgiving and fasting. May this season of Lent, as the opening prayer of this First Sunday said so well: "Grant Almighty God, through the yearly observance of Holy Lent, that we may grow in understanding of the riches hidden in Christ and by worthy conduct pursue their effects".

Lenten Days of Fast and Abstinence

Days of Fast

Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound to the mandate to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting entails eating one "normal" meal and two smaller meals.

Days of Abstinence

Catholics ages 14 and up are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays during Lent.

Sacristans Needed

Additional sacristans are needed to set up for our weekend Masses at both churches, Holy Saviour and St. John's on a regular basis or as a substitute. Training will be provided.

We are currently short one sacristan and our regular ones are filling in taking extra masses. 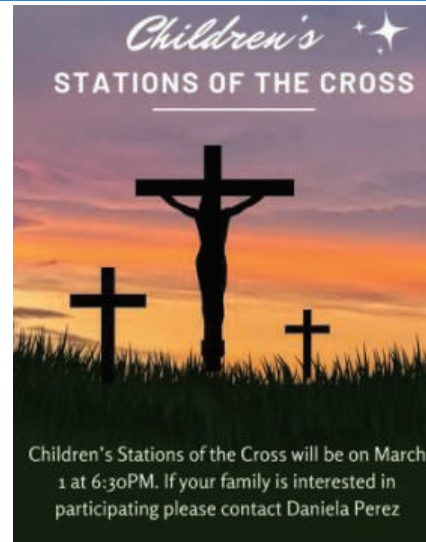

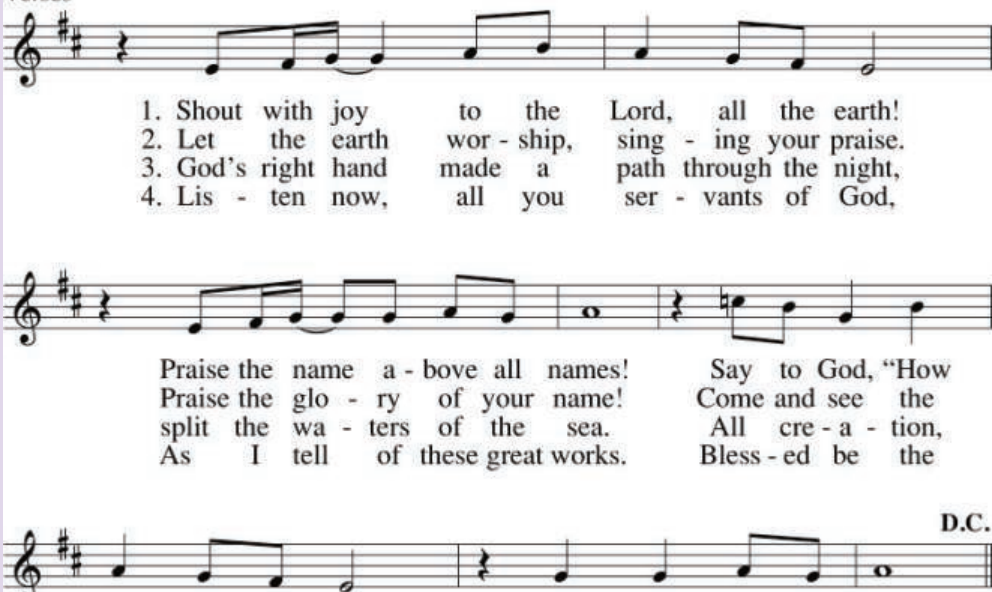

FIRST READING: Genesis 9: 8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth." God added: "This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."

PSALM: *Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant.*

SECOND READING: 1 PETER 3: 18-22

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

GOSPEL: Mark 1: 12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. 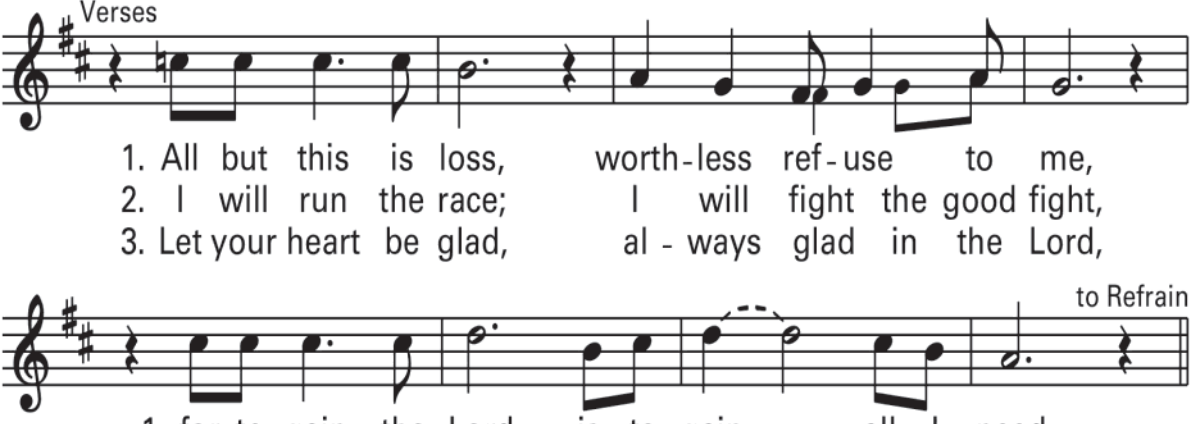

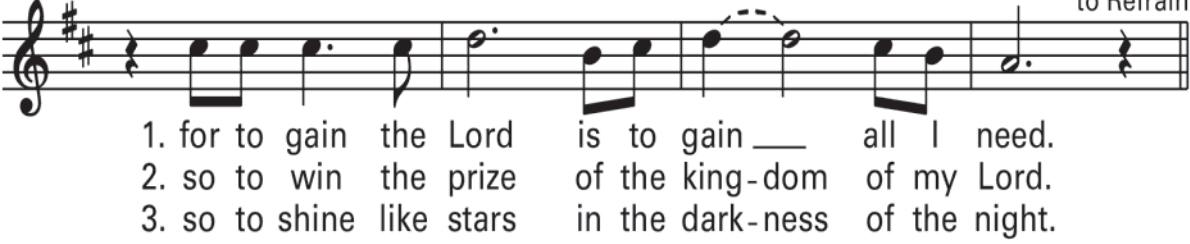
