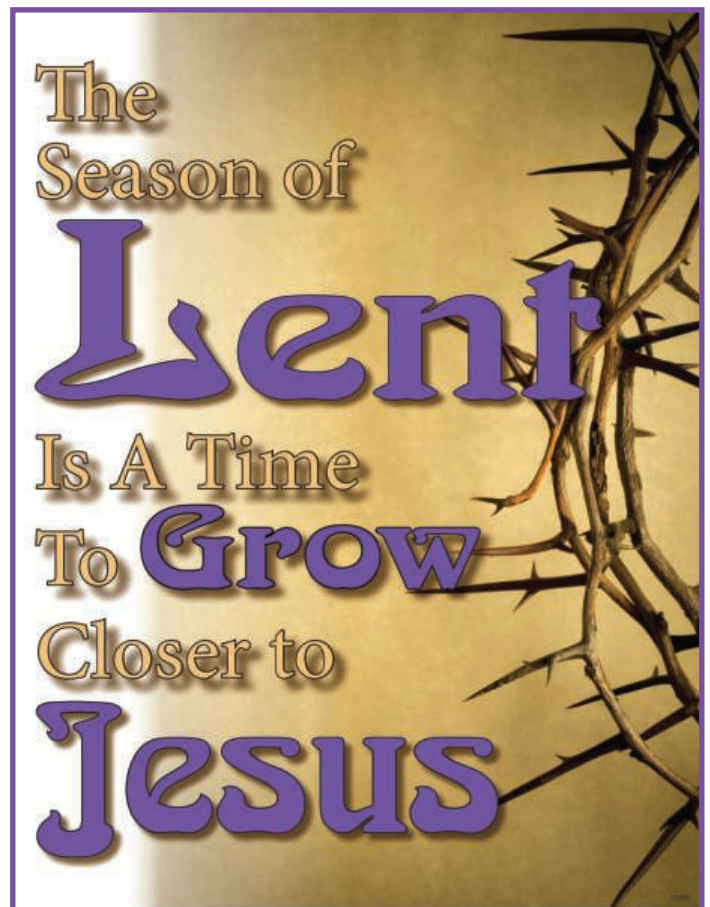
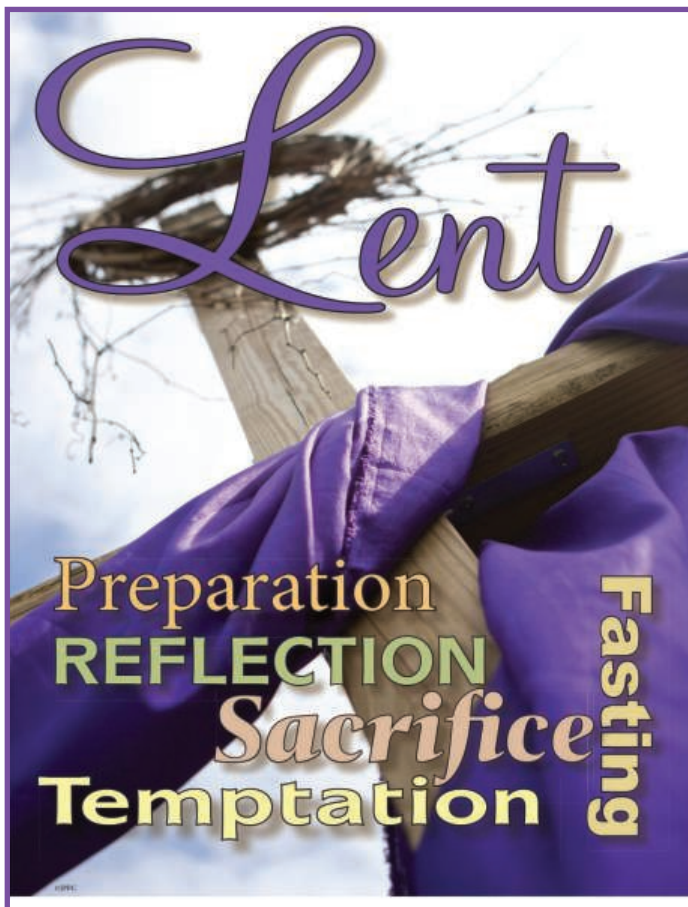

Second Sunday of Lent: February 25, 2024

Last Sunday we witnessed Jesus' fight in the "desert of Temptation", a hard fight at the start of Lent. Today we are led to another place, so different from the harshness of the desert, like a place of happiness and revelation, which we could call the "Mountain of Truth"! Mountain of Truth is when we believe in this astonishing word: This is my beloved Son, in whom I find my joy: listen to him!

The Church identifies this voice with that of God the Father. It is a truth of faith, the fruit of trust in the testimony of the Church, of Scripture, and also of the lives of others, of our own experience. Here we are at the heart of the Christian faith, of faith in the Triune God, even if the Holy Spirit is not explicitly present in this Gospel, as it is in the theophany of the Baptism of Jesus.

We continue to experience Jesus in a different aspect of his relationship with God the Father. This weekend's gospel brings us a story about the illumination of Jesus on a mountaintop in the presence of his closest disciples, Peter, James, and John. Tradition tells us that this mountaintop was Mount Tabor. The "mountain" is a special place in the Bible. This is how some Bible translations attribute the name of God, as God of the Mountain, "El Shaddai".

Many great events happen on the mountain where the Lord speaks to his people such as Abraham who ascends to Mount Moriah to sacrifice his son which is in the first reading for this Second Sunday of Lent (Genesis 22). Moses met with God and received the Ten Commandments on the Mount Sinai (Exodus 20). Elijah went to the mountain top also known as Horeb to listen to the voice of God (1 Kings 18). The illumination of Jesus has traditionally been interpreted as a light from heaven to show divine approval of his mission after he has just announced to his disciples that "the Son of Man must suffer greatly" (Mark 8: 31).

During this beautiful experience of the mountaintop, the disciples had received the confirmation of Jesus as the Son of God while the voice of God spoke to them directly saying "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him". These words are directed to each one of us. We must take these words very seriously and consider the implications of such a command from God. This surely must mean that we, too, are expected to "visit the mountain of our own Transfiguration, where we can be "illuminated" as Jesus did, because we love and care for others. We may think that this means nothing but self-denial, but the fact is that those who seek the happiness of others more than their own satisfaction turn out to be the happiest people of all.

This does not mean becoming a doormat or catering to obsessive defendants, but it does mean that we are sensitive to others and truly committed to their welfare. This daily "dying" leads to an ultimate resurrected life. It is also an excellent way to keep the spirit of Lent shining into the world.

May God help each and every one of us to experience our own divine "mountain top", so we may reflect the beauty of Jesus' divine life to those around us in our daily life.

Lenten Days of Fast and Abstinence

Days of Fast

Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound to the mandate to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting entails eating one "normal" meal and two smaller meals.

Days of Abstinence

Catholics ages 14 and up are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays during Lent.

We are currently short one sacristan and our regular ones are filling in taking extra masses. 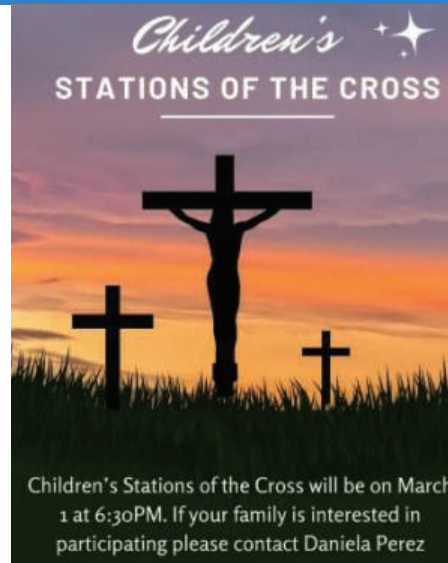

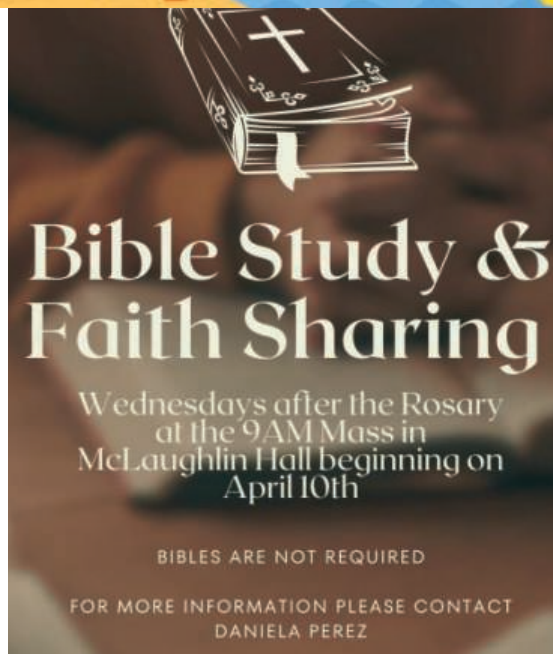
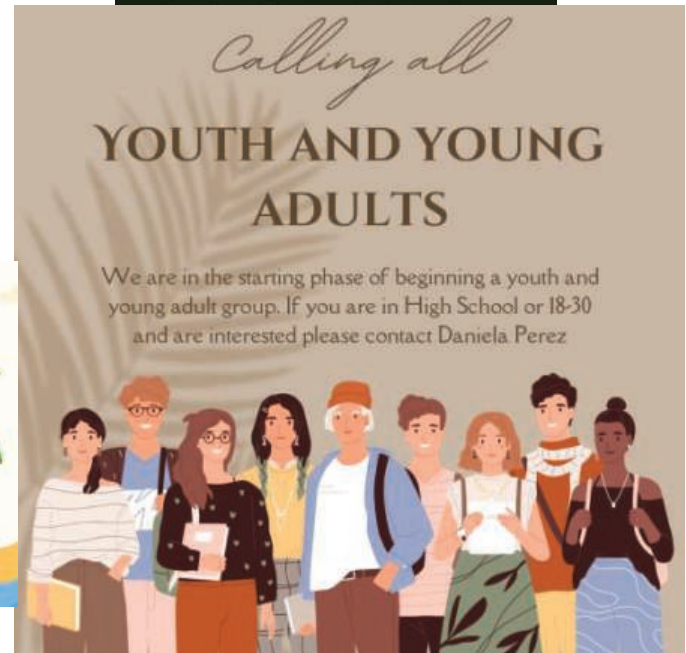

FIRST READING: Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you." When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son. Again the LORD's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing— all this because you obeyed my command."

PSALM: *I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.*

SECOND READING: Romans 8: 31b—34

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn? Christ Jesus it is who died—or, rather, was raised—who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

GOSPEL: Mark 9: 2-10

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain,
he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone,
except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead.
So they kept the matter to themselves,
questioning what rising from the dead meant.
