Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Second Sunday of Easter: April 7, 2024

On this Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, we see the early church embodying God's merciful love. The believers were "of one heart and mind," full of energy and hope. "There was no needy person among them." So great was their conviction of Christ's resurrection that they lived their faith openly, joyously, with great generosity and care for the poor. Their belief was strong, authentic, and fearless. And people believed in Christ because of their words and actions.

But we also hear of a slightly earlier time when things were not quite so clear. John's Gospel shows us those first days when the apostles were not out in the streets, bearing witness to the Lord with great power. They were not pooling their resources to help those in need. Rather, they were in a locked room, afraid of the same authorities that have given Jesus over to death. We hear that Jesus appears and "showed them his hands and his side." The disciples rejoice but, curiously, a week goes by and they are still in a locked room. We then meet Thomas, who missed Jesus' first appearance. Thomas goes out of his way to say he will not take his friends' word for Jesus' resurrection. Jesus enters the room and invites Thomas to touch his hands and his side. Once Thomas sees for himself, he is immediately convicted, going beyond mere rejoicing to a profound statement of faith: "my Lord and my God."

In Christian tradition and in our general culture, Thomas often serves as a useful cliché. When someone needs proof beyond what is given, we label him or her a "Doubting Thomas" and quite often it is used pejoratively, as if questioning or slowly coming to faith is an impediment to discipleship. Yet the reality is that Thomas was no different than the others in that room. They all believed because they had seen Jesus.

Jesus states, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." But is he criticizing Thomas or the very act of questioning? Or is he honest about the reality of the Christian message going forward? Jesus knew he was returning to his Father. His appearances would cease, yet the call to believe and follow him would continue. Indeed, for Christianity to grow and flourish, Jesus knew that people would *have* to start believing the testimony of others. But how would this happen once Jesus' appearances ceased? How would the testimony be believed? Jesus himself gives us the clue—look to the physical evidence. Jesus asked the disciples, and then again Thomas, to look at his hands and his feet, to note the hole in his side. And he asks it again of us each day.

For though we are no longer able to see the wounds in his hands and side, there is physical evidence all around us of Christ's suffering and Christ's victory. We only need to look at our immediate surroundings, perhaps within our own families or our own hearts, to see the physicality of Christ's presence—the heroic self-giving, the heartfelt compassion, the untiring service of others. We see the physical evidence of the resurrection, the certainty of the paschal mystery, every time we counter despair with hope, every time we bring light into a dark place. And when we have gauged our immediate surroundings or time, we can look to the whole body of work of the church, the long history of healing and care which began in that early community described in the Acts of the Apostles and extends to that great cloud of witnesses we call our Saints. It was the "many signs and wonders" that drew people to those early communities and it is the St. Teresa of Calcutta's or St. Marianne Copes, who continue to inspire us to greater living.

We can get caught up in our own heads, trying to make intellectual sense out of the miraculous event of the resurrection. And that is not wrong, for God gave us brains for a reason. But God also gave us eyes and hearts, and when faith feels murky and hard to grasp, we might want to look again at the flesh and blood realities of people living and dying for their faith. The Body of Christ lives! Christ moves among and within us each day reaching out to us with his Divine Mercy and asking us to live with that same merciful love.

Crafting the religious articles is the primary means for providing for the livelihood of Christian families in the Holy Land.

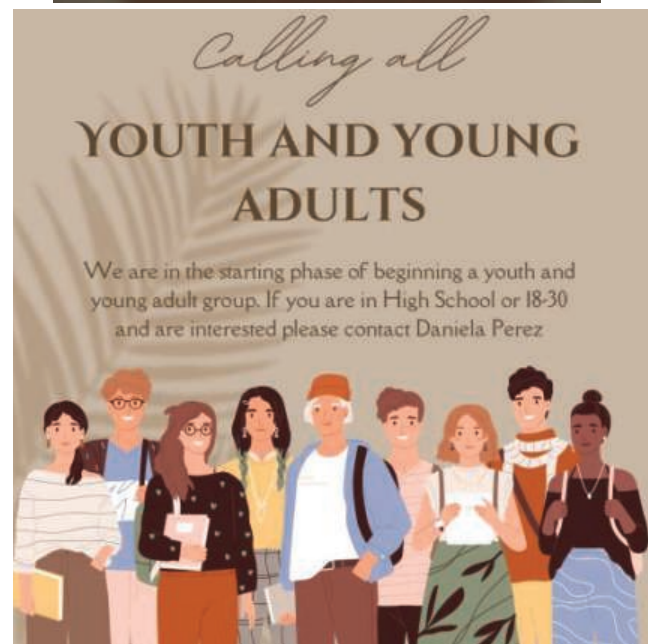

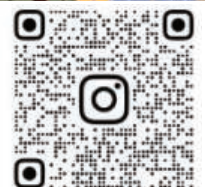

Saint of the Week: St. Stanislaus, Bishop & Martyr (Feast Day: April 11)

St. Stanislaus was a bishop and martyr known for his unwavering dedication to justice and righteousness. Born in Poland in the 11th century, he rose to prominence as Bishop of Kraków, where he fearlessly confronted the moral corruption of King Boleslaw II. Despite facing threats and intimidation, Stanislaus remained steadfast in his commitment to uphold the principles of faith and morality. Eventually, he was martyred for his convictions, becoming a symbol of courage and integrity for generations of Catholics. St. Stanislaus is remembered not only for his martyrdom but also for his profound influence on the spiritual and moral life of his time.

I am the *Resurrection*
and the *Life*

FIRST READING: Acts 4: 32-35

The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great favor was accorded them all. There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, his love is everlasting.*

SECOND READING: 1 John 5: 1-6

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one that testifies, and the Spirit is truth.

GOSPEL: John 20: 19-31

In the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
