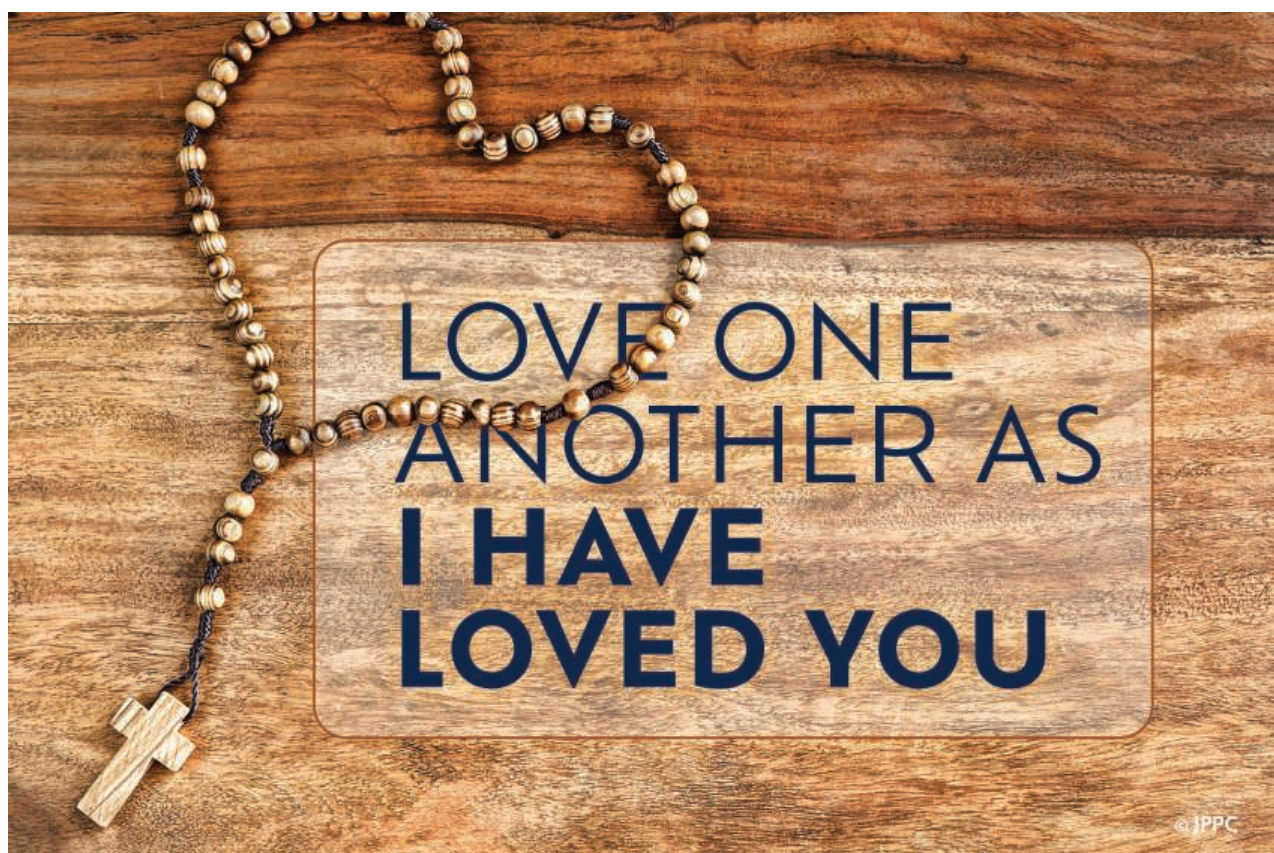

REFLECTION

Sixth Sunday of Easter: May 5, 2024

One of the more intriguing prayers I've heard through the years is a prayer asking forgiveness for our "lack of imagination." It took me a long time to understand why this lack would lead us towards sin. Today's readings help me to see it in a clearer light.

In the first reading, we hear a resolution of a continuing conflict in the early church: salvation also includes the Gentiles. Peter finally realizes that God is bigger than he imagined. "'In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him.'" What a sea change for Peter and for the early church! And how costly for them, for it meant leaving behind the outlines of the Jewish community they loved. They had to accept that God's plans involved a wider embrace, a larger vision, a more sensitive ear. God's plans outpaced their efforts. God's plans pulled them into a future they could never have imagined, towards people they could barely tolerate, let alone understand.

And that's where we can meet this prayer of forgiveness. For we all have those moments when fixed assumptions about others overwhelm any inroad for new insights. We have opinions and we don't want to change them. Sometimes they are clearly sinful, as when our prejudices contribute to the foul air of hatred in our world. But sometimes they are just limiting, as when we cannot accept the idea of change, whether it be in ourselves or those we love. We might refuse to see that harmful habits can be changed, that dead ends might lead to new avenues, that harsh words can be forgiven. We cast a blind eye towards potential. Our lack of imagination creates a cage that becomes more and more difficult to escape.

The reason that a lack of imagination can be the beginning of sin is that it is so far removed from our God who created this beautiful world. God imagined and it came to be. The sheer force of God's imagination brought life to the world. When we close our minds to the potential of ourselves or others we are actually inhibiting God's work. We are anti-growth, anti-hope, contributing to stagnation rather than creation.

Perhaps we hesitate to imagine because we are afraid of the unknown. And that's where we need to remember that God will be in our futures as much as in our present. We cannot outrun or out-dream God. In the letter to the Ephesians we hear that God "can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine" (3:20). Let us ask God to enlarge our minds and strengthen our faith so that we can perceive and accept the growth that is inherent to life. Like Peter and the early community, we can then become people who see the possibilities of a situation, rather than the problems. And as we exercise these muscles of imagination, we will bring hope and tolerance to a world greatly in need of both.

Saint of the Week: St. John of Avila (Feast Day: May 10) Patron Saint of Spanish Secular Clergy

Saint John of Avila was born in Spain and initially studied law before turning to philosophy and theology and eventually becoming a diocesan priest. After inheriting a fortune from his parents, he gave it to the poor and dedicated himself to spreading the faith in Andalusia. Despite facing scrutiny from the Inquisition for denouncing vice, he continued his work as a preacher and spiritual director, establishing colleges for young people. He had notable friendships with other saints and contributed to the growth of the Society of Jesus. Beatified in 1894, canonized in 1970, and declared a doctor of the Church in 2012.

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

SECOND READING: 1 John 4: 7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love. In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

GOSPEL: John 15: 9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
