Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Feast of the Ascension of the Lord: May 12, 2024

This Sunday we celebrate the Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. When Jesus returned to His Father, many people think that Jesus rose into the air and went off far beyond the stars. I don't think this is the case at all. I think Jesus is not far away from us at all. He is now as close to us as our skin, and this is the significance of this Feast. And the realization of this feast comes to us at Pentecost.

One of my favorite accounts of the Crucifixion is from the Gospels of Matthew and Mark. When Jesus died on that cross, at that exact moment the Veil of the Sanctuary was torn in two. Before the crucifixion, access to God was only granted by the high priest in the Temple. In the innermost part of the Temple, behind this very large, two-inch-thick veil was the Arc of the Covenant. It was said that the Arc contained so much power it was known to kill people who got too close, and the veil was there to protect people from its power. Once a year on the Day of Atonement, the high priest would go behind the curtain to burn incense and sprinkle the blood of sacrificial animals.

What they would do was tie a rope around his waist. This was done just in case he was struck down by the power of the Arc, they could pull the body back without risking any other lives. The significance of the Veil being torn in two gives me great joy because access to God is now open to all of us, all the time through the perfect sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross. I connect this to the Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. When Jesus ascended into Heaven, He did not go far away but He entered the Realm of Heaven.

I think of this as another dimension, something we cannot understand, but He sits at the Right Hand of the Father and He guides us. He helps us on our journey which will lead us right to Him when we die.

Think of what Jesus said to the apostles before He ascended: He told them to proclaim the Gospel, baptize all who believe, drive out demons, speak in new languages, pick up serpents, heal the sick and be immune of any poison. And what did the apostles do? They worked doing just as Jesus commanded. Jesus moved them exactly where He needed them, and they did all the things Jesus asked them to do. Some lived another thirty years. all but John died like Jesus; John died of old age. But after Jesus ascended into heaven and they received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, they did exactly what Jesus did.

Think about this, if Jesus was a fraud, would all of them devote their entire lives to Him and die for Him? No way! They baptized, taught the faith and after their death others picked up and continued their mission. This has been going on for 2,000 years. Jesus is the true vine making all things happen and we are the branches doing His Holy work. Jesus is so close to us and depends on His to do His will that He even considers us more than disciples, He thinks of us as His brother.

The Spirit of God is upon all of us through our Baptism and Confirmation, we are to do the work of Jesus, He guides us and communicates with us through prayer. Our job is to be like Jesus, be like the apostles and like the countless disciples that followed Jesus through the generations.

Here is my favorite part. When Jesus ascended into Heaven, He is with us every day, all day, and what He seeks from us the most is for us to have a relationship with Him. Jesus has a specific purpose for us here. I see Jesus as a master chess player, playing on an infinite chessboard. He moves us where He needs us, but He needs us to do our part. Just as Mary said yes to God, we should do the same. Just as Mary told the servants at Cana to "do whatever He tells you", (John2: 1-5) we should also do the same. He placed you someplace special and He has a job for you that only you can do.

Today with Jesus living in us as we share the Bread of Life together reflect on the path Jesus has laid before us. If you are not sure what that path is, reflect on that also. Through prayer we all find our way. Thank you, Jesus, for placing us where we are in this life, for leading our path. We ask for your help and support and we know that through you we will ultimately find our home with You. God Bless!

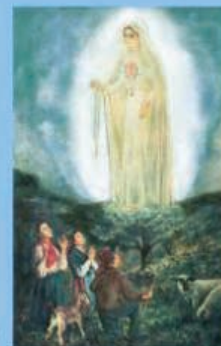
Our Lady of Fatima (Feast Day: May 13)

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto, and Lucia dos Santos—experienced apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima. Mary instructed them to pray the rosary for world peace, the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She also revealed three secrets to them.

After the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia disclosed the first secret in 1927, emphasizing devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Later in life, Lucia became a Carmelite nun and passed away in 2005 at the age of 97.

In 2000, Pope John Paul II instructed the Holy See's Secretary of State to unveil the third secret, which depicted a "bishop in white" being attacked by soldiers. Many connected this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in 1981.

Reflection: The message of Fatima is simple: Pray. Mary is perfectly honored when people generously imitate her response "Let it be done to me as you say" (Luke 1:38). Mary can never be seen as a rival to Jesus or to the Church's teaching authority, as exercised by the college of bishops united with the bishop of Rome.

FIRST READING: Acts 1: 1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. 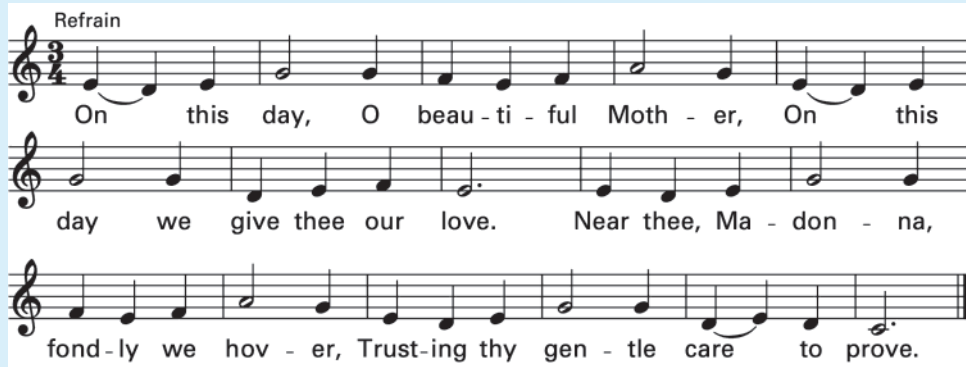
GOSPEL: Mark 16: 15-20

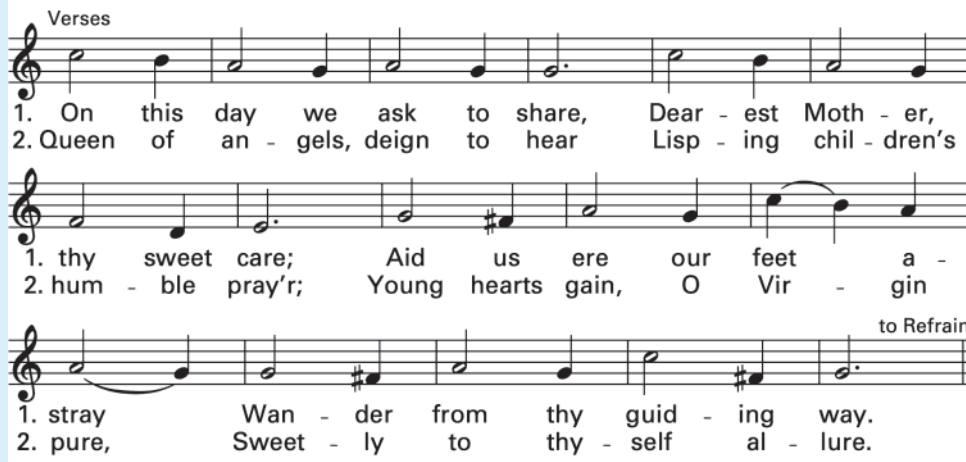
