I also read another interesting story about a little girl who asked her grandfather, "Did you and grandma ever get into any fights?" The grandfather replied: "We don't talk about it very often, but there was a time when we were not getting along very well. We seemed to be picking on each other a lot and finding all kinds of things to argue about and really getting on one another's nerves. Well, one day I came in from the garden and I heard a voice upstairs. I went to the stairs and heard your grandmother telling God what she could not bring herself to tell me." "Well, what did you do?" asked the granddaughter. "I quietly walked up the stairs," he replied, "and knelt down beside her and told God my side of the story. And from that day to this, we have never had a problem which we couldn't resolve by talking it over with each other and with God." Do you think the Holy Spirit was active in that couples' marriage? There can be no doubt. Conflict will always remain part of every relationship. The fruits of the Spirit – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control – will always remain critical for happy relationships with others.

On this day when the Most Holy Church, our mother, celebrates Pentecost, that is to say the descent of the Holy Spirit on the fiftieth day after Easter on the Apostles and on the whole group enclosed in the Cenacle, let us focus our meditation around the following theme: Let ourselves be guided by the Spirit who impels us to the mission: Announce peace, joy, forgiveness and salvation.

My beloved brothers and sisters, celebrating Pentecost is not celebrating a past event. It is realizing that the Spirit of God is still at work in the world and in each believer. Each of us, according to our status in the Church, is called to let ourselves be guided by the Holy Spirit who is "the soul of the mission" as Pope Francis emphasized it once. Without the Holy Spirit, no true mission is possible. Without the Holy Spirit, our mission will not be guided on the right path or in the clear direction.

The Holy Spirit remains unknown to many. We pray to God the Father, we pray to God the Son, we pray with the Virgin Mary, but few take the time to invoke the Holy Spirit who accompanies us daily in our daily Christian mission. Paul insists on the action of the Holy Spirit in each believer. It establishes the relationship between unity and diversity. The Holy Spirit is then a source of unity despite diversity of functions and activities which is the image of the Body with its different members.

Brothers and sisters, to be led and guided by the Holy Spirit, three conditions are necessary: First of all, know the Holy Spirit and what comes from Him; then listen to the Holy Spirit, that is to say: make room to welcome him by starting to be silent within ourselves; finally, act with promptness and peace according to what is requested.

Our knowledge of the Holy Spirit is realized within the Church, and through the Church; it is through the Church that we know the Holy Spirit! We receive the Holy Spirit, in and through the Church. Our knowledge of the Holy Spirit comes through reading Holy Scripture, the Bible, which He Himself inspired. The Holy Spirit also comes to us through the Tradition of the Church, the Fathers of the Church, the great spiritual figures; then, by the magisterium of the Church, that is to say by the teaching of the Pope and the bishops; through liturgical life, through prayer, through charisms, through the visible signs of missionary life, and through the witness of the saints of yesterday and today. We also recognize its fruits in us, and in others as described by the apostle Paul: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control".

Fulton J. Sheen once said about the Church, "Even though we are God's chosen people, we often behave more like God's frozen people; frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our faith." Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love.

Reflection on a Principle of Catholic Social Teaching Rights and Responsibilities

(St. John XXIII, Peace on Earth [Pacem in Terris], no. 30) When the dignity of the human person is respected, and his or her rights recognized and guaranteed, creativity and interdependence thrive, and the creativity of the human personality is released through actions that further the common good. 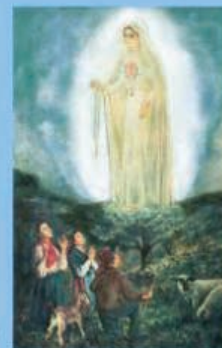
Our Lady of Fatima (Feast Day: May 13)

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto, and Lucia dos Santos—experienced apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima. Mary instructed them to pray the rosary for world peace, the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She also revealed three secrets to them.

After the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia disclosed the first secret in 1927, emphasizing devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Later in life, Lucia became a Carmelite nun and passed away in 2005 at the age of 97.

In 2000, Pope John Paul II instructed the Holy See's Secretary of State to unveil the third secret, which depicted a "bishop in white" being attacked by soldiers. Many connected this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in 1981.

Reflection: The message of Fatima is simple: Pray. Mary is perfectly honored when people generously imitate her response "Let it be done to me as you say" (Luke 1:38). Mary can never be seen as a rival to Jesus or to the Church's teaching authority, as exercised by the college of bishops united with the bishop of Rome.

FIRST READING: Acts 2: 1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. 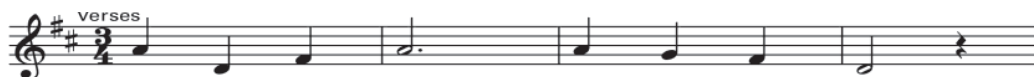

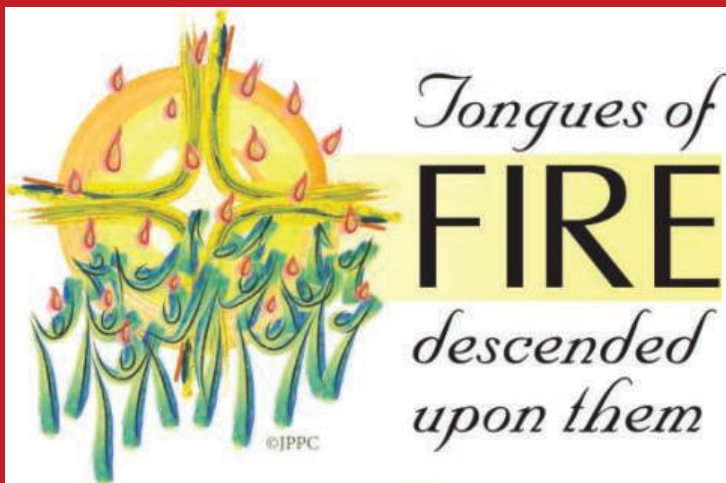

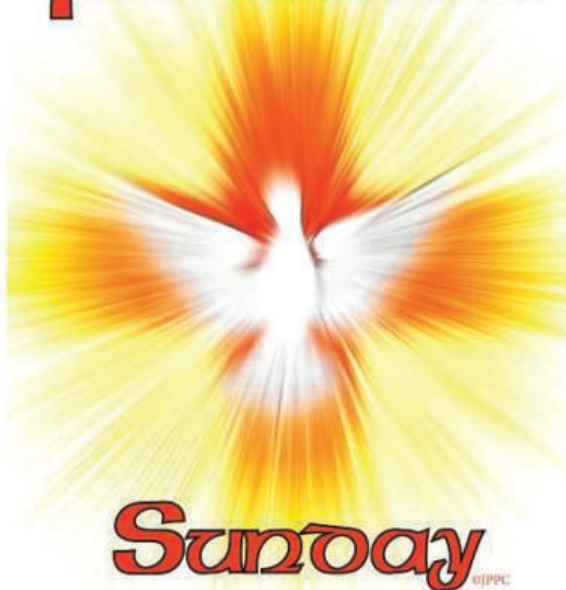
