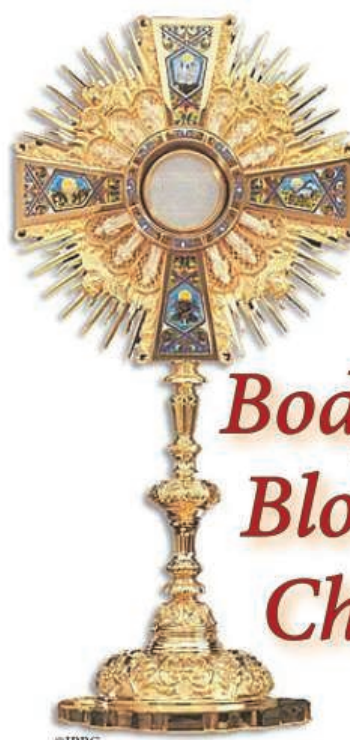

The Body and Blood of Christ: June 2, 2024

Today's Gospel tells the story of the Last Supper, the meal Jesus shared with his friends on the day before he died. This Passover meal, which he and his disciples would have celebrated each year of their lives, was a familiar ritual that told the story of the liberating power of God, saving the Hebrews from the Egyptians and settling them in a new land. However, Jesus enacted the ritual with new words surrounding the bread and the cup: "Take this, this is my body." And then, "this is the blood of the covenant which will be shed for many."

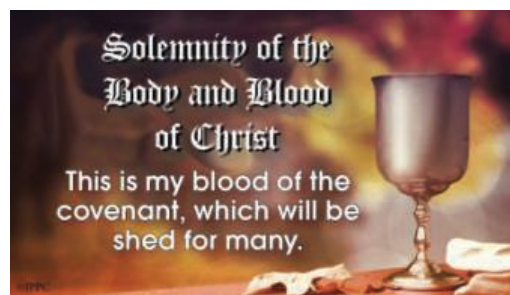
We do not know what the disciples thought about the changes to the prayer at the time. But after Jesus' death they began to understand his words more fully. Their growing understanding had to do with their experience of the risen Lord, for they perceived his presence in the "breaking of the bread." Thus the early Christians were motivated to gather together, to reenact Jesus' request to "do this in memory of me." They understood the importance of celebrating mass together. They never saw it as an obligation. It was a need. They *needed* to celebrate together because, through their words and actions, they experienced the risen Lord in their midst. Christ was present. And that continues to be our core belief today.

Today's Solemnity of Corpus Christi celebrates the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is a joyous feast because we are reminded that we are nurtured by the life of God. "The Gift of Finest Wheat" is our daily bread. Jesus tells us "for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." But just as we eat our everyday meals to stay healthy and strong, so we partake of this heavenly food so that we can be nourished and transformed. Thus the core beliefs about the Eucharist always included the *purpose* of the sacrament. St. John Chrysostom writes,

"Let us learn the wonders of this sacrament, the purpose of its institution, the effects that it produces. We become one body, says the scripture, members of his flesh, bones of his bones. That is what the food that he gives us effects: he joins himself to us that we may become one whole, like a body joined to its head."

Once fortified by the Body of Christ, we are gradually transformed into the Body of Christ in and for the world. As St. Teresa of Avila writes, "Christ has no body but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on the world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world." As we celebrate and partake of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, let us recommit to building our parish community into a place where people truly experience the loving touch of God. Fortified by this connection with the Lord and with each other, let us also strive to make Christ truly present to a world in need of the saving power of God.

Charles Lwanga and Companions, Martyrs (Feast Day: June 3) Patron of youth and Catholic action in most of tropical Africa

Charles Lwanga served as the assistant to the master of pages in the court of King Mwanga of Uganda, with Joseph Mukasa, a devout Catholic, as his superior. Mukasa openly criticized King Mwanga for murdering a Protestant missionary, as well as for his homosexual practices and the corruption of the young pages under his care. This condemnation fueled the king's animosity toward Catholics, culminating in Mukasa's execution by the king's orders.

On the day Mukasa was killed, Lwanga, who had been receiving instruction in the Catholic faith, requested and received baptism. Lwanga's firm stance against the king's immoral acts and his efforts to protect his fellow pages led to his imprisonment along with fourteen other Christian pages. While being transported to prison, Lwanga and three other pages were brutally murdered, being burned to death alongside two soldiers.

This period of persecution claimed the lives of approximately one hundred individuals, including a young catechist who was personally spared to death by King Mwanga. Among the martyrs were also tribal chiefs and judges who suffered for their faith. St. Charles Lwanga, along with twenty-one other martyrs, was canonized in 1964 by Pope Paul VI. He has since been honored as the patron of African youth. The memorial of St. Charles Lwanga and his companion martyrs is celebrated annually on June 3, recognizing their steadfast faith and ultimate sacrifice.

GLORIA: Inside front cover of *Breaking Bread*

FIRST READING: Exodus 24: 3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the LORD has said, we will heed and do." Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words of his."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 9: 11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

GOSPEL: Mark 14: 12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?'" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.
