Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time B

I'm told that 7 is the number. Not the "Lucky 7," or even the "Magic 7." Just that 7 is the age when young Junior (or Jane) reaches the "age of reason." By that our Church means that he or she knows the difference between right and wrong. What that means is that the star of a thousand smart phone photos and the official "Curator of Cute Doings" can turn less than cute at times. All of this is the natural way for human creatures to grow.

The Bible, specifically the Book of Genesis that we hear from this weekend, tells us that God's original plan did not include anything like sin. In fact, our ancestors brought it forward by their disobedience to the one command from God to stay away from just this one tree in the garden.

Century upon century ever since that wily snake that spoke would use all his know-how and trickery to keep us as trapped and imprisoned by hatred as he is. Despite being made for goodness and love, mankind succumbed to sin. Love was lost. Hatred won. Until...

Until a beautiful young girl living in a dusty little village in the Roman dominated land of Palestine said "Yes" to an angelic visitor who asked of her in God's own name to be the Mother of our Savior. That holy birth would end the reign of sin in the main, even if individuals were to keep falling for the lie. The age number her Son reached when His triumph came was 33.

Along the way to His victory, as we know, Jesus met resistance to His teaching. The snake still hovered in the background. Chief among the dissenters were the very people who claimed to be the teachers of righteousness. They it was who ultimately engineered Christ's crucifixion, even with an unspoken fear deep inside them that feared their hold on the people would self-destruct.

What you and I must remember is that no matter our age, there is always the possibility of an internally divided kingdom in our souls. The effects are that while we desire to do what is right, our very weakness lets us yield to the tug of temptation more often than we want. So, we need help. We need God. We need His healing mercy. That's the only way we can hope to attain heaven. It's the one place where the snake is forever gone, and age numbers do not count.

Of course, temptations never seem to cease. Case in point: Avery overweight man decided that it was time to shed a few pounds. He went on a new diet and took it seriously. He even changed his usual driving route on the way to the office precisely to avoid passing his favorite bakery. One morning, however, he arrived at the office carrying a large, sugar-coated, calorie-loaded coffee cake.

For this he was roundly chided by his colleagues, but he only smiled, shrugged his shoulders, and said, "What could I do? This is a very special cake. What happened is that, by force of habit, I accidentally drove by the bakery this morning, and there in the window were trays full of the most scrumptious goodies.

Well, I felt this was no accident that I happened to pass by this way, so I prayed' "Lord, if You really want me to have one of those delicious coffee cakes, let me find a parking space right in front of the bakery.' Sure enough, on the ninth time around the block, there it was."

Principle of Catholic Social Teaching Preferential Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

While God's love is universal, this principle does not intend that we should focus on the poor to the exclusion of others, but rather that we are called to prioritize those who are weak, vulnerable and in the most need. A basic moral test for our society is how we treat those who are poor and vulnerable in our midst. In a society marred by deepening disparities between rich and poor, Scripture gives us the story of the Last Judgment (see Mt. 25:31 - 46) which reminds us that we will be judged by our response to the "least among us." This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized in our nation and beyond - unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, and victims of injustice and oppression.

St. John Fisher

Feast Day June 22

Patron of the Diocese of Rochester, New York

St. John Fisher, born in 1469 in Beverly, York, England. His father died when he was young, but his mother ensured he received a good education. Recognized for his intellect, John attended the University of Cambridge, earning a Master of Arts and later a Doctor of Divinity in 1501. He became vice chancellor of the university the same year.

Fisher's intellectual reputation led Lady Margaret, Countess of Richmond and mother of King Henry VII, to appoint him as her counselor. Under his influence, she increased her charitable activities and founded two colleges at Cambridge. In 1504, Henry VII nominated Fisher to be the bishop of Rochester, and he also became Chancellor of Cambridge. As bishop, he was dedicated to pastoral care and combating heresy.

Fisher served as counselor to Catherine of Aragon after Henry VII's death. He opposed Henry VIII's divorce from Catherine and the king's separation from the Roman Catholic Church. When Fisher and Sir Thomas More refused to recognize Henry's supremacy over the Church of England, they were imprisoned in the Tower of London. Despite attempts to persuade them, both remained steadfast.

In 1535, Pope Paul III named Fisher a cardinal, angering Henry VIII, who had him tried for high treason. Fisher was executed on June 22, 1535. He was canonized by Pope Pius XII in 1935, and his memorial is celebrated alongside St. Thomas More on June 22.

FIRST READING: *Ezekiel: 17: 22-24*

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

GOSPEL: *Mark 4: 26-34*

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

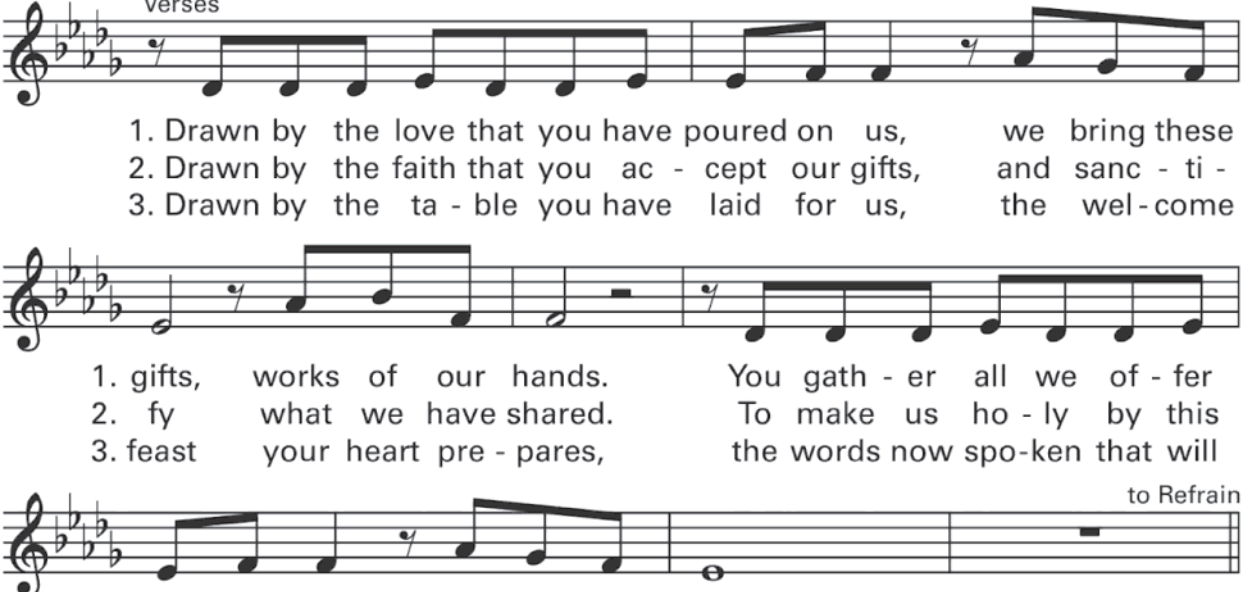

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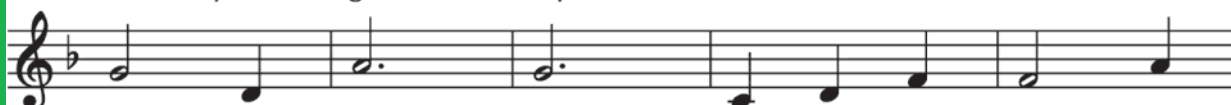
