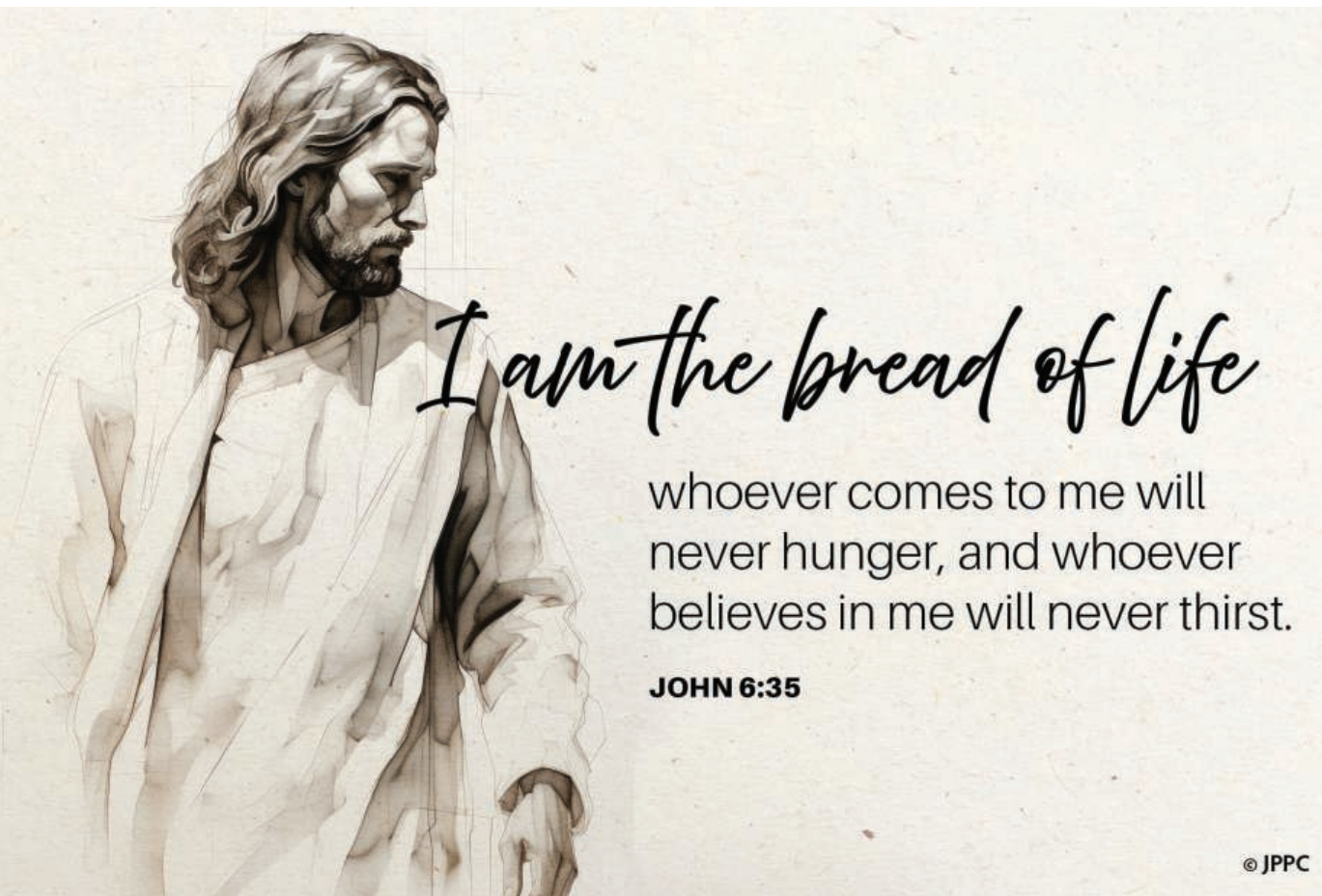

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time B

Reflection:

Last week the gospel related the miracle feeding of the five thousand and the subsequent interaction between Jesus and the crowd. Jesus leaves the scene because he knew they wanted to make him King. The people follow him, crossing the Sea of Galilee to search for him. Once they find him, they keep asking him questions. When did he get there? How do we accomplish God's works? What sign can he give them? What can he do? They seem desperate to pin him down, to hear definite answers, to find some kind of certainty in his teaching so they can believe in him. Even though they had just eaten their fill of the loaves, they wanted more.

Many parents might recognize such a scheme of overall discontent. It happens daily with children who ask for help through various crises—they need a baba, another toy, a bandage, a cracker, a playmate, to go outside, to stay inside, to watch TV, to not take a nap. Parenting, especially of young children, can be a daily dance of offerings and attempts at relief, but even the most energetic and creative parents know that their best efforts might not stave off the inevitable meltdown. And when that occurs, when children cry inconsolably and can't say what they want any more, parents know what to do. They simply hold their children and let them rest against their hearts, marveling at how perfectly they fit together, relishing the sweet peace of the embrace. Parents satisfy their children's deepest, unnamed, unacknowledged need with the gift of themselves.

When Jesus experiences the crowd questioning him, he understands that just offering more miracles or easy dogmatic formulas won't answer their deeper need. This was what other prophets and teachers had done and it satisfied only on a superficial level. It left the people wanting, hungry, unfulfilled. "Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert but they died." Jesus meets their restlessness with the offering designed from all eternity to fill the needs of the human soul: the gift of himself. "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger. Whoever believes in me will never thirst."

At some time in our lives, we all meet moments filled with questions and uncertainties. We coexist with troubling diagnoses, troubled relationships, troubles at work. We sometimes have to live in an uncomfortable state of discontent, waiting for relief and longing for healing. And even when the questions and uncertainties ease, we are often still left with a nagging need for something more. But should that discomfort surprise us? Should we chalk up our desire for "something more" to an embarrassing sense of entitlement? No. We are unsatisfied, not because we are childish or spoiled, but because we are God's children. Our soul's DNA knows that our needs will only stop in God. St. Augustine wrote, "You have made us for yourself O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

As we mature, we learn the difference between what we want and what we need. And what we all need is God in our lives. Let us learn to turn to God who "will wipe away all tears" (Rev 21:4) and satisfy the desire of every living thing" (Psalm 145:16). God's embrace will soothe and fulfill our weary and needy hearts. God's embrace will give us both rest and energy, enabling us to navigate the uncertainties of our days.

VOLUNTEERS are needed to set up, decorate, sell tickets for prizes, and clean up right after the event.

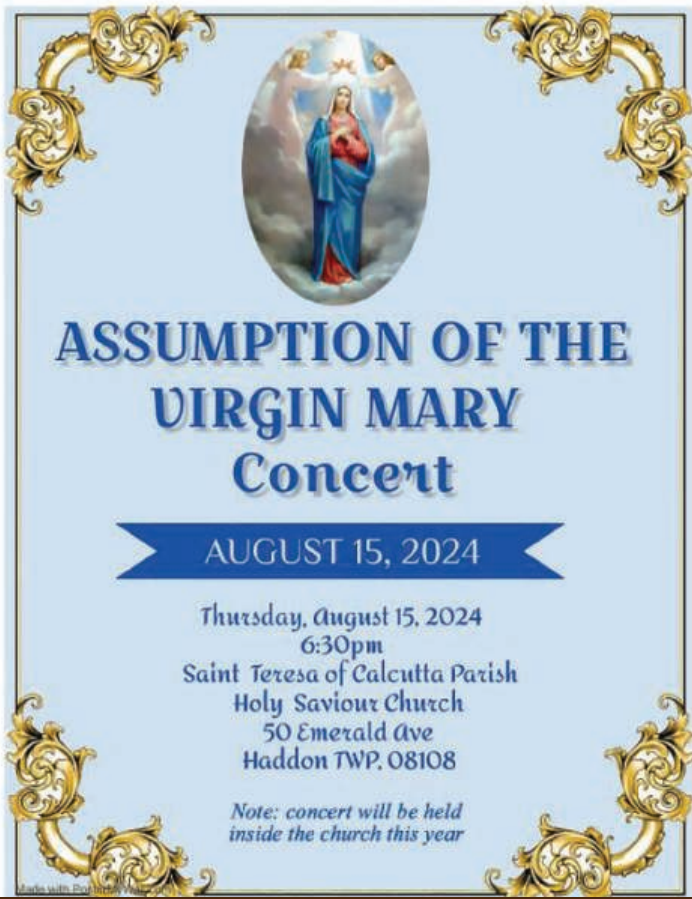
SCHOOL BACKPACK DRIVE: Aug. 17-18

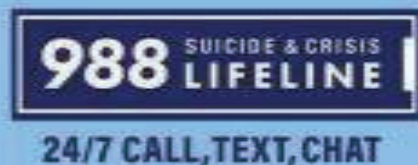

Dedication of Saint Mary Major Basilica

St. Mary Major is a very old and important church in Rome. It was first built in the 4th century by Pope Liberius and rebuilt by Pope Sixtus III in the 5th century, after a meeting of church leaders decided that Mary could be called the Mother of God. This church is the largest one in the world dedicated to Mary.

It is located on one of Rome's seven hills, called the Esquiline. Even though it has been fixed up many times, it still looks like an ancient Roman church on the inside. The church has three sections separated by rows of columns, and its walls are decorated with mosaics from the 5th century.

St. Mary Major is one of four important churches in Rome, called patriarchal churches, which honor the first centers of the Christian Church. The other three are St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Peter's.

There is also a legend about this church, known as Our Lady of the Snows. According to the story, a wealthy couple in Rome promised their money to Mary. She showed her approval by making it snow in the middle of summer and told them to build the church where the snow fell. This miracle is remembered every August 5th by dropping white rose petals from the church's dome.

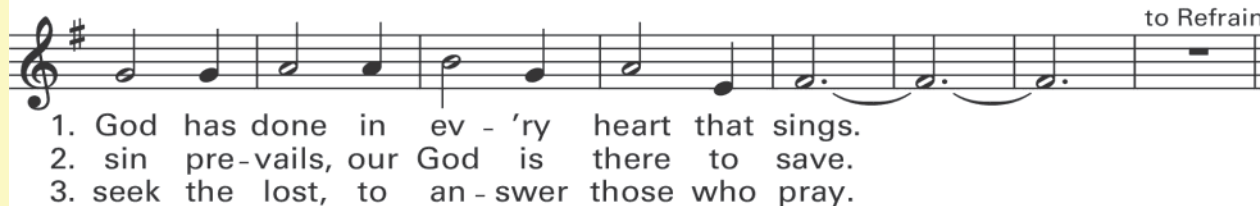
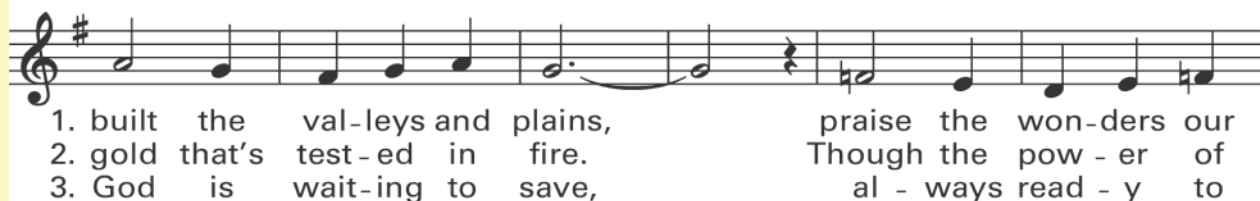

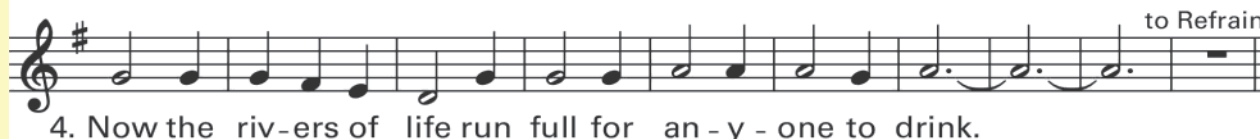

FIRST READING: Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not. "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God."

In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground.

On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was.

But Moses told them, "This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

Brothers and sisters: I declare and testify in the Lord that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds; that is not how you learned Christ, assuming that you have heard of him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus, that you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth.

GOSPEL: Jn 6:24-35

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.

Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*" So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

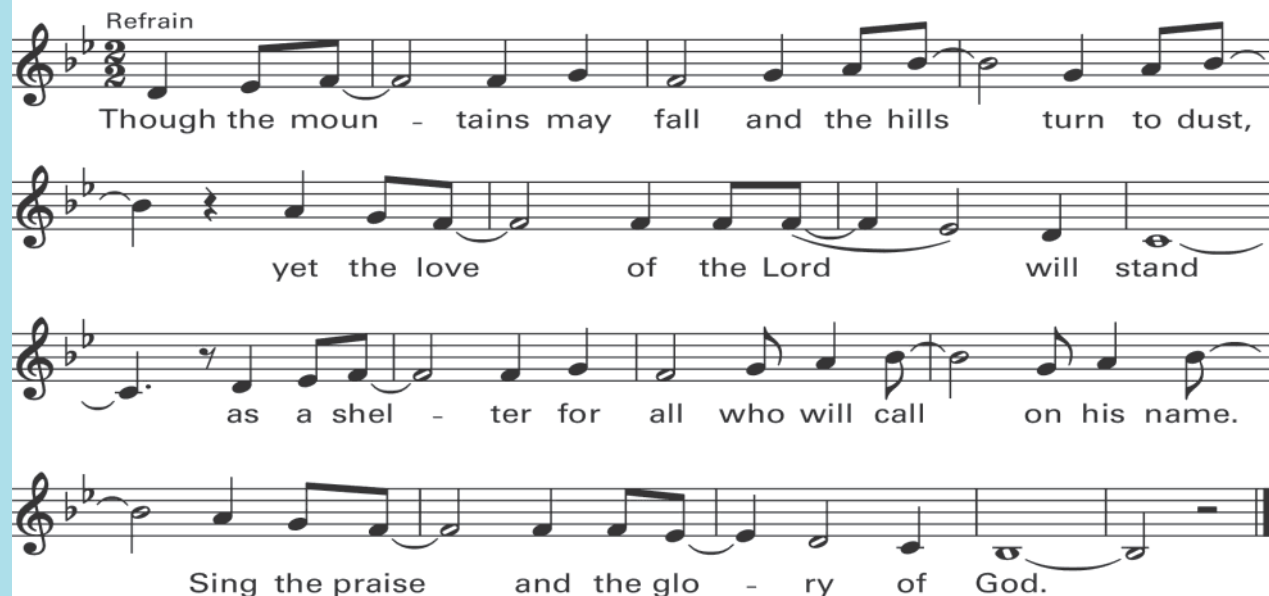

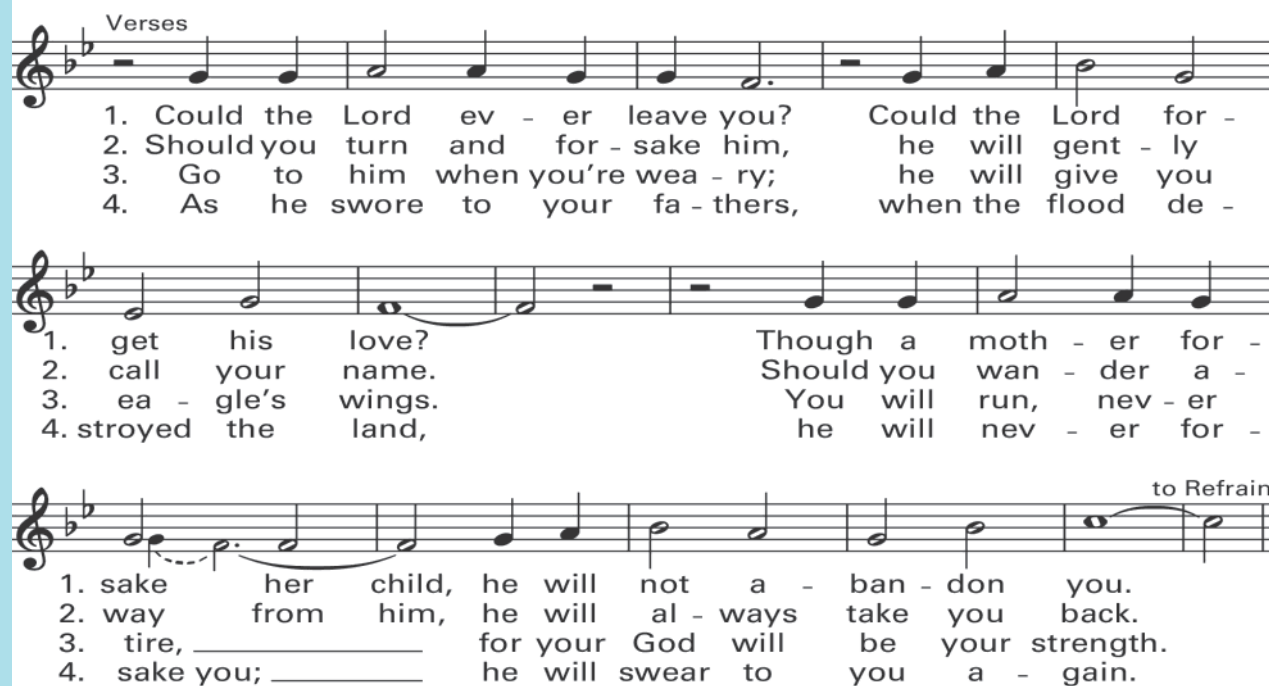
