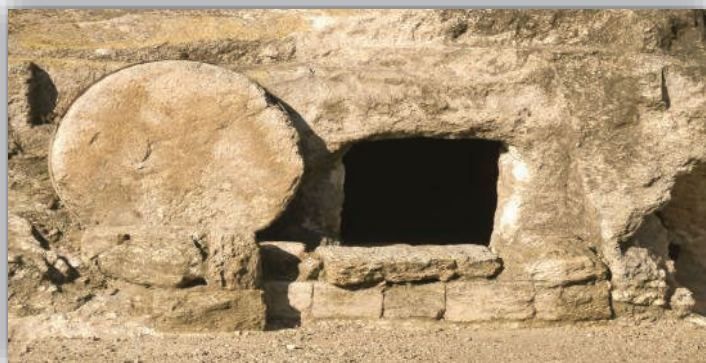

Reflection for Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Reflection by Fr. Bertonazzi

Last week Bishop Williams was at our parish for Palm Sunday. We are very grateful that he came and I sensed a spirit of joy around him being there with us. Bishops are the successors to the apostles, the twelve men that Jesus chose to share in his life as he began his public ministry. We see in our readings from Acts this Sunday that Peter and the other Apostles are witnesses to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Peter and the other apostles eventually gave their life for this fact and became martyrs. People don't give their lives for a make believe story. They witnessed to the truth. Bishop Williams continues to witness to this truth in his ministry and so do priests and deacons. But we are all called to witness to the resurrection. We are called to share this with our loved ones when things are difficult, and especially in times of sickness and in death.

In the Gospel today, we see that one of the apostles ran faster and arrived at the tomb but did not go inside. He waited until Peter arrived and allowed him to go in first. This is a sign of the authority of Peter among the other apostles and among the early church. Our faith is built on Peter's faith and is continually nourished through the ministry of the Pope and Bishops who witness to the love of the risen Christ for all the world.

Through this Easter season, may we witness to the resurrection by our practice of the faith, worshipping the risen Lord at Mass, and through our loving service to our neighbor.

PARISH AND COMMUNITY INFORMATION

What is Easter?

The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle used during the Easter Vigil is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and lit for all liturgical celebrations.

The Easter Vigil is the "Mother of All Vigils" and Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. The octave of Easter comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14)

"What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind;...So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being," the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one." (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49)

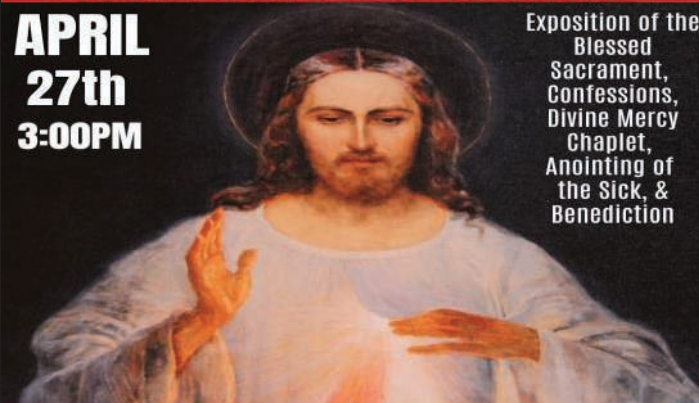

Religious Workforce Protection Act Would Play Pivotal Role in Advancing the Religious Exercise of Americans

“We would not be able to serve our diverse flocks, which reflect the rich tapestry of our society overall, without the faithful men and women who come to serve through the **Religious Worker Visa Program**,” said Archbishop Broglio and Bishop Seitz in a letter to Congress early April. These workers include priests, men and women in religious orders and congregations, and other laypersons serving in a wide range of ministries. Some parishes, especially those in rural or isolated areas, would go without regular access to the Sacraments, if not for these religious workers. Additionally, dioceses with large immigrant populations rely on foreign-born religious workers for their linguistic and cultural expertise. <https://www.usccb.org/resources/USCCB%20Letter%20on%20RWA.pdf>

“We would not be able to serve our diverse flocks, which reflect the rich tapestry of our society overall, without the faithful men and women who come to serve through the Religious Worker Visa Program. Simply put, an increasing number of American families will be unable to practice the basic tenets of their faith if this situation is not addressed soon. Likewise, hospitals will go without chaplains, schools will go without teachers, and seminaries will go without instructors.” The US Conference of Catholic Bishops asks us to join them in supporting the RWA to pass this much needed source of relief.

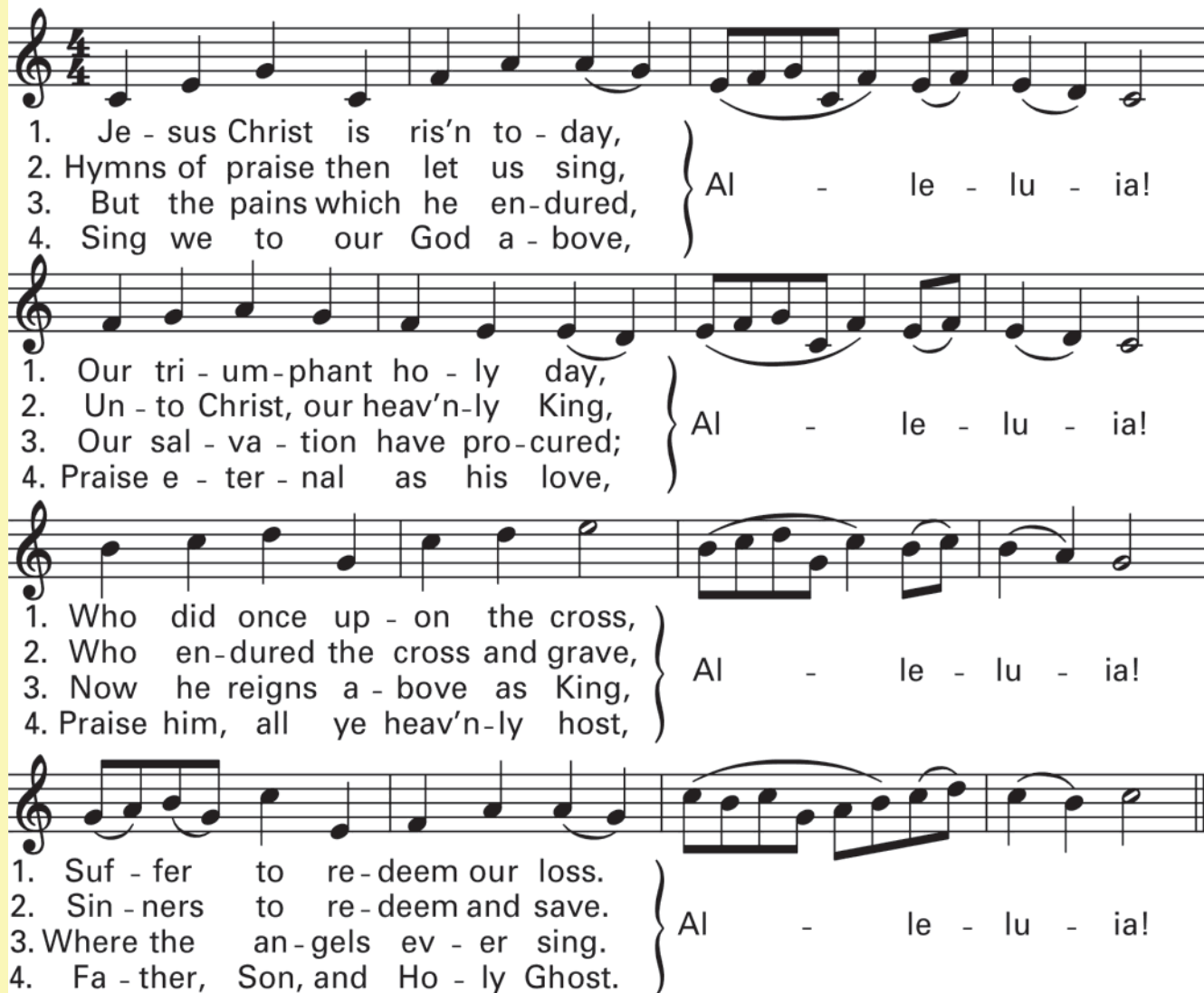

EASTER SUNDAY—April 20,2025 - THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

FIRST READING:

[Acts 10:34a, 37-43](#)

Peter proceeded to speak and said: “You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.”

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.” So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

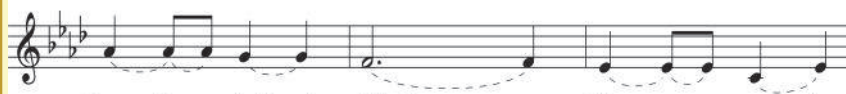
