Most Holy Trinity, June 15, 2025

I attended the Baccalaureate Mass and graduation last week at Camden Catholic High School and Paul VI High School where Bishop Williams was the main celebrant and homilist. His message to the graduates focused on the love of God for each of them and that they have been given a mission by God. He quoted Romans 5:5: "...and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

On this Trinity Sunday we recognize that the Trinity is a communion of persons in love, and we are called to share in that love as God's children. It is a great mystery that we celebrate: that God is a communion of Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, which is a relationship of complete love. We, as the Christian people, who are baptized into Christ, are called to share in that love of the Trinity. We share that love of the Holy Spirit that has been poured out upon us so that we can continue to hope in the goodness of God.

Jesus tells us that the Father is "good" and on this Father's Day we give thanks for the goodness of fathers in our lives. All fatherhood finds its origin in God the Father. We pray for all fathers today and we ask God the Father to comfort those who have lost their fathers, and we pray that we all will know the goodness of God the Father in our lives.

Do something special for the fathers in your life or at least say a prayer for them that God will bless them in their vocation of fatherhood. We pray that Jesus draws us deeper into a relationship with Him, and with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

Father's Day is often a day to come together with our family to recognize the fathers in our lives. We remember all fathers today and we give thanks for being part of God the Father's family through His son Jesus Christ. We pray that we continue to grow in that love through the Holy Spirit.

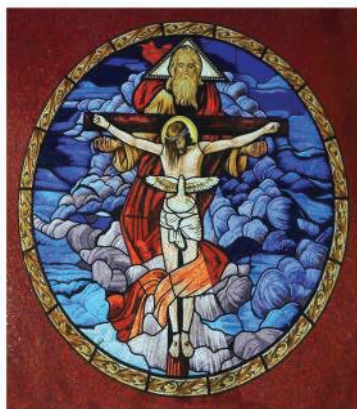

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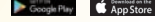
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
