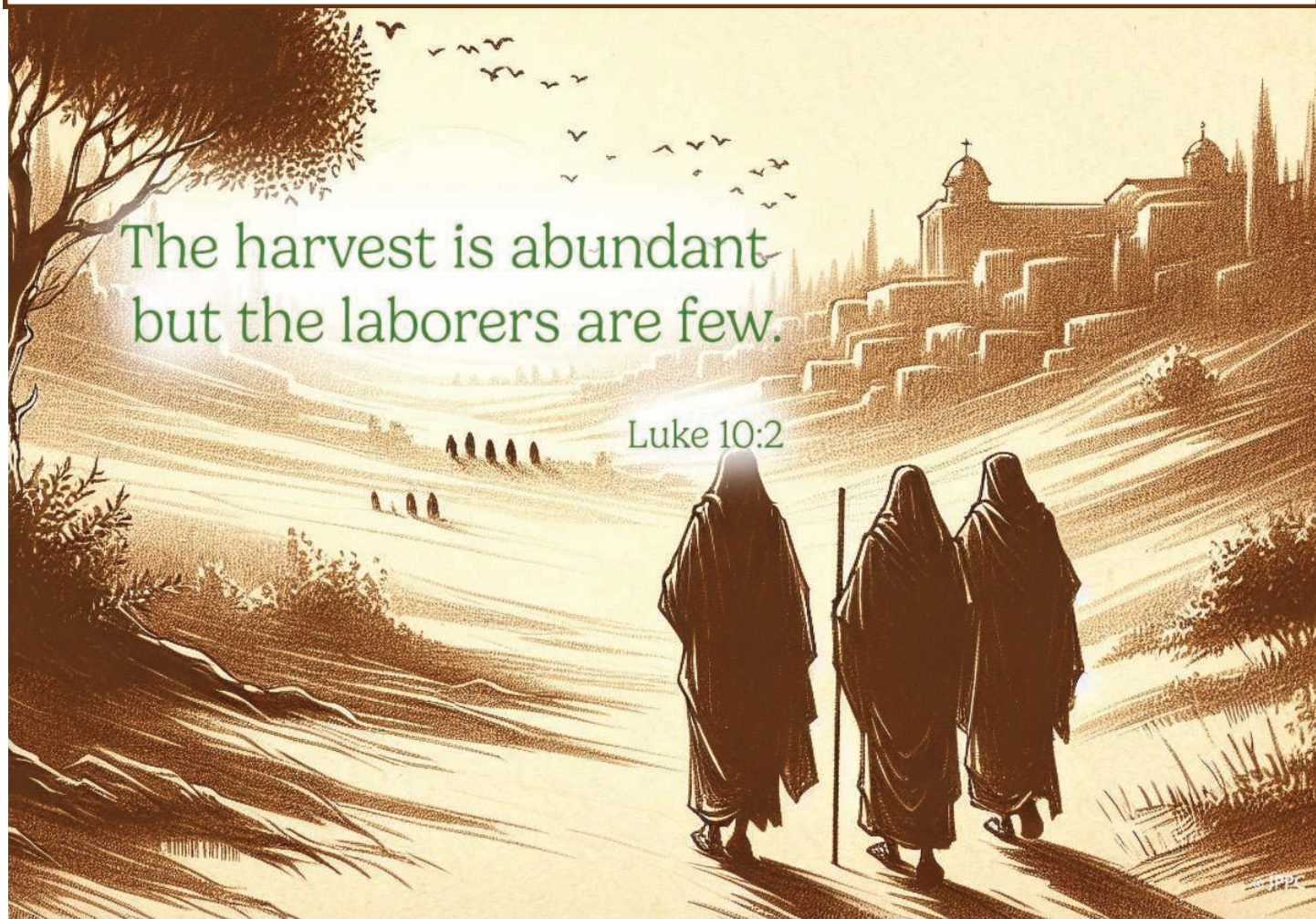

Reflection for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we enter the fullness of summer, we usually think about relaxing and getting away from our regular schedules. We want to replenish our energies. We want to reconnect with people or nature. We want a break. And so, I find it ironic that today's gospel is a call to work. In this gospel, Jesus appoints seventy-two others (besides the 12) "whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.'"

Usually, that iconic statement: "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few..." receives most of the attention. It has most often been interpreted as an invitation to the priesthood or religious life and indeed, many priests, brothers, or sisters would cite this line as instrumental in their response to God's call. And certainly, most of us, hearing about the plentiful harvest and the scarcity of laborers, hope and pray that people might choose to become priests or enter religious life or choose some form of lay ministry. But it is rarer that we listen to these words and apply them to our own lives right now. We tend to think of them as a call to professionalism in the church. Our everyday secular lives don't seem to qualify. We can feel a bit off the hook when it comes to the work of the harvest.

But when I reflect upon the gospel's opening statement—a line I never noticed before now—I realize that Jesus asks a broad network of believers to bring his Good News to others. The gospel states that Jesus sent the seventy-two "ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit." He gives them general instructions about how to interact with those they met and tells them to announce that the kingdom of God is at hand. In other words, Jesus asks them to go ahead of him as an advance team to prepare the people for his presence.

This enlarges the idea of his laborers by number and by task. Besides the specialized vocations pertinent to church life, we see that all of us have a role in the harvest. We just need to understand the vocational nature of our lives, born at our baptism. Can we imagine ourselves as Jesus' prep people? Because that is what we all are and at the very least, that is what Jesus needs from us. Everyone has the responsibility and the ability to help prepare another's soil, another's ears, to hear the good news of God's love so to enter more fully into a life of faith. We are parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, siblings, friends, co-workers, volunteers. Such a wide range of influence. So many fields ready to be worked.

Certainly, this includes volunteering for ministry within the parish. But it extends far beyond parish life. There are foundational concepts of faith—unconditional love, forgiveness, moral living—that people often need to experience prior to connection to God. Can we believe in a forgiving God if we've never experienced forgiveness? By bolstering this foundation, we create inroads for Jesus to come. Jesus asks us, his advance team, to proclaim the kingdom of God through words of love, of hope, of encouragement, of forgiveness, of solace, and of joy. He asks us to set examples of reverence by attending mass, praying before meals, celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and serving the poor.

As we relax in the soft summer air let us pay attention to the fields right before us and do our part to ready the soil for harvest. The work doesn't stop during the summer months. Jesus intends on visiting. May our own lives help people to recognize this holy guest.

An increasing number of priests, religious sisters and brothers, and others serving the Church throughout the United States will be forced to abandon their ministries if policymakers do not act soon. Unfortunately, many parishes, schools, and other Catholic institutions have already had to part with men and women who served them for years because of challenges with the Religious Worker Visa Program.

The bipartisan [Religious Workforce Protection Act \(RWPA\) \(S. 1298/H.R. 2672\)](#), recently introduced in both chambers of Congress, would provide relief for religious workers in this situation and further the free exercise of religion in the United States for the benefit of all Americans.

Foreign-born religious workers provide a range of services and play a pivotal role in promoting religious exercise in our country. As Archbishop Timothy Broglio, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), and Bishop Mark Seitz, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Migration, recently said in their [letter to Congress](#), "We would not be able to serve our diverse flocks, which reflect the rich tapestry of our society overall, without the faithful men and women who come to serve through the Religious Worker Visa Program."

GOSPEL:

He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

To commemorate the 150th Anniversary, a **Canonical Coronation** has been granted by **Papal decree**, a rare and profound honor bestowed by the authority of **Pope Francis**. He has recognized the longstanding tradition of the **Mt. Carmel Procession** of the Mount Carmel Society! The coronation will be celebrated by **Bishop Joseph A. Williams** during the **2:00 PM Our Lady of Mount Carmel Society Mass on Feast Day July 16th**, as he crowns the **Baby Jesus in honor of Our Lady**.

A **canonical coronation** is a formal act by the **Pope**, expressed through a papal bull, to crown a venerated image of Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary, or St. Joseph. This act **acknowledges the image's local and universal significance within the Catholic Church**. This is a **rare honor** for the church and our diocese.
