Bulletin Reflection Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Reflection by Deacon Leo Howitz

Today's Reflection is on the second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Colossians. This reading was possibly used as a hymn in the early Church. I see it very often when praying the Liturgy of the Hours. The one thing I did not know is the story of how this came to be, and this is the basis for this reflection.

Paul wrote this letter while in prison in Ephesia for proclaiming Jesus is Lord. This did not go over very well with the Romans. Remember to them Ceaser is God. Paul had never been to Colossae but, possibly, one of his missionaries proclaiming the Good News of Jesus in that city visited Paul and told him how it was going.

He told Paul that the faith had been accepted by the people of Colossae but there were some problems. Well, the people of Colossae had no problem blending pagan beliefs and thought nothing of putting Jesus into the mix.

They thought they could just place Jesus with all the Greek gods they worshipped. They also knew Jesus was Jewish, so they thought it would be a good idea to take up Jewish customs and rituals, like circumcision and keeping the Torah.

This is the basis for the second reading, to correct their thinking and to let the people know that Jesus is the only God and they do not need to follow Jewish customs.

As I stated above, this reading is believed to have been written as a hymn so that people would always remember just who Jesus really is. If we consider Jesus as the image of the invisible God, it takes us back to the creation story, showing Jesus as a true man just like Adam. It also describes Jesus at the same time in His role as the Creator God.

Although the wording is very hard to read it implies there is one God, and it is Jesus both fully human and fully divine. Paul also establishes that Jesus is the head of the body, the Church. It describes Jesus as the savior of the world, making peace through the blood of the cross. And this would lead to His role at the end of time, since He is the firstborn of the dead; through Him we will be like him.

This one little reading says all this; to me this is incredible! How did Paul acquire such knowledge? From his little prison cell, Paul sent this letter to Colossae. And this knowledge stood the test of time. This reading was used about three hundred years later to strike down a heresy that Jesus was really two different people, one human and one divine. And after that it was used many other times to strike down other false beliefs in Jesus. Later in this letter Paul tells the people of Colossae that for now they are to live as the kind of person Jesus would want them to be. Through Jesus in the end there will be a new humanity, but don't wait until you die to live this new humanity, start it right now, in the present time.

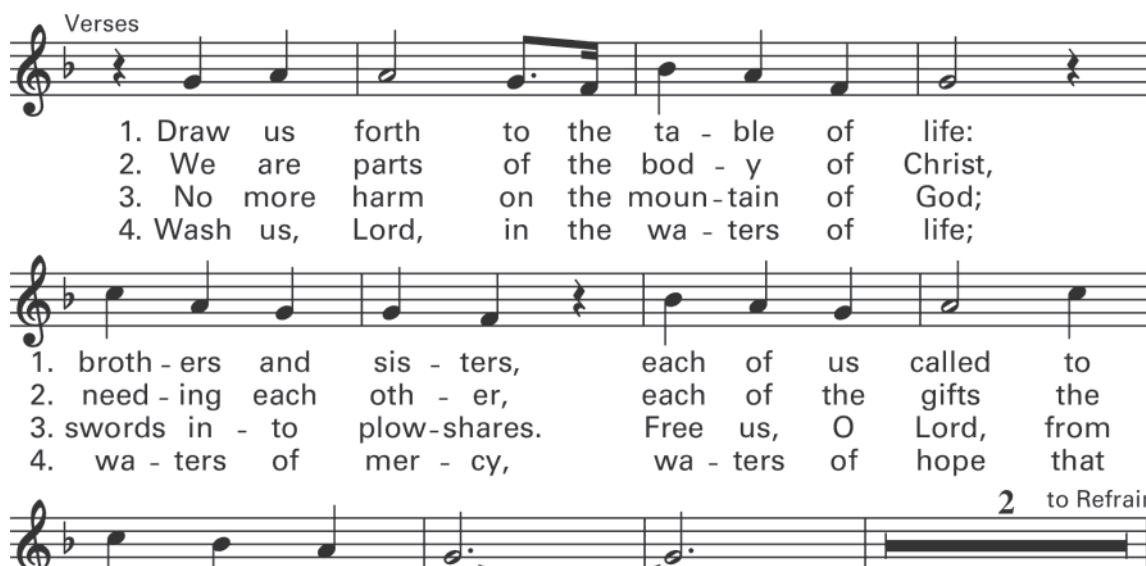

Dt 30:10-14

Moses said to the people: "If only you would heed the voice of the LORD, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in this book of the law, when you return to the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul. "For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you. It is not up in the sky, that you should say, 'Who will go up in the sky to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' Nor is it across the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross the sea to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' No, it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out."

SECOND READING:

Col 1:15-20

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. GOSPEL:

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."
