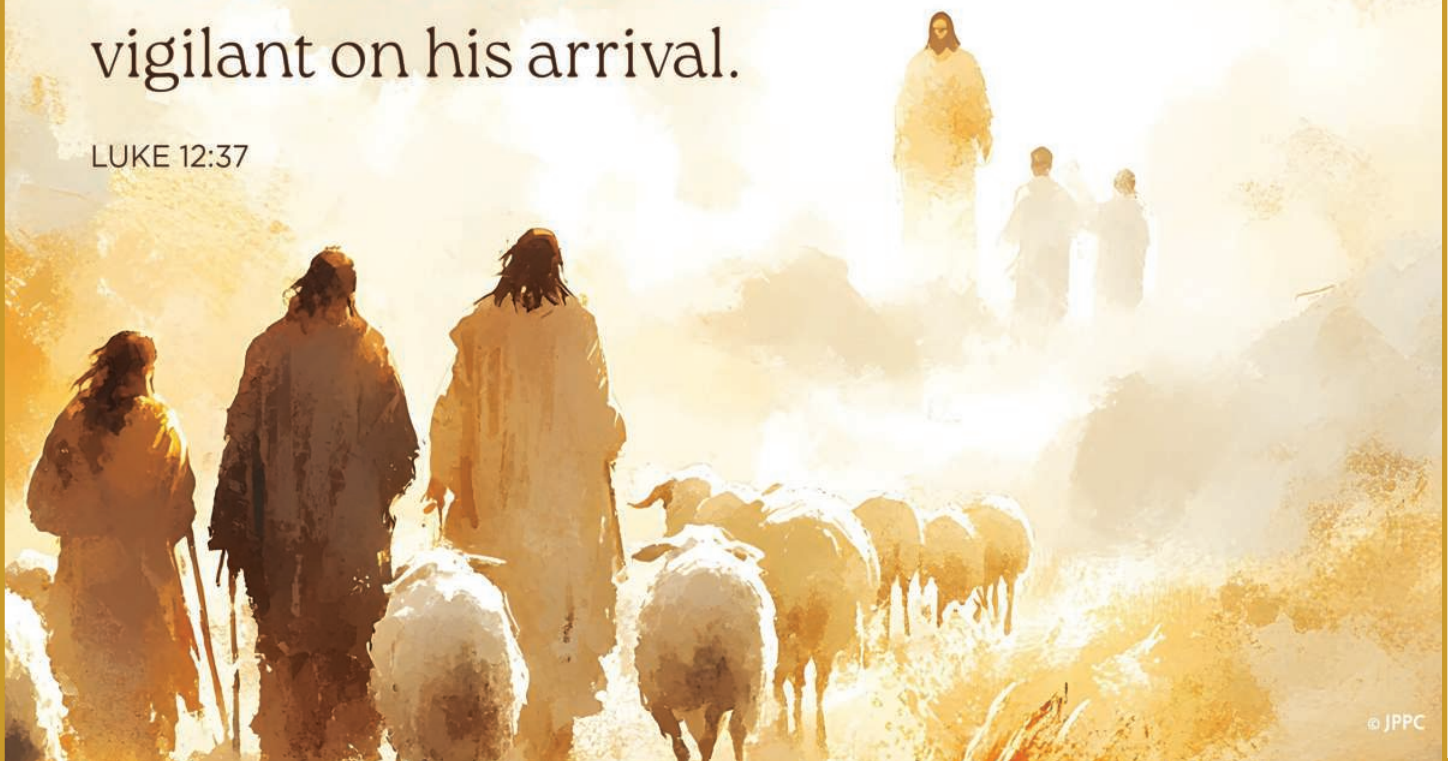

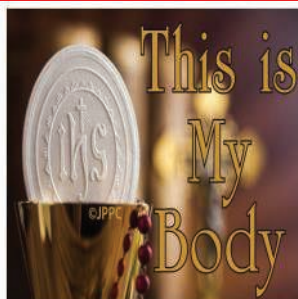

Bulletin Reflection Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Today's Reflection is on the Gospel for the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Right at the beginning

of this Gospel, Jesus talks about giving alms. Most people think of this as only giving charity to the financially poor. But this does not have to be the case; there are other types of poverty that are just as important, and may be even more important. The best place to start is to remember the phrase, "charity begins at home".

When I think of the time I spend sitting in front of my computer, most of it is wasted time. I could spend this time better. I think of my wife and how I could be spending time helping her or for that matter even talking to her. The same is true with my children, my brother, my mother, and my friends. I make plans for myself, but how often do I think of taking time to make plans with them?

Maybe tomorrow or in a few weeks you may be going on vacation to spend time with the family, but even there most of the time could be better spent with them if we tried harder. We are a busy society and most of our time seems to get sucked into this black hole of what we consider work. But it does not have to be so and should not be so.

Our time with our family and friends is precious and finite. You will not always have this finite time together, so use this time wisely. Think of important things you should talk about with your family – personal things. But instead of thinking of things that are only important to you, think about things that are important for them. Talk with them, but think and most importantly listen! Think of what is important in your spouse's life, your son or daughter's life right now. They may be retiring, starting a new job, worrying about an illness, or all kinds of things. Talk about this with them; put all your attention into what is important to them. Don't worry about sharing on how to fix their problems. Let them share with you what is on their minds, with no judging, no input, just a caring smile. Think (not aloud), but in your heart pray for understanding. Pray for God to even give you an opening to talk about such things. Timing may be everything. Let God handle it.

Wow, this is my reflection for you, and this is my reflection for me. This is almsgiving and it does not cost me or you anything, except time and well spent energy. I have a person in my immediate family, who would love this and who desperately needs this, and I don't know where to begin. You may not know where to begin, but I think someone else also had the same problem. Saint Francis said, "make me a channel of your peace". I believe that in addition to being a source of peace Saint Francis also had to pray for the timing to approach people exactly when they needed this the most. Thoughtful patience—all things in God's time - God will let you know exactly when to speak.

FIRST READING:

Wisdom 18:6-9

The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage. Your people awaited the salvation of the just and the destruction of their foes. For when you punished our adversaries, in this you glorified us whom you had summoned. For in secret the holy children of the good were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the divine institution.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own. **Psalm 33:1,12,18-22**

SECOND READING:

Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age—and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

All these died in faith. They did not receive what had been promised but saw it and greeted it from afar and acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth, for those who speak thus show that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land from which they had come, they would have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better homeland, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said, “Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name.” He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

GOSPEL:

Luke 12:32-48

Jesus said to his disciples: “Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be. “Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.”

Then Peter said, “Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?” And the Lord replied, “Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, ‘My master is delayed in coming,’ and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant’s master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master’s will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master’s will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.”

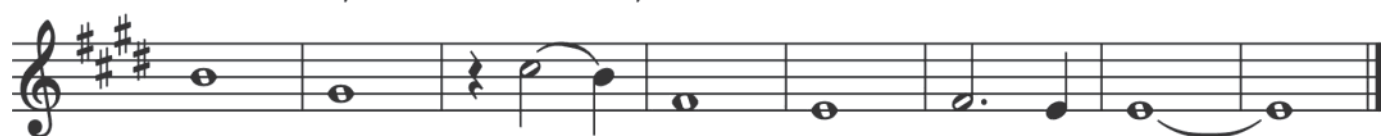
