## **Bulletin Reflection Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C**

“I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory.” Isaiah 66:18

The first reading from Isaiah really caught my attention this week. As a member of our parish Creation Care Team, I’m aware that the Season of Creation 2025 begins in eight days, September 1st thru October 4th. Isaiah reminds me of Pope Francis’ desire for everyone in every nation to see God’s glory in all of Creation. When Pope Francis wrote his encyclical in 2015, *Laudato Si: On Care for Our Common Home*, Pope Francis wanted this encyclical letter to influence people all around the world to hear his call for an ecological conversion. Pope Francis wrote:

*“Our insistence that each human being is an image of God should not make us overlook the fact that each creature has its own purpose. None is superfluous. The entire material universe speaks of God’s love, God’s boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God.”*(LS84)

Following the publication of his encyclical, Pope Francis also made the Catholic Church’s warm welcoming of the Season of Creation official. The Season of Creation is an ecumenical movement, a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment to action on behalf of the healing of Earth. The theme for this year’s celebration is “Peace with Creation” inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18, “to act for justice and make peace with Creation.”

In the Letter to the Hebrews today, we hear the exhortation to practice discipline. I’ve always found practices of discipline very difficult, like trying to keep a New Year’s resolution! Sometimes I’m successful and other times I fail. So I found these words of scripture comforting. “At times, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it” Hebrews 12:11. If we are to make Peace with Creation we need to choose an action, a discipline to advance to healing of Earth. Much of the environmental crisis we now experience is due to the abuses caused by human activity. Therefore, every prayer, project and work of advocacy makes a difference for the future of human life and a healthy planet.

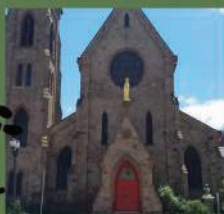

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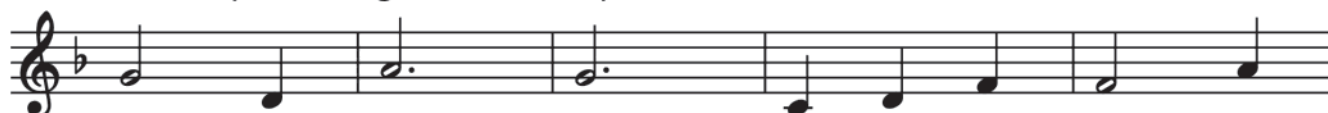
