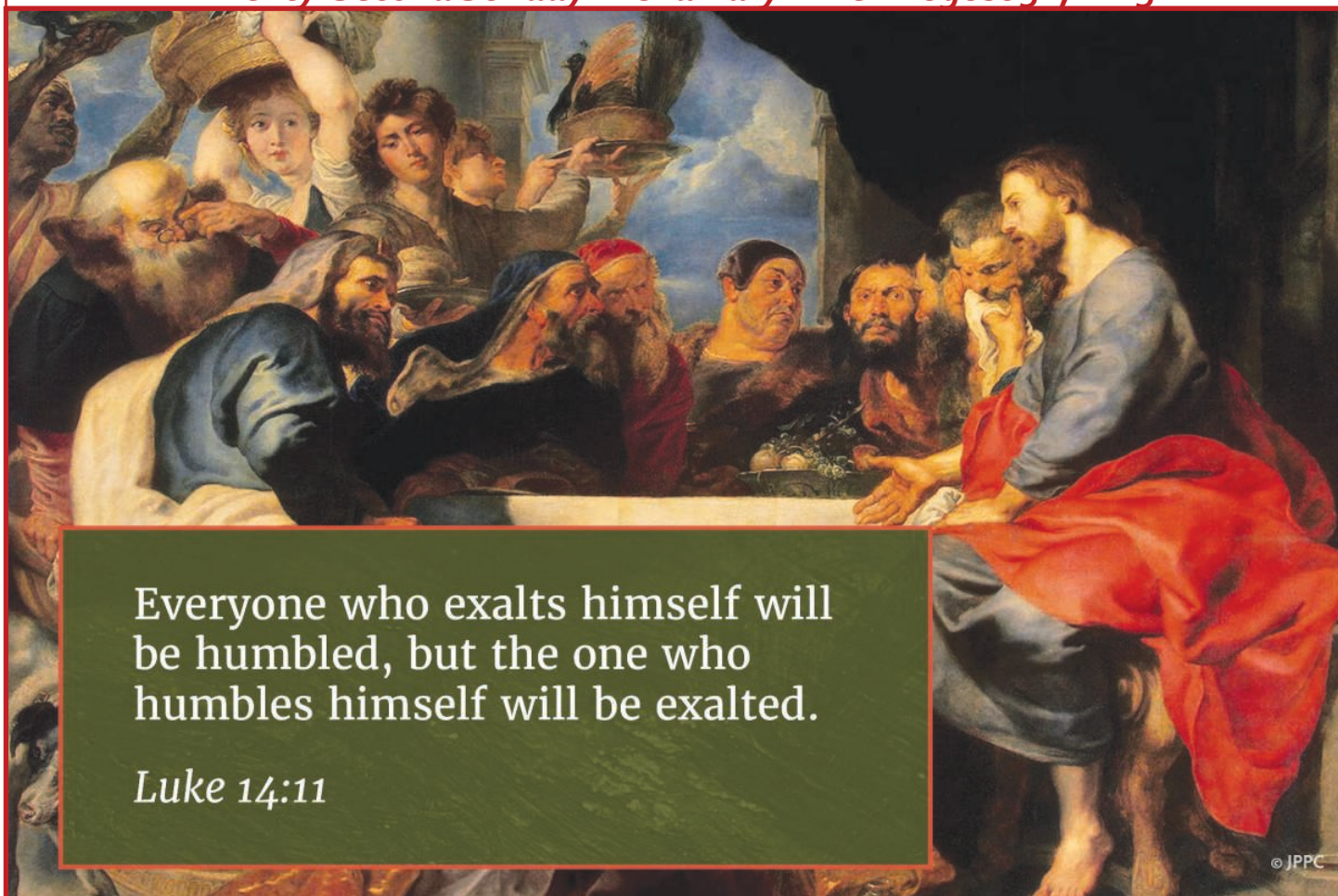

Bulletin Reflection Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

It was a relatively minor event that took place on the afternoon of Sunday, June 1. Pope Leo XIV who had just finished celebrating a Mass for 70,000 people gathered in St. Peter's Square for the Jubilee of Families, from children to grandparents. But now it was time for him to relax and have a scheduled lunch with friends for a special occasion. It was the 70th birthday party of an old friend, the head of the Augustinian Order, a post the pope himself had once held. It was at their world headquarters only a block away.

Security demanded the pope ride an SUV, and it arrived with no fanfare. His Augustinian hosts greeted Leo; and then with a quick wave to the video photographer, the Pope entered the building. Nobody else was around. But I noted Pope Leo's humility in that brief incident. No ceremony with a squad of Monsignors in tow. It was one man joining his longtime friend at the friend's home.

It may not always be obvious where humility ranks among the virtues. Suffice it to say it is tops with the Trinity, holy as they are. All the holy people we know, beginning with our Blessed Mother Mary, had it as part of their nature.

In today's Gospel, humility is being talked about out loud and clear in the lesson Our Lord teaches the guests at another dinner party in another house long ago. Let's be clear. Humility is not denial of the obvious. Often such denial takes place when we're complimented for some reason or another. Do you recall a scene in many old Hollywood westerns? The hero gets praise from the pretty girl for his skill at riding the bucking bronco. Then he shyly replies, "Aw shucks, Ma'am, 'twerent nuttin'." Actually our young cowboy is wrong. What he did was something; something done well.

You see, humility is truth. The root of the word itself is "humus", or "dirt." We are nothing more than dust but created from it by a loving God. That's the great lesson for us on Ash Wednesday. Besides Our Lady of Good Counsel, another of Pope Leo XIV's models is St. Augustine, the guide of the Augustinian community of which he is a member. Here is one of that saint's appropriate insights from a long-ago conversation.

A certain public speaker asked the saint one day what was the chief rule of eloquence? Augustine replied, "Delivery." "Ah, but what is the second rule?" Again, the saint replied "Delivery." "Then what is the third?" "Delivery." came the reply. But then Augustine changed the subject. He said, "Sir, were you to ask me concerning the precepts of the Christian religion, first, second, third, and always, I would only answer this one way: Humility, humility and humility." God love you and give you His peace.

"Spread love everywhere you go; first of all in your house. Give love to your children, to your wife or husband, to a next door neighbor. Let no one ever come to you without leaving better and happier." Quote is from St. Teresa of Calcutta.

This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

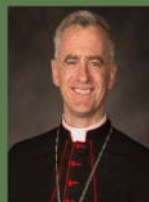

Go to Confession

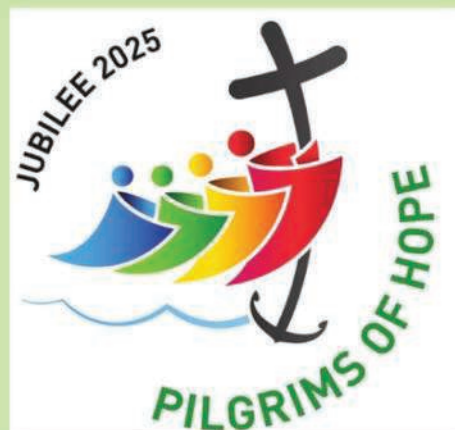
Receive Holy Communion

Sir 3:17-18, 20,28-29

My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God. GOSPEL:

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there here observing him carefully. He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they here choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
