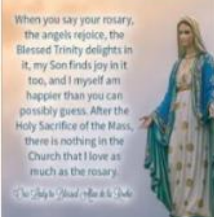

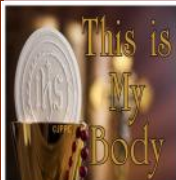

All Soul's Sunday

If you are a young athlete, dreaming of becoming a major star in your sport, you probably go to that sport's Hall of Fame. You see the faces of the stars and hear stories of their hard work and accomplishments. They inspire you towards great achievement even as they humble you by their dedication and drive. By the end of your visit you have either discarded your dream of greatness, realizing its impossibility, or you have become even more enthused. If the latter, you set your sights on someday having your own display in the Hall of Fame, motivated to do the hard work necessary to achieve your goal.

Unfortunately, we all know that getting into any Hall of Fame, whether sports or music or any other field, takes more than hard work. There is a genetic factor that cannot be denied. Some people are supremely suited to a field and through their efforts, hone their skills towards great success. I might have loved basketball as a high school athlete, but there was no way that my love of the sport alone could convey me to greatness. I would have needed an extra 8 inches and a much better jump shot!

This weekend we celebrate All Saints Day on Saturday and All Souls Day on Sunday. We, the living, remember those who have gone before—our deceased who are journeying through Purgatory to Heaven, and our saints, those we know by name and those unknown to us who are now enjoying the fullness of God's presence. These celebrations help us to understand the beautiful doctrine of the Communion of Saints. This creedal belief reminds us of our identity and our destiny. We are all family, part of the Body of Christ, connected by our common baptism, destined to be with God. But we are at different stages on this journey, and we advance with varied energies and sometimes problematic routes. So we help each other along the way. We, the living, pray for each other and for our deceased. And our saints in Heaven, our all-stars of the family of God, pray for us and offer us inspiring examples of how to travel with greater intent on our destination.

Which brings me back to my image of the Hall of Fame, for it seems an especially applicable metaphor for the saints, the "all-stars" of the church. We honor these holy travelers and we say: well done good and faithful servants! The roll call of saints contains an amazing array of individuals and it is fun to read about their lives. But as we contemplate the saints, do we ever also wonder or dream about someday being included in their ranks? Or do we make a distinction between their vocation and our lives, attributing their extraordinary holiness to some rare saint gene that is usually not found in the general population? Perhaps they have a special GPS that helps them on this journey that we just don't have.

Our parish's patron saint, Mother Teresa, seemed very aware of our tendency to make excuses about our personal call to holiness. When we state that sainthood could not possibly pertain to our lives, when we hold up our weakness and sinfulness as proof of its impossibility, Mother Teresa does not let us off the hook. She notes, "Holiness is not the luxury of the few. It is a simple duty for me and for you. I must be a saint in my way, and you in yours." Moreover, she did not want us to imagine replicating her exact call, as if we could all go to India and serve the poor. She knew that might also dissuade us from even trying. Instead, she suggested that we imitate her approach. She writes, "Stay where you are. Find your own Calcutta. Find the sick, the suffering, and the lonely, right where you are—in your own homes and in your own families, in homes and in your workplaces and in your schools. You can find Calcutta all over the world if. You have eyes to see."

When we view the Saints' Hall of Fame, we need to envision our own section there with our own biography: A loving husband, a devoted mother, a selfless friend, an innovative teacher, a caring doctor, a dedicated worker, an energetic civil rights activist, a generous caregiver. We need to accept where God has put us (our own Calcutta) and make it a more loving, God centered environment. We need to imagine that our lives, lived with courage, creativity, compassion, and commitment to our faith, are exactly the avenue and vehicle to journey towards the fullness of God's presence. No other way is required. As we think about our identity and our destiny to be with God, we do not get to excuse ourselves from the possibility of sainthood. It has been expected of us since our Baptism. It is dearly desired by Our Lord. It is absolutely needed in our world. And we are capable of such growth and steady traveling, not because of any genetic markings, but because of the power of the Holy Spirit, who guides and energizes our days. Let us not leave the Saints' Hall of Fame disillusioned by our own weaknesses. Let us leave heartened by God's strength.

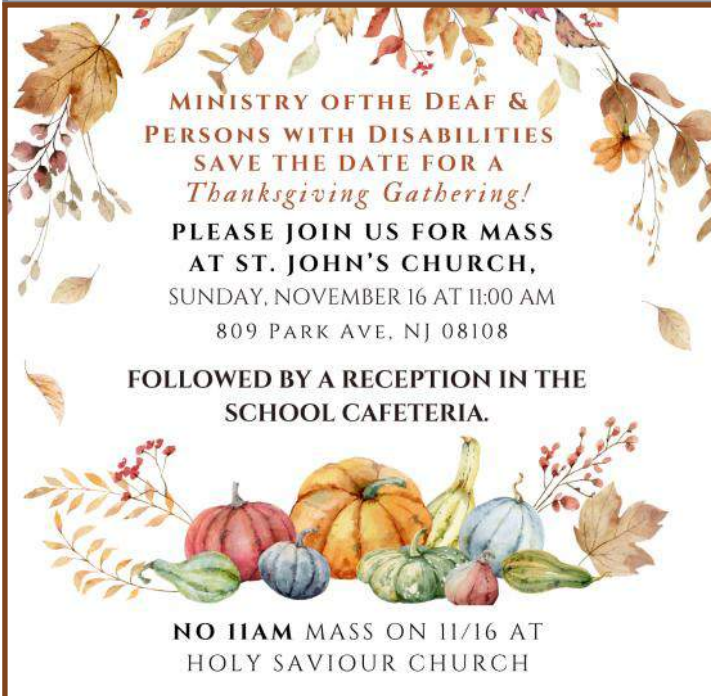

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

FIRST READING:

Wisdom 3:1-9

The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace. For if before men, indeed, they be punished, yet is their hope full of immortality; chastised a little, they shall be greatly blessed, because God tried them and found them worthy of himself. As gold in the furnace, he proved them, and as sacrificial offerings he took them to himself. In the time of their visitation they shall shine, and shall dart about as sparks through stubble; they shall judge nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord shall be their King forever. Those who trust in him shall understand truth, and the faithful shall abide with him in love: because grace and mercy are with his holy ones, and his care is with his elect.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The Lord hears the cry of the poor.

Psalm 23:1-6

SECOND READING:

Romans 5:5-11

Brothers and sisters: Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. For Christ, while we were still helpless, died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his Blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

GOSPEL:

John 6:37-40

Jesus said to the crowds: "Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me. And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day."

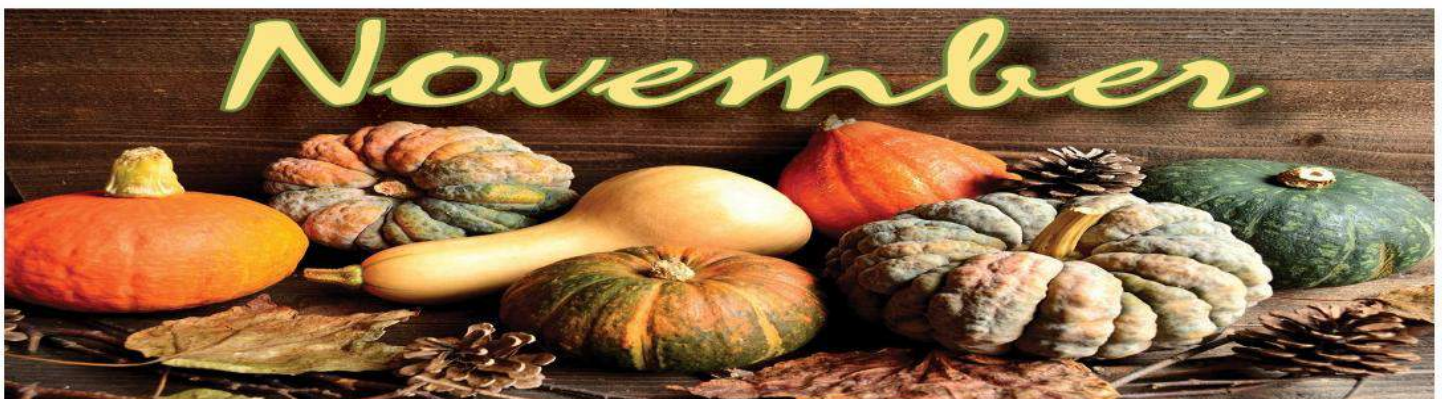
