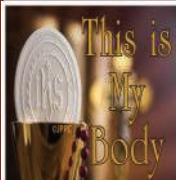

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Traffic being manageable, if not kind, I can get to it in under two hours from where I live now. It sits well shaded by trees that were once just past sapling stage. The street it sits on seems somehow smaller than when I was also small. Its present owners have put their touches on it, with a graceful arch now placed over the front patio my dad had installed. If it could speak, you would hear a collection of stories about my mom and dad, and Uncle Ed, and about my sisters, my brother and me, embracing a range of emotions from laughter to tears and everything in between. Even now I am happy to display a painting of it in the house I now call home. I refer, of course, to the house in which I grew up.

We should not be surprised that our Church celebrates the historic building in which she grew up. Such a celebration might appear puzzling at first. After all, have we here on earth “no lasting city.” Why celebrate a building?

In response, allow me to say that St. John Lateran marks a distinct moment in Church history. The original structure was built on land donated by the wealthy Laterani family to the Christian Church newly freed from persecution by the emperor Constantine and made the official religion of the empire.

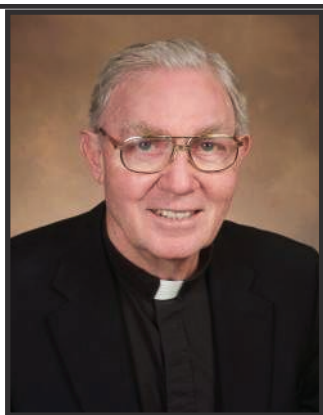
We really are also celebrating fellow believers like us, from long ago and far away, who took their belief in Jesus Christ seriously enough as to have faced potential martyrdom up to this time.

The actual anniversary of the dedication of this special church dates to November 9, of the year 324 A.D. It remains to this day as the location of the episcopal chair of the pope as the bishop of Rome, just as the cathedral of your diocese houses your bishop's official chair of office.

Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. Since then, the basilica has been the site of five ecumenical councils. Beneath its high altar rests the remains of the small wooden table on which, according to tradition, St. Peter celebrated the Mass. Its ceiling features gold that came from the new world of the Americas.

Yet, for all its Roman grandeur, we must always remember that our faith is not dependent on real estate. Rather, does it stand founded on the faith of ordinary folk like us? I would like to call that a “Cathedral of the Caring.” One built to honor Jesus as a loving Savior. We can proudly celebrate the dedication of the St. John Lateran Basilica not just as revered real estate, but as a visible symbol of something more profound, and with beauty everlasting. One with prime location in the City of God.

God love you and give you, His peace.



REMEMBERING MSGR. JOSEPH MANNION

*Msgr. Joseph Mannion passed away Oct. 20th, 2025 at the age of 87. Msgr. Mannion served as **Pastor at St. John** for 30 years. He was ordained in his homeland of Ireland in 1962 and later earned a Master's degree from LaSalle University. In addition to his pastorship at St. John, he served many years as Guidance Director at Camden Catholic High School and at Sacred Heart. Msgr. Mannion lent strong pastoral support to his parish's elementary school, St. John Regional Catholic School (later to become Good Shepherd.)*

We remember Msgr. Mannion for his life of service, devotion and unwavering faith. May his memory be a cherished blessing to those he leaves behind.

1ST WAY BABY BOTTLE COLLECTION

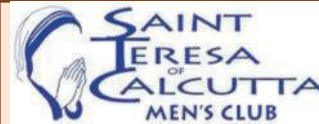

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

FIRST READING:

Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

The angel brought me back to the entrance of the temple, and I saw water flowing out from beneath the threshold of the temple toward the east, for the façade of the temple was toward the east; the water flowed down from the southern side of the temple, south of the altar. He led me outside by the north gate, and around to the outer gate facing the east, where I saw water trickling from the southern side. He said to me, "This water flows into the eastern district down upon the Arabah, and empties into the sea, the salt waters, which it makes fresh. Wherever the river flows, every sort of living creature that can multiply shall live, and there shall be abundant fish, for wherever this water comes the sea shall be made fresh. Along both banks of the river, fruit trees of every kind shall grow; their leaves shall not fade, nor their fruit fail. Every month they shall bear fresh fruit, for they shall be watered by the flow from the sanctuary. Their fruit shall serve for food, and their leaves for medicine."

SECOND READING:

1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Brothers and sisters: You are God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a wise master builder I laid a foundation, and another is building upon it. But each one must be careful how he builds upon it, for no one can lay a foundation other than the one that is there, namely, Jesus Christ.

Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy.

GOSPEL:

John 2:13-22

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money-changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his Body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.
