Reflection on the Holy Family by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I suppose it's something that comes naturally when today's Feast of **the Holy Family** rolls around. Many people start making a "Compare and Contrast List" of their own clan with that of the Holy Trio and conclude with an obvious difference or two...that, in fact, is precisely what our Church does *not* want us to do.

It brings to mind a clever joke the late wise and witty Fr. Benedict Groeschel once told a group of priests on retreat, as he was praising the humility of St. Joseph. He said, "**Imagine the strain on good St. Joseph coming to the breakfast table with the Divine Redeemer and the Mediatrix of all Graces!!**"

It is true that at this time of the year, beginning with Thanksgiving and continuing with Christmas, we see more of our families and perhaps interact with them more than during another time of the year. So, we see them "close up and personal." We might just see flaws not noted before. But this feast points to the profound reality of God's choice to love all of us just as we are and not as we should be.

What that decision implies for me is no less than God's astounding humility. He could have said, "I'll only love you if you're perfect." Furthermore, the Gospel tells us that for the first three decades of His time on earth, our Lord subjected Himself to two imperfect creatures as parents in a dusty backwater named Nazareth. That last was no badge of honor when He came to preach to His chosen people. Yet the name of that very town was acknowledged on the sign Pilate had made to hang above our Savior's sacred Head on the cross.

It became quite natural for the Church Jesus founded to be a family of families, but that immediately meant there would be problems and disagreements from time to time. So, it is for each of our parishes. So, it is for the universal Church. A union of hearts and souls, saints and sinners, under the successor of Peter whom we call "Papa," the "Holy Father, the pope.

This feast urges us to renew our love of family, with forgiveness of past hurts, and to celebrate present joys, and to support each other on the path to heaven. And it reminds us to find humor.

God love you and enjoy your family.

PRAYER FOR A NEW YEAR

On New Year's Eve or New Year's Day, the household gathers at the table or at the Christmas tree or manger scene. Many people make New Year's Day a day of prayer for peace.

All make the sign of the cross. The leader begins:

Let us praise the Lord of days and seasons and years, saying:

Glory to God in the highest!

R/. And peace to his people on earth!

The leader may use these or similar words to introduce the blessing:

Our lives are made of days and nights, of seasons and years, for we are part of a universe of suns and moons and planets. We mark ends and we make beginnings and, in all, we praise God for the grace and mercy that fill our days.

Then the Scripture is read, Book of Genesis 1:14-19:

Listen to the words of the Book of Genesis:

God said: "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky, to separate day from night. Let them mark the fixed times, the days and the years, and serve as luminaries in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth." And so it happened: God made the two great lights, the greater one to govern the day, and the lesser one to govern the night; and he made the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth, to govern the day and the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. God saw how good it was. Evening came, and morning followed—the fourth day.

(The family's Bible may be used for an alternate reading such as Psalm 90:1-4.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, members of the household offer prayers of thanksgiving for the past year, and of intercession for the year to come. On January 1, it may be appropriate to conclude these prayers with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary (in Part VII: Litanies) since this is the solemn feast of Mary, Mother of God. In conclusion, all join hands for the Lord's Prayer. Then the leader continues:

Let us now pray for God's blessing in the new year.

After a short silence, parents may place their hands on their children in blessing as the leader says:

Remember us, O God; from age to age be our comforter. You have given us the wonder of time, blessings in days and nights, seasons and years. Bless your children at the turning of the year and fill the months ahead with the bright hope that is ours in the coming of Christ. You are our God, living and reigning, forever and ever.

R/. Amen.

The leader says: Let us bless the Lord.

All respond, making the sign of the cross:

R/. Thanks be to God. The prayer may conclude with the singing of a Christmas carol.

Thankful Stewardship

"And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." COLOSSIANS 3:17

Giving thanks to God and using our words and actions to give all glory to God is the foundation of living a Stewardship lifestyle. We were made in God's image and likeness; gratitude and generosity are in our DNA. As beloved sons and daughters of God, we are all part of God's family. Using our gifts to help others is our gift back to God and helps grow the Body of Christ here on earth and establishes a pathway to Heaven for each of us.

December is Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) Awareness

Month to raise awareness about SAD, a type of depression linked to biochemical imbalance in the brain due to changes in seasons, especially the reduced sunlight and colder weather of fall and winter. **Seniors are particularly vulnerable** to symptoms of SAD.

SAD symptoms include:

- ☐ Tiredness
- ☐ Lack of interest in normal activities/hobbies
- ☐ Withdraw inward
- ☐ Cravings for high-carb foods or increased appetite/weight gain.
- ☐ Irritability

Ways to reduce SAD symptoms:

- ☐ Exercise; even short walks can help (check with your physician first)
- ☐ Have your Vitamin D levels checked. Levels too low can impact the amount of serotonin and dopamine that lead to feelings of depression.
- ☐ Regular sleep schedule
- ☐ Medication
- ☐ Other forms of therapy

Making health and well-being a priority and seeking help when needed are important in addressing SAD.

The Parish finished the past fiscal year with expenses greater than income of \$126,726. To improve financial stability and provide future growth, there are two main plans of action which have been implemented:

We are in the midst of a Stewardship Campaign to ask parishioners to prayerfully consider their financial support for the Parish's needs. The goal of the Campaign is to rebuild our chief source of income, the Offertory Collection, to earlier years' levels and return the Parish to solvent operations.

We have 10 buildings on our two campuses. These buildings add Maintenance costs and significant Insurance costs (\$180,000 annually) to our financial responsibilities. After a review of all of our properties, buildings were identified for sale that are empty or significantly underutilized. We will continue to work to reduce those buildings that are a financial burden to the Parish and reduce the costs of Maintenance and Insurance on those properties.

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Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

FIRST READING:

[Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14](#)

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins—a house raised in justice to you.

SECOND READING:

[Colossians 3:12-21](#)

Brothers and sisters: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Wives, be subordinate to your husbands, as is proper in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and avoid any bitterness toward them. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. Fathers, do not provoke your children, so they may not become discouraged.

GOSPEL:

[Mt 2:13-15, 19-23](#)

When the magi had departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod, that what the Lord had said through the prophet might be fulfilled, Out of Egypt I called my son.

When Herod had died, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." He rose, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go back there. And because he had been warned in a dream, he departed for the region of Galilee. He went and dwelt in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, He shall be called a Nazorean.
