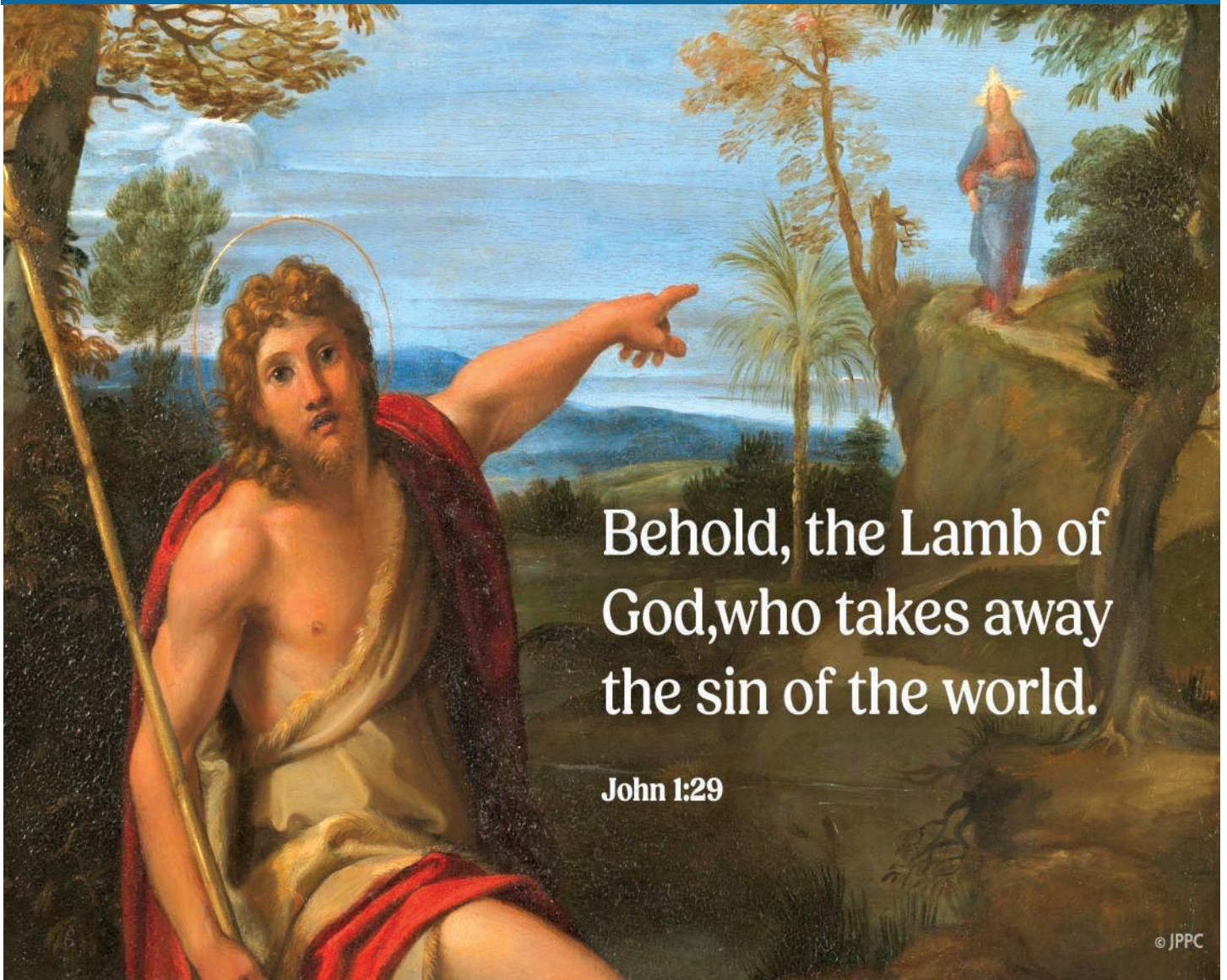

The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Shortly after the first Allied victory in 1942, coming after several defeats, the great Sir Winston Churchill, Prime Minister of England, analyzed the victory this way: "Now this is not the end. It is not even the beginning of the end. But it is perhaps the end of the beginning."

I have long been an admirer of the great man's clever use of the English language. This one came to mind in the light of today's Scripture choices. They are each about beginnings. That means they can provide a game plan for our spiritual lives. Here we are, very soon after the beginning of the new calendar year. A fitting time to take a turn for the better, is it not?

The First Reading speaks of the God's choice of Isaiah as the leader of the twelve tribes. This came while the prophet was still in his mother's womb.

The Second Reading finds us hearing St. Paul's belief that he will inaugurate the mission to bring the gospel to the non-Jewish world.

Finally, we have in the Gospel passage what we could call Our Lord's mission inauguration, when John the Baptist publicly acknowledges Jesus as "the Lamb of God." This title clearly points to Our Lord's mission as a suffering Servant.

All this talk of beginnings acts as an incentive for starting over my attempt to live as Christ would have us do.

Let us face facts. For the majority of us, this choice for Christ involves a struggle. Checking out the stories of our great saints proves that none of them had it easy. Both John the Baptist and St. Paul offer the proof. How often they may have asked themselves: "Is this the beginning of the end, or the end of the beginning?"

We must remember that every time we decide for Christ, perhaps to eliminate a bad habit of sin, the devil will "up his game." He hates our efforts to grow close to Christ. But each time we succeed, we can make a victory claim. The end of the beginning.

An anonymous someone identified our struggle with a quotation of his own: "One half of our problems come from wanting our own way. The other half come from getting it."

God love you and give you, His peace.

JESUS IS ENTIRELY PRESENT IN BOTH THE HOST AND THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

Christ is entirely present in each element, the host and the chalice. The Catholic Church has always taught this. If you were to receive even just the tiniest fragment of the Communion host, you would receive all of Jesus. And if you received only the smallest sip of the Precious Blood, you would receive all of Jesus, not, say, only a percentage of him."

Jesus Is Entirely Present In Both the Host and the Precious Blood—

Quotes from the Catholic Catechism:

"In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained.' This presence is called 'real'—by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present." CCC 1374

"The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ." CCC 1377

A Screening of the T.A.M.I. Show

The Most Acclaimed Rock Concert

Most People Have Never Seen

1964 was a momentous year for Rock 'n' Roll. Its founding fathers were still in their prime, even as new stars burst on the scene from all over: Motown; California surf sound; the "British Invasion"; and James Brown laying the foundation for modern Soul, Funk, and Rhythm and Blues. It was a time for a project like T.A.M.I. (Teenage Music Awards International). The concept: gather artists from every realm of Rock for an annual all-star concert. Money raised from the live concert and theatrical release of its filmed recording would fund music scholarships for the world's teenagers.

The concert, filmed at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium on October 29, 1964, was an enormous artistic success but, alas, a business disaster. The first concert was the last. Tied up in litigation for decades, the film simply disappeared for anyone who attended neither the concert nor a theatrical showing. Portions of the legendary performances (Chuck Berry, Smokey Robinson & the Miracles, Marvin Gaye, the Supremes, Beach Boys, Jan & Dean, Gerry & the Pacemakers, the Rolling Stones, Lesley Gore, James Brown) became bootleg icons. It took 45 years for the legal hurdles to be resolved, making the DVD we will view possible. Every amazing performance is live (no lip-synching) backed by an orchestra that would later be known as The Wrecking Crew. The video and the audio are remarkably good. Anyone interested in where modern rock and popular music came from will have a blast watching this together.

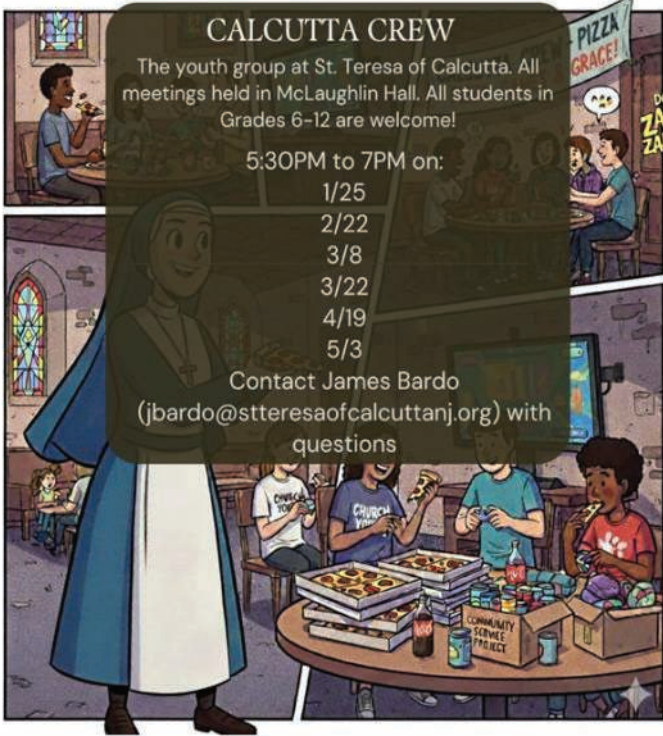

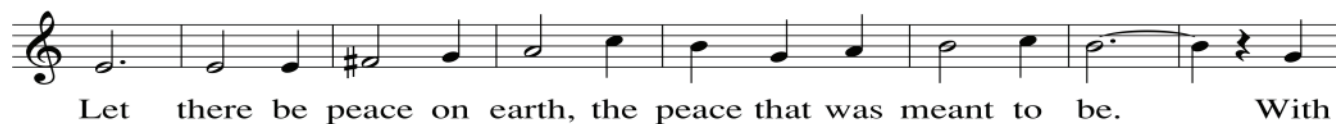
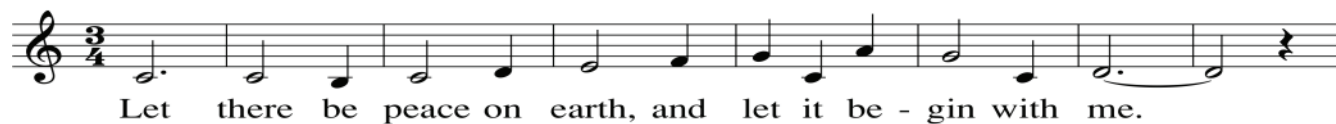
